

## VILLAGE OF PADDOCKWOOD BYLAW 01-2018

### A BYLAW OF THE VILLAGE OF PADDOCKWOOD, IN THE PROVINCE OF SASKATCHEWAN, TO ESTABLISH AND MAINTAIN A WASTE MANAGEMENT SYSTEM.

**WHEREAS** the Municipal Government Act gives Municipalities the power to enact bylaws and impose fines and penalties for infractions of their bylaws;

**NOW THEREFORE**, the Municipal Council of the Village of Paddockwood, Saskatchewan duly assembled, hereby enacts as follows:

1. This bylaw may be sited as the "Waste Management Bylaw"

2.0 Definitions; In this bylaw, except where otherwise defined:

- 2.1 "**Chief Administrative Officer (CAO)**" means the Chief Administrative Officer of the Village of Paddockwood as appointed by resolution or bylaw of Council.
- 2.3 "**Bulk Refuse**" means large, bulky items, including wood, trees, shrubs, stumps, branches, carpet, discarded furniture, equipment, large boxes and crates;
- 2.4 "**Council**" means the council of the Village of Paddockwood;
- 2.5 "**Commercial Waste**" means any waste originating from any business premises or resulting from the operation of any business but shall not include Prohibited Waste;
- 2.6 "**Designated Areas**" means separate sites within the waste management site set aside for particular disposal i.e. domestic waste and rubbish, wood, metal, shingles and clean dirt;
- 2.7 "**Domestic Waste**" means putrid animal, mineral and vegetable waste resulting from the handling, preparation, cooking and consumption of food;
- 2.8 "**Hazardous Waste**" means any waste materials designated by either the Environmental protection Act and/or the Dangerous Goods Act of Saskatchewan and/or Canada;
- 2.9 "**Heavy Commercial**" means any premises principally used for a business engaged in the following:  
- sale or warehousing or groceries or perishable goods - operation of a restaurant - operation of a hotel or motel with licensed premises and/or restaurant;
- 2.10 "**Household Waste**" means any waste originating from any residential premises after recyclable items have been removed, but does not include Restricted or Prohibited Waste;
- 2.11 "**Liquid Domestic Waste**" means any waste which contains animal, mineral or vegetable matter in solution or suspension;
- 2.12 "**Recyclable Refuse**" means refuse for which a recycling collection point or recycling facility is established in the Village;
- 2.13 "**Refuse**" means all wastes including domestic waste rubbish, street cleanings, yard clippings, any useless, unused, unwanted or discarded material resulting from ordinary community activities, but not liquid domestic waste;
- 2.14 "**Resident**" for purposes of this bylaw means refuse generated in the Village or a municipality that has been approved at the discretion of Council;
- 2.15 "**Village**" means the municipal corporation of the Village of Bethune or, where the context requires, the geographical area within the Village limits of the Village of Paddockwood;
- 2.16 "**Whites**" means large metallic objects such as major appliances, water heaters, stoves, furnaces, washers, dryers, refrigerators, deep freezers, dishwashers, bed springs, fencing, gates, sinks, etc.;

3.0 Domestic wastes in the Village of Paddockwood shall be removed weekly by:

- 3.1 an employee of the Council; or
- 3.2 any person who has contracted with Council for that purpose; or
- 3.3 approved Municipal Haulers with up-to-date agreements with council

