A Word From the Elders

"Breaking Up is Hard to Do"

"For all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God" - Romans 3:23

Christians have heard, read and stated many times that ALL are sinners and that Jesus Christ shed his blood to forgive our sins. As believers we have confessed that we believe and understand these basic tenets of the Christian faith. One day as I was doing some self-examination I was confronted with a question that stopped me in my tracks. How is it that if I say that I am a sinner, Jesus blood covered my sins and "if we confess our sins, He is faithful and just to forgive our sins and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness -(1 John 1:9), that I am still wrestling with mistakes made yesterday, months and even decades ago? These things constantly pop up in my heart and mind at the worst times. The past, for a time, dominates the present. It can be immobilizing and keep from utilizing my God-given gifts. Isn't this what many of us do? We often have a difficult time setting down and letting go of past hurts and mistakes. The "would a's", "should a's" and "if only's" are a heavy burden and yet we carry them around with us almost daily. They creep into our hearts and minds preventing us from living the life that Christ created us to have.

Why is breaking up with our past so hard to do? We have to realize that we must "Be so-

ber-minded; be watchful. Your adversary the devil prowls around like a roaring lion, seeking someone to devour. Resist him, firm in your faith, knowing that the same kinds of suffering are being experienced by your brotherhood throughout the world" -(1Peter 5:8-9). There is a heart-mind connection which is often described as "the devil's playground". We have a part in this as well. Because of the past mistakes in our lives we have assigned labels to ourselves that stick to our hearts and minds following us everywhere reminding us of our past. Labels such as: shame, rejected, defeated, weak, no good, useless, hopeless, sick, victim, forgotten, broken, unstable, and guilty. We have listened to these labels, associated with our mistakes, so much that we have become convinced that they are true and it's who we are. That has kept us from moving forward with God's plan for us. David in Psalm 51:10 said, "Create in me a clean heart, O God, and renew a right spirit within me." Pastor Josh emphasized James 1:19 in his sermon recently "Know this, my beloved brothers: let every person be quick to hear (listen), slow to speak, slow to anger" (James 1:19). Pastor cautioned that we have to be careful which voice we listen to.

We have to know who we are: We are not who these labels and Satan say we are. Remember, "The thief comes only to steal and kill and destroy" (John 10:10a). Satan's condemning voice just heaps more shame and guilt on us. In our hearts and minds he says "Remember what you've done, remember where you come from, your life will never change and neither will you" If we choose to listen to Satan's lies then we are being lead to destruction. The truth is, our past does not determine our future — it didn't for Peter, for David, for Paul and it doesn't for you and me.

<u>We are</u> who God says we are. We are God's children, "But to all who did receive him, who believed in his name, he gave the right to become children of God," — (John 1:12). God's word leads to everlasting life. "For God so loved the world, that He gave His only Son, that whoever believes in Him should not perish but have everlasting life" (John 3:16). Jesus said, "I am the way, the truth and the life, no one comes to the Father except through me" (John 14:6).

Martin Luther said, "This is our glory to know for certain that our righteousness is divine in that God does not impute our sins. Therefore, our righteousness is nothing else than knowing God. Let the Christian who has been persuaded by these words cling firmly to them, and let him not be deceived by any pretense of works or by his own suffering. ... It is, however, the office of Christ to bear our sins. Hence we must conclude from this text: "If Christ bears my iniquities, then I do not

bear them." All teachings which say that our sins must be borne by us are ungodly. From such a text countless thunderbolts have come forward against an ungodly self-righteousness" (Martin Luther, <u>Day by Day</u>, 2006).

