Human Trafficking is the second largest and fastest growing criminal industry in the world, and it's happening in every state. Theresa L. Flores, LSW, MS is a professional speaker, Human Trafficking Expert, Survivor, Author, and Activist seeking to put an end to human trafficking with specific goals/solutions:

- Mapping hotels in our specific area
- Developing a Code of Conduct for hotels
- Establishing a policy and procedure for hotels
- Training employees
- Providing information to travelers
- Support and engagement with stakeholders
- Posting missing children posters

# Right Light Guide for General Use Bulbs

Today there are many lighting options available.  
The right bulb for you depends on how much light you need,  
what color light you want, and its costs and features.

## STEP 1

## Decide How Much Light You Need


**Focus on Brightness.** Different amounts of light are needed for different uses. Instead of thinking about light bulbs based solely on the amount of energy they use, focus on their brightness level.

**Lumen** is the measurement of brightness.  
Higher lumen bulbs produce brighter light.

**Watt (W)** is the measure of power consumption.  
Lower wattage bulbs can lower your electric bills.

If you like your bulb’s current brightness, choose a CFL or LED with similar lumens to reduce your energy use. You may also consider a bulb that is less bright to save more.

*Note:* Lumen output listed on packages may vary. Light bulbs listing anywhere from 800 to 860 lumens are similarly bright, for instance.

<b>800 lumens</b> *	60W	13-16W	8-13W
<b>1100 lumens</b> *	75W	17-23W	11-15W


## STEP 2

## Decide What Color Light You Want

### Choose Light Appearance.

You’ll be pleased with your new bulb by choosing a light appearance that you like. All of these colors are available for LEDs and CFLs and at most brightness levels.






*Note:* Choose warm or soft white (2700-3000 K) to match the color of incandescent bulbs.

## STEP 3

## Think About Costs and Benefits

**Compare Types of Light Bulbs.** You can think about product, replacement, and energy costs over 20 years for different bulb types. Why 20 years? Because LEDs can last that long. Some incandescent bulbs are being phased out and will soon be unavailable. The pros and cons of LEDs and CFLs will help you pick a bulb that is right for you.

I was blessed to meet many fine people who came to Erie to make a new life. One young woman brought a special touch to our classes. She was only in Erie briefly before deciding, with her boyfriend, to return to their homeland. She made extra efforts to keep in touch with me and her classmates. About 7 years ago, John and I had the pleasure of visiting Arelis and Freddie in their lovely tropical home in the central mountains of Puerto Rico where we shared a delicious homemade meal and a tour of their town which they were so obviously proud of.

Arelis and I kept in touch intermittently until Hurricane Maria struck and I tried, unsuccessfully, for months via email and phone to get in touch with her. On Sunday, Arelis, her family, John, and I shared a teary, joyful reunion when they showed up unexpectedly at our door.

Arelis and Freddie lost everything in the hurricane and made the difficult decision to move back to Erie with their 2 young sons, Nicholas (5) and Diego (4). Diego is autistic and will be undergoing evaluation on Tuesday, September 18.

They have great need for winter clothes, boots, socks, etc., as well as sheets and towels and furniture.
