
A MESSAGE FROM WALK #114 Lay DIRECTOR

Fourth Day / Serving in the Conference Room

Welcome from the outgoing chair of the Team Selection Committee

I would like to share a few insights on the Team Selection process for all who are new to the Emmaus community, and a reminder for all of us who have been serving. The question comes up all the time, how do I get asked to be in the conference room? There are a few basic rules, and I will share those in a minute. All you have to do is come to camp and serve. Bring your Christian heart, your Agape smile, your spirit of cooperation and charity, and trust me, the upcoming lay directors will notice and they will want you to be on the team that God has given them.

But there are a few minimum requirements to be eligible to serve. First, you are not eligible until a year has passed since your original walk. This gives you time to reflect on your walk, and gives you plenty of time to serve in the background at Emmaus. You must have served at least 4 times in the background, and chair at least one work area. One of the most important jobs of the chair is to make sure that all who help receive credit for serving. Please remember to turn in your service sheets, making sure that the names can be read, and that the walk numbers of each worker is listed. It is the only way that the chair of the team selection committee can determine for sure who served. There are many of you with the same name, so help yourself and the team selection chair to give you credit. Just a reminder, there is a difference in chairing and co-chairing. The purpose of co-chairing is a learning position, where you expect to chair the work area in the near future, and co-chairing does not count as chairing a work area. One more thing, once you have qualified and have served on a team, you are still expected and required to work in the background. You must serve at least once every three years. So if you wonder why you haven't been called, reflect on your service.

I want to thank each and every one of you as I reflect back on my two years as chair of the team selection committee. You have served our Lord with grace and compassion, and the Lord has blessed each and every walk as the "Best-one-Ever".