Conclusion: Luther also said, speaking of Satan, "let me hear, not you with your accusation and condemnation but Christ, the Savior of the human race who says he came to save sinners "The saying is trustworthy and deserving of full acceptance, that Christ Jesus came into the world to save sinners" (1Timothy 1:15) and to comfort the despairing, and proclaim release to the captives (Luke 4:18)". Remain steadfast in our faith, "Faith comes by hearing (listening) and hearing (listening) by the word of Christ", (Romans 10:17). As Pastor Josh said, "We must have the wisdom to listen to God. His word is more powerful than our own." "Trust in the Lord with all your heart, and do understandon your own ing" (Proverbs 3:5).



Christian Stewardship November, 2018

Sometimes people don't like it when pastors talk about stewardship. For some, it hits too close to home. It is easier to talk about bad people in Washington, in history, or overseas than it is to think about what our daily life in Christ is supposed to look like – how we are supposed to love our neighbor.

The fact that we don't like hearing about stewardship certainly means we ought to face it. Here are a few simple and practical realities.

God calls us to first-fruits, sacrificial giving. This means we should give off the top. We should set a percentage of our income as a deliberate gift for the work of the Church and give that first. We write the check to the Lord's work in the Church before we pay the mortgage or pay for our medicine or pay for anything else.

We don't pay for all the stuff we need, and think we need, and then give from what is left over. That is the first-fruits idea. It is hard because we think we need all sorts of other things first. But that is the point of "sacrificial."

Next, how could the starting point for Christian generosity and sacrifice really be anything less than a tithe – 10 percent? The ceremonial law of the Old Testament was never arbitrary. In the Old Testament, the Levites received this tithe so they could be full-time ministers.

Does the New Testament have a ministry that is larger or smaller? It is far larger: "Make disciples of all nations" (Matt. 28:19).

And we are still to have a full-time ministry: "The Lord has commanded that those who preach the Gospel should make their living from the Gospel" (1 Cor. 9:14).

So, if 10 percent was needed in the Old Testament, and we have a bigger mission need in the New Testament, how can we expect the Lord's work to be done on less than a tithe?

First-fruits, sacrificial, generous giving – that's the way. We shouldn't fool ourselves into thinking that we've out-given God's goodness or that we've given plenty.

We might be tempted to think so but consider – no one in the Church has given plenty because no one has given all. No one has died for his sins. Only the sinless Son of God did that.

Or, as St. Paul said, bringing the Good News of Jesus into the discussion of our giving to support the Lord's work in the Church:

"I say this not as a command, but to prove by the earnestness of others that your love also is genuine. For you know the grace of our Lord Jesus Christ, that though he was rich, yet for your sake he became poor, so that you by his poverty might become rich" (2 Cor. 8:8-9).

As you can see, what the Bible commands about our stewardship can sting. It's law, and the law shows our sins. It calls us to repentance.

The law is meant to expose and accuse for the sake of showing us Christ and His fulfillment of the law. If first-fruits, sacrificial giving has you squirming, that's the point.

In Mark's account of the feeding of the 5,000, Jesus took the disciples' five loaves and two fish and blessed them. It was nothing among so many, but, of course, it was plenty. Jesus makes something from nothing.

Mark doesn't say that all the disciples gave Jesus all the bread they had. It is quite possible some of them held something back. But even if they did, that didn't stop Jesus from blessing them. Jesus makes something out of nothing.

He, who fed His people in the desert with Manna every morning, doesn't need their bread. But they need to give it. And what they give, however little it might be, however grudgingly they do so, He blesses it.

He not only blesses those whom He feeds with it, but He blesses them, the givers – not just in that they wind up with (a basket full for each loaf) but that they learned to trust and rejoice in Him.

The Lord gives, and the Lord takes away. The Lord gives abundantly or asks us to fast. We do not know what will happen. Blessed be the Name of the Lord.

He does all things well and works all things together for good. The disciples don't give their bread to Jesus because it is a good investment. They give it because He is good, they love Him, and they trust Him. Let us go and do likewise.

The meeting was called to order at 7:15 pm by President Mick Moulton and opened with prayer.

