GP CPCS Highlights: December

89% (378) GM practices engaged or live

108 practices trained & live, 95 actively referring

263 of 355 practices completed MS form

35% referrals advice only

23% referrals for children aged 1-9

Top 3 referral reasons: cough, skin rash, sore throat

December Update

Governance

- EMIS procurement:
 - Several meetings towards the end of December to discuss and review the contract received from EMIS
 - Final contract expected by 10th Jan
- Monthly meetings with LB as SRO, GMHSCP finance & GMSS continue
- IIF / WPAF:
 - Regular updates on responses sent to CD who is liaising with the CCGs to chase non-responders
 - 263 of 355 practices required to complete the form have done so
 - WPAF reporting by GMHSCP to include MS form responses

Project Planning

- After receiving a status update from EMIS in November, it was agreed late November to focus on getting practices live who already had EMIS switched on, some progress was made with this before the pause for go lives in Dec
- Discussions around setting up post-deployment drop-in sessions for practices and pharmacies agreed to arrange in Jan
- Deployment plan updated daily based on responses to MS form
- Approach to agreeing go live dates changed to lead allocating a go live date to a practice following training being booked, instead of waiting for the practice to decide
- Updated deployment blueprint and associated resources signed off by WG
- Updated training recorded and made available to share
- Pharmacy mapping continues for new practices added to deployment plan
- Issues raised around access to Eventbrite to book training investigations suggest an issue with Internet Explorer browser – all comms reviewed and updated to add reference to this to mitigate
- January go live cohort shared with EMIS
- Decision made to not switch on EMIS/PharmRefer switch on for all practices following review of the dates practices wish to go live in MS form

Engagement

 Comms prepared to mitigate concerns raised about practices starting to make referrals without going through the deployment process

Deployment

- 3 practices went live in December
- Total 108 practices live, 95 actively referring
- Planning for GMHSCP support with preparing and disseminating activity reports to CCGs continues
- Post-deployment work continues with daily support to community pharmacies and regular ad hoc support to general practices – resource to continue this essential work flagged to GMHSCP and is of concern due to capacity issues.
 GMHSCP direct involvement with any pharmacies of concern agreed
- Data review of concern pharmacies re responsiveness



Just 3 practices went live in December in order to mitigate the impact of new activity in community pharmacies across GM, for whom December is the busiest month of the year.


Follow up emails to practices who submitted the MS form commenced in December, with additional information, resources and next steps outlined to each practice.

Deployment planning and training continues with 19 practices receiving training via MS Teams from one of 5 sessions delivered.

Training sessions are delivered regularly by the GP CPCS working group twice weekly at 12:30 and practices can book staff onto these sessions via Eventbrite.

2 localities now have 100% engagement with GP CPCS – Tameside & Glossop and Wigan.

PCN IIF Targets:

From 1st April 2022, practices are required to refer 0.65 patients per 1000 list size per week OR 34 patients per 1000 list size per year to qualify for the IIF incentive.

Of the 95 active practices, 22 hit their referral target in November (23%).




Escalations

Of 183 Non-urgent escalations, 170 were to GP and 13 to other healthcare professionals.


Of 85 urgent escalations, all were a same-day appointment request to GP.
