Dear Representative Massie,

This is the second letter we sent to you concerning issues with the Second Amendment which your 2nd Amendment (Caucus) might consider. The first letter was sent to your Kentucky office during the Christmas recess. Even though we have not heard from you it is hoped that you have given the points and suggestions we included in that letter, a fair and measured reading.

This next set of articles we are sending in this mailing concern the intrusive, unacceptably protracted, and time consuming background check system being used by the Federal Government. Our group has been working on an alternative for the past number of years. We have held off presenting it as long as Obama was sitting in our White House.

The documents we are sending you here are of two parts. The first is a description of what the ***National Criminal Registry Act*** is and why it is so very important that it, or something like it, be enacted during the next few years during which time we will have a receptive House, Senate and Executive Branch.

Please give these documents the respect they deserve as they are the culmination of much work and have incorporated the involvement and ideas of many people. Understand that our group is not looking for notoriety or accolades. All we want is for the United States government to do what is required to stop criminals from acquiring firearms from licensed dealers while intruding as little as possible upon the rights and freedoms of the law abiding American people. We believe that this **NCRA** will do just that.

Understand too that this work we have done should be considered solely as a template, a base point to get started from, and we recognize that there will be a need to add or amend much of the work we have provided therein. We want nor need any credit and you have our permission to change this Act in any way you and your Caucus feel is necessary. We only ask that the basic concept of minimal government intrusion be at the heart of any legislation that may come out of this proposal.

Please let us know via a text to the number listed above or a phone call to that number that you have in fact received these documents and briefly, what your thoughts are. We have decided not to send this information to any other Second Amendment advocate in either the House or the Senate. We are resting our hopes on you and your caucus members. We thank you very much for the anticipated attention you and your congressional forum will give to our work. Good luck in this new session of Congress. There is so much hope, even here in the socialist swamp called New Jersey, that this year will be a truly great one.
