
Vietnam War Commemoration "SITREP" - 2015, 1/10e 9

Dear Commemorative Partners

The number of Vietnam veterans and their families thanked and honored across the country continues to grow ... thanks to you! You can see that growth in the chart on the right: as of 30 June, you have reported 396,000 Vietnam veterans and 320,000 families publicly recognized in commemorative events. However, we believe there are even larger numbers being reached based on (1) the active readership of our SITREPs and (2) phone conversations we're having with CPs who are reading the



SITREPs, but not always alerting us to commemorative events they are hosting.

Of course, the recent announcement of our <u>Vietnam Veteran Lapel Pin</u> certainly is increasing the number of conversations we've enjoyed with CPs these past two weeks. As a reminder, we plan to supply a *limited quantity of pins beginning in August*, with full production set for mid-winter.