Council Meeting Minutes: The minutes of the August 16 meeting were reviewed. The following corrections were recommended:

Elders: Dave McCarthy reported that in lieu of their meeting, the Elders attended the visitation and prayer service for Roger Rickard. Pastor Brian and Amanda Gauthier from Panama visited Rapid City and preached on August 25. They will remain stateside until mid-October.

Education: Tara Wright reported that Sunday School teachers have been found for 2-4th grades. High School students will do devotions with Jamie Jones. The Sunday school and Board of Education will host the TGIF on October 26 to fill the boxes for Operation Christmas Child.

Parish Fellowship: Kendra Lambert stated that the "Off the Wall" TGIF night went very well and was enjoyed by the attendees. The next TGIF event will be Oct 26 to fill boxes for Operation Christmas Child.

Financial Secretary: Judy McCarthy announced that the 3rd quarter will be ending soon and quarterly contribution statements will be completed and distributed.

Trustees: Terry Larson reported that the parking lot striping has been completed and a painter has been hired to paint the fascia trim. Time Equipment Rental has generously offered to donate the use of a lift for the painting project. Terry and the Board have been preparing the church and vicar's house for winter. They are also working on determining the best course of action to remodel the west entrance of the church to make it more accessible to meet ADA (Americans with Disabilities Act) standards.

LWML: Joyce Bowman reported that the books have been completed and distributed to members in their mailboxes. The monthly meetings will be held Sept 10 and 11. The Zone Fall Retreat will be held Oct. 19 and 20 at Divine Shepherd in Black Hawk, the church bazaar will be held Nov 17 and 18 and the Christmas Brunch will be December 8th.

Unfinished Business: There was no unfinished business.

New Business: In preparation for the annual meeting in December, Pam Moody prepared a list of the current board members and council officers along with the responsibilities of each board for the Council's perusal. The consensus of the Council was that this information, including the term length of each position and number of open positions on each board, should be included in the Oct or Nov newsletter or made readily available to congregation members. This information would educate congregation members and may be beneficial in helping individuals in their decision to serve in an office or on a board as involvement of more members is desired.

Meeting was adjourned at 8:05 pm after a motion from Kendra Lambert with a second from Joyce Bowman. Motion passed unanimously and the meeting closed with the Lord's Prayer.

THE PRESIDENT

Responsibilities:

The President shall be the principal executive officer of the congregation, responsible only to the Assembly. He shall provide leadership for the administration of the congregation's programs. He shall be responsible that all officers, boards and committees are performing their designated functions.

THE VICE PRESIDENT

Responsibilities:

The Vice-President shall assist the President in his duties and shall train to function as President when he shall assume that office. He shall review the current Handbook of Operations and make recommendations to the Church Council for any necessary revisions.

THE SECRETARY

Responsibilities:

The Secretary shall be responsible for the safe -keeping of all permanent minutes, past and present, of the congregation and for faithfully recording, in permanent records, all minutes of the Assembly and the Church Council.

THE TREASURER

Responsibilities:

The Treasurer shall manage the funds of the congregation as directed by the Church Council. The Treasurer shall use standard, acceptable bookkeeping procedures.

THE SECRETARY OF FINANCE

Responsibilities:

The Secretary of Finance shall be responsible for the security of all funds received by the congregation until such time that they have been deposited in the name of the congregation in a bank designated by the Church Council and shall also be responsible for maintaining accurate records of all contributions made to the congregation.

THE ASSISTANT SECRETARY OF FINANCE

Responsibilities:

The Assistant Secretary of Finance shall be responsible for assisting the Secretary of Finance in carrying out his duties and shall be responsible for the orderly functioning of the Board of Finance in counting and recording all offerings received during worship services.

THE BOARD OF ELDERS

Responsibilities:

The Board of Elders shall be responsible for the following:

- a. The spiritual welfare of the congregation and of each individual member.
- b. Insuring that the teachings within this congregation conform to the confessional standard as stated in Article IV of the Articles of Incorporation.
- c. The conduct of worship services.
- d. The welfare of the sick.
- e. The Social welfare of the members of the congregation.
- f. Other functions not specifically assigned to the Assembly, the Church Council, or other boards and offices.

THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES

Responsibilities:

The Board of Trustees will have responsibility for the following functions:

- a. Custody of all properties of the congregation, including the parsonage.
- b. Proper maintenance of these properties.
- c. The securing and providing of all necessary legal information to the congregation.
- d. Providing for the safety of persons on church property.
- e. Providing for adequate custodial services, but excluding housekeeping of the parsonage.
- f. Providing for an adequate insurance program for the congregation.
- g. Recommending policies to the Church Council for the use of church property and equipment.

The Board of Trustees may authorize expenditures for repairs up to a maximum of \$2,000 per project without prior approval of the Church Council. Arrangements for custodial services for the church property must have prior approval of the Church Council.

THE BOARD OF FINANCE

Responsibilities:

The Board of Finance shall be responsible for the counting of all offerings and collections received by the congregation.

THE BOARD OF CHRISTIAN EDUCATION

Responsibilities:

The Board of Christian Education shall be responsible for:

- a. Developing policies and programs of Christian education within the congregation and for implementing such programs as are approved by the Church Council or the Assembly.
- b. Supervising the youth program of the congregation.
- c. Obtaining the necessary personnel to carry out the education and youth programs.
- d. Providing for adequate training of the personnel supervising, teaching, or counseling in these programs.

Appointments to the positions of superintendents and assistant superintendents of the educational divisions and counselors for youth groups must have the approval of the Church Council before they are effective.

THE BOARD OF STEWARDSHIP

Responsibilities:

The Board of Stewardship shall be responsible for analyzing and evaluating the total program of the congregation, for developing an adequate and continuing program of enlisting the time, talents, and resources with which God has endowed the members, promoting education and training in Scriptural principles of Christian and worshipful giving, and annually preparing a budget proposal for submission to the Church Council. This Board may request assistance from all officers, boards, committees, organizations, and departments of the congregation in preparing this budget proposal.

THE BOARD OF EVANGELISM

Responsibilities:

The Board of Evangelism shall be responsible for mobilizing the membership in the congregation to win the unsaved for Christ, recall the backsliders to Christ, and send believers forth to witness for Christ.

THE BOARD OF PARISH FELLOWSHIP

Responsibilities:

The basic objectives of this Board are the strengthening of fellowship between the members of the congregation both spiritually and socially, with other boards, the integration of new members into the life of the congregation, the general up building of mutual cooperation, trust and enjoyment among the members of the congregation, the general integration of the congregation's work into the life of the community through the presentation to the public of a Christian image which will reflect favorably upon the work of Christ and of the congregation as His instrument, and the publicizing of the work of the congregation through various channels.

THE CHURCH COUNCIL

Responsibilities:

The Church Council shall be responsible for carrying out its functions as defined in Article X-C of the Amended and Restated Articles of Incorporation.

TERMS OF OFFICE

- The President, the Secretary, the Treasurer, and the Member-at-Large will serve for terms of one year.
- The Vice-President will be elected for a term of two years, one year as Vice-President followed by the second year as President
- The Secretary of Finance and the Assistant Secretary of Finance shall be elected to terms of two years, the former to be elected to begin serving their term in even numbered years and the latter in odd numbered years.
- The members of the Board of Elders, the Board of Trustees, and the Board of Education, and the Board of Finance shall be elected to terms of three years. The election of the members of each board shall be scheduled so that not more than one seat in excess of one-third of the board membership shall require election each year.
- The members of the Board of Stewardship, the Board of Evangelism, and the Board of Parish Fellowship/Public Relations shall be elected to terms of three years, the election of members to be so scheduled that no more than one term on each board shall expire any year.
- The President cannot succeed himself.
- The Vice-President cannot succeed himself.
