## Day One


Read Joshua 1:1-18, 3:1-4:24, 5:1-9

## Read Joshua 24:1-33

1. In the first thirteen verses, Joshua recounts what God has done in order for them to be where they are. Then he admonishes them, based on God's faithfulness to them to choose who they will serve.

Your only assignment today is to write your own history of how God has dealt faithfully with you. Look at previous generations as well as your own walk. Then write a prayer in response.
