___ A. *Brand New Ringers Workshop* – Tracey Wright

If you want to try handbells for the first time, are a novice ringer, or just want to brush up on the basics, this workshop is for you. Learn how to correctly ring, damp, and shake. We will also work on controlling the tempo and volume of the bell. This is a great introduction session for new members to your handbell choir.

___ B. *Bell Tree Processionals* – Patsy Andrews-Vert

Bell Trees can add interest, beauty or electricity to your performance. Learn how to use them in Processional, as accompaniments, or for playing a melody in a new and unusual way. Focus will be on playing a bell tree, and learning about using mallets, presentation, repertoire and performance considerations. If time allows, construction of a bell tree will also be looked at.

___ C. *Care and Nurturing of your Handbell Equipment* – Morna-June Morrow

There are some basic things about maintaining a handbell which every bell ringer should know. What do you do when some part of a bell breaks, becomes loose, or can't even ring? Learn some tips for general nurturing of your handbells and cases so that they will maintain a long life-span. **PLEASE BRING YOUR REPAIR KIT WITH YOU.**

_____ D. *Handbell and Chime Ringing Techniques* – Susan Stevenson

Ever wondered what that wiggly line beside a note means, what's the difference between a martellato and an echo, what does LV mean or vib.? In this workshop we will work through (define, demonstrate and practice) the notations most commonly found in handbell and handchime music and discuss some of the more obscure ones if time permits. If you have come across a notation/technique which has you stumped, please bring your music along and we will try to help you interpret it.

_____ E. *Round Table Discussion Reflecting on Repertoire: Christmas, Easter, Wedding, Sacred, Secular, Ensembles* – Tracey Wright and Morna-June Morrow
