2018 Dog tags and Kennel License may be purchased until March 31st with fees as follows:

As of April 1st unpaid tags/licenses will be assessed penalties, increasing fees to:

\$ 7.00 Spayed/neutered
\$ 9.00 Unaltered pets
\$40.00 Kennel License (3+ dogs)

Please bring cash or check for payment. If paying by check make checks payable to "Red Barn" for vaccines and "City of Moran" for Dog Tags/Kennel License.

STORM Shelter & SIREN Policy



Ever get tired of hearing the annoying siren at noon every weekday? We do too, but storm season is fast approaching and sounding the sirens helps the City ensure the siren system is maintained in good working order. Moran has two storm shelters, one is located behind City Hall with the second located at the City Park. Additionally, the Moran Fire Department uses the sirens to alert volunteer firemen when fire calls are received.

Sirens are sounded as follows

DAILY—all sirens sounded for 10 seconds at noon Monday through Friday

TORNADO—sirens sound continually for 3 minutes with a 10 second pause between sirens. All clear is one 10 second siren

CITY FIRE—sirens sound once for 10 seconds

Help us keep our storm drains free from debris

Fallen leaves and grass clippings can plug storm drains, flooding our roads and harming our creeks. When grass clippings and too many decomposing leaves are put in our streams, unnaturally high levels of nutrients can harm aquatic wildlife.

What You Can Do

- *Keep all fallen leaves and grass clippings on your property; off of the sidewalks and out of the streets.
- *Set your lawn mower to mulch and mow high. Taller grass retains moisture and catches grass clippings. Mow often enough that grass clippings are shorter than the remaining lawn and can be trapped on your lawn. If you choose to collect grass clippings, follow any of the options below.
- *Compost leaves on site away from storm drains, wetlands and streams. Contain your compost to keep nutrient-rich water from leaching into the storm system.
- *If you see a storm drain that is clogged and can clear it without placing yourself in danger, please remove the leaves.
- *Use a rake to help you reach the leaves without entering the street. Residents are not expected to work in the road to remove leaves.
