Dear Parents.

The end of the year is fast approaching – less than a week remaining this school year!

## Father's Day Visit Tuesday, June 4th at 8:30 am

On Tuesday, June 4th we celebrate "Donuts with Daddy" for both Classroom A and Classroom B.

This event will begin at 8:30 am on the playground. Fathers, if you are not able to attend, you may wish to have a special visitor come in your place (grandfather, uncle, stepfather, or a special guest). Please plan to arrive on time, park in the parking lot, and walk with your child directly to the playground – all the classroom teachers will be waiting (with a Box of Joe and Donuts)! The event should last about 45 minutes. If it rains, the event will be held inside.



End of the Year Ceremony at the Courtyard in the Moseley Complex on Thursday, June 6th Details for the day of the outdoor ceremony are as follows:

Please drop your child off at the regular time for school (between 8:30 am and 8:45 am). Reminder that this final day at school is a **half day** for all students. There is no afternoon Extended Day.

When do parents arrive? Arrive back at the school no later than 10 am and be sure to park in the parking lot (not along the circle). Additional parking is available in the top lot.

Where is the ceremony? Go directly to the courtyard area (this is located in the center of the Moseley Complex - just look up for the flagpole). There is a grass area in the center where families will sit. Do not come into the school.

Who should attend? - 2 adults please and siblings, of course. Due to space, we don't have enough room for extended family (if indoors). Thank you for your cooperation in advance.

What should you bring? - a folding chair to sit on or a blanket if you prefer. Please note that the school is not renting chairs for this event. The students will sit in their classroom groups (using classroom chairs) throughout the ceremony.

Classroom A will be on the left and Classroom B will be on the right for the entire ceremony.

It is a sunny area; be prepared, please. Sunblock or a hat on your child is essential.

When does the ceremony start? Teachers and students will arrive in the courtyard at approximately 10:15 am to begin the ceremony. The ceremony will last about 45 minutes. A program of the ceremony will be available when you arrive at the courtyard for what to expect throughout the event.

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## **Other Upcoming News & Events**

There will be ample opportunity for that **perfect photo** as your child walks to his/her teachers to receive their certificate (they stand on a podium). Additionally, Mr. Vicario will be present, taking each child's photo as they stand on the podium and receive their certificate.

**Directly after the ceremony**, you may wish to bring your chairs/blankets back to your vehicle and then proceed to the school.

The students will head to the playground with their Classroom Teachers as a group. Parents, before meeting your child on the playground, please go to your child's classroom and collect any of your child's items (even if your child is returning for the summer program and/or the fall). Bring along a sturdy bag to hold cubby items (slippers, blankets, clothing, child's work, and any medications and sunscreens).

**Dismissal is at 11:30 am**. This is the time to say farewell (as hard as it may be). Please remember to take care when walking through the parking lot with your child and be aware of any moving vehicles. **In the event of rain**, the ceremonies will be held inside the classrooms. The day before, a final decision will be made if the weather is questionable.



#### Dear Classroom A families,





It was wonderful getting to see all the guests who came to visit the classroom for the Mother's Day event! Thank you so much for joining us and sharing such a special day celebrating all moms!

The children did an amazing job learning the songs and we loved sharing a special treat with all the guests! We hope everyone had a beautiful Mother's Day!

This month in **Science**, we have been learning about the life cycle of a seed! We read books about seeds, roots, and stems. We learned that plants are living things that need sunlight, water, and soil to grow! The children have also been learning about sunflowers and how the seeds are transported to begin the life cycle all over again. The children heard how seeds can be carried by the wind and birds or buried by animals like chipmunks! The children have been on the lookout for the signs of Spring and have made some amazing discoveries at the playground like worms and ladybugs! The children loved singing along to "Ladybug, Ladybug", by Frank Leto, which we often sing during our morning circle time.









In the **Geography** area, we wrapped up the continent study of South America and heard about some important landmarks of South America. We finished reading *South America* by Allan Fowler and learned about landmarks like the Andes Mountains, Amazon River, Salt Flat, Perito Moreno Glacier, and Angel Falls. The children used the 3-part matching work to discover facts about these natural wonders of South America!



During **Kindergarten afternoon**, Luca finished his continent map and also began working on the writing and illustrations for the end of the year ceremony! He is working hard to write what he likes most about being a student at Sunrise Montessori School and his Kindergarten year. He will illustrate his story writing paper which will then be laminated and presented at the end of the year ceremony!









We loved seeing everyone at the Spring Fair! Congratulations to the Lekatsas Family for winning the painting "A Beautiful Sunrise" that our classroom worked so hard on. Thank you to all the families who were able to attend and for all of the generous contributions. ## **Classroom B Newsletter May 2024**

Happy May! It has been such an exciting and busy month. Our annual Mother's Day Tea Party was a huge success. The children did an amazing job as they honored their mothers by singing songs, serving delicious treats, tea and spending the morning together.

It was so nice to see you and to meet new students who will join Sunrise in September. It was great to see that the children as well as adults had a blast.






In **Cultural Studies** the children are learning about the American flag, the pledge of allegiance, and many facts about the state of Massachusetts. Our class also learned about Memorial Day. We had a group discussion and talked about what this special day means - a day to honor family and friends who made the ultimate sacrifice for our country to keep it safe and free. The children also heard about the history of the American Flag, the stars and stripes and their meaning. They learned that Betsy Ross made the very first flag and that George Washington, our first President of the USA, asked her to do this.









In **Zoology** we studied the parts of a bee. The children were introduced to these great new words: insect, head, thorax, abdomen, eyes, antennae, forelegs, middle legs, hind legs, forewings, and hind wings. However, there is one amazing life cycle like no other that is very special - that is the life cycle of the butterfly. The butterfly is a majestic insect. It is almost magical talking to the children about the process of metamorphosis that the insect goes through as it changes from a caterpillar into an amazing butterfly.

Our classroom discovered that butterflies and moths undergo a complete metamorphosis, which means there are four separate stages in the life cycle (egg, larva, pupa, and adult). This was a great lesson that the children enjoyed.



In **Botany** the children are learning about the parts of a flower. This lesson teaches the child the different parts of the flower from the stem to the sepal, pistil, stamens, and stigma. The children also enjoyed taking apart a fresh flower and then labeling each part.



## **Kindergarten Area**

In the Kindergarten area we worked on the Western and Eastern hemispheres. This was an extensive lesson that took a while to complete. Luca felt quite a sense of accomplishment upon completing this lesson. He did an amazing job! The picture on the right shows Luca working on the multiplication bead board. He loves to work with these materials and has nailed some of his **Math** facts by doing so.







The picture on the next page exemplifies what the children have learned throughout this year in our wonderful Montessori environment. **Grace and Courtesy** lessons are taught to our children to help them learn how to interact with others in a polite, respectful, and considerate manner. This is a huge fundamental aspect of the Montessori curriculum, and it is an essential part of Montessori philosophy, which emphasizes the importance of respect, empathy, and kindness.

This student, without hesitation or guidance, went over to the sand box as he noticed another younger child was having trouble placing her sneaker back on. The care and compassion shown was priceless. As a teacher I can't tell you how proud and happy I was to see this beautiful moment. My heart was full of pride and happiness for this beautiful act of kindness.

As we come to the last few days of school, we wanted to say thank you for choosing Sunrise Montessori School for your children. It is a beautiful environment to learn, grow and love. We appreciate all of your support!