#### 4.0 GENERAL PROHIBITIONS

- 4.1 Every owner or occupant, as the case may be, of residential property shall, after removing all recyclable items:
  - 4.2 Place all Household Waste originating from that property whether consisting of animal mineral, vegetable or other substance, and providing the same contains no liquid domestic wastes be placed in plastic garbage bags sturdy enough to hold such;
    - 4.2.1 clean and maintain, in good repair, the waste receptacles to hold the Household Waste supplied to the property;
    - 4.2.2 store all waste originating from that property so as to prevent access to such waste by stray animals or birds; spread of such waste by wind; infiltration of such waste by rain.
  - 4.3 No owner or occupant of residential property shall allow any individual garbage bag to weight any more than 13.6 kilograms (30 pounds)
  - 4.4 Where back lanes are not open, garbage to be picked up must be set on the front street in the container provided on the day of garbage pickup. Any loose garbage is not the responsibility of the contracted village employee or council member.
  - 4.5 Any person or persons placing derogatory message boards or signage on garbage receptacles so intended to harass or; instruct contracted village employee or council member refuse will cease to be picked up and said party shall be subject to a penalty as set forth in Schedule "B" of this bylaw.
  - 4.6 All domestic waste, refuse, bulk refuse, yard clippings and metal (including whites) shall be the responsibility of the landowner/occupant for disposal at a waste disposal site.
  - 4.7 Brush piles shall not be permitted to accumulate for any longer than two weeks at a time.
  - 4.8 There shall be a limit of two bags per week. Property owners or occupants may be permitted to set out additional garbage with prior consent from the Public Works Foreman or designate.
- 5.0 The proprietor / managers of garages or filling stations shall keep their premises free from accumulation of junk, trade liter, and cans or refuse by keeping storing in a container and removing regularly to a waste disposal site at the expense of such proprietor.
- 6.0 The proprietor / managers of every tin shop, plumbing and heating shop, or any similar establishment shall keep their premises free from any accumulation of scrap metal and old unused equipment, such wastes shall be stored in a covered shed or container and removed regularly to a waste disposal site at the expense of such proprietor or manager.
- 7.0 The proprietor / managers of cafes, restaurants and similar establishments shall only use approved cans described in Section 4 subsection 4.2 or otherwise approved by the municipal staff for the storage of kitchen wastes.
- 8.0. Absolutely no burning of refuse is allowed within the Village
- 9.0 Council may, from time to time, by resolution, designate and approve Municipal Haulers and Commercial Haulers.
- 10.0 Village Council may at their discretion, advertise or proclaim special spring or fall cleanup programs clearly outlining the nature and types of refuse that will be collected.
- 11.0. If any person fails, neglects or refuses to do anything which he/she is required to do by this bylaw, may be done by the Council at the expense of the person in default and the Village may recover the expense thereof, with costs, in any court of competent jurisdiction or in like manner as municipal taxes.

12.0 RECYCLABLE MATERIALS COLLECTION

12.1 Every person is required to place all recyclable materials in the roll cart provided, or at the bins located within the village.

12.2 Every person shall be required to purchase their own recycle bags.

12.3 Recyclable Materials; See Schedule "A" of this bylaw

13.0 No person shall place out for collection, or mix with any other solid waste, any of the following items listed schedule "C"

14.0 NON-COMPLIANCE WITH BYLAW

14.1 Any person who commits a breach of any of the provisions of this bylaw shall be liable to a penalty as set forth in Schedule "D" of this bylaw.

15.0 THAT Bylaw # 02-2007 is hereby rescinded upon third and final reading of this Bylaw.

16.0 THIS Bylaw shall take effect on the day it is passed.

## SCHEDULE "A" Recyclable Materials

### What is acceptable in blue recycling bins?

- Newspapers, flyers, inserts, junk mail
- Flattened cardboard, box and paperboard (i.e. cereal boxes, shoe boxes, empty tissue boxes, tissue roll cores, paper egg cartons, milk cartons (please rinse), juice cartons (please rinse))
- Paper - office bond, photocopier paper, paper bags, envelopes, letter paper and computer printouts
- Telephone books, catalogues, magazines
- Household tin cans (please rinse)
- Aluminum soft drink and beer cans (please rinse)
- Plastic shopping/store and grocery bags
- Plastic soft drink and water bottles (please rinse and remove caps)
- Household plastic containers and bottles (i.e. milk jugs). Must have the recycling arrows with a number 1 through 7 on the bottom. (A container displaying the arrow but no number means that it was made from recycled materials but may not be recyclable itself and cannot be accepted.)

NOTE: All recyclable containers must be clean before being placed in the blue bin

### What cannot be recycled?

The simple rule is, "keep it clean."

Don't put anything in the recycling bins that you would not handle with bare hands.

- Paper or cardboard that has been soiled or contaminated
- Household garbage and food
- Styrofoam or other foam packing materials
- Plastic of any kind that do not display the recycling arrows and a number 1 through 7
- Glass of any kind
- Yard waste
- Wood and concrete
- Clothing and textiles
- Containers from hazardous materials
- Kids toys of any kind
- Garden hoses or lawn/deck furniture

## SCHEDULE "B" Penalties

First Offence: \$ 100.00

Second Offense: refusal of garbage pick-up

## SCHEDULE "C"

### Waste not permitted

- Industrial, commercial and institutional waste,
- Construction, renovation or demolition materials
- Combustible or explosive or toxic material out for collection which, without limiting the generality of the forgoing, shall include fuels or lubricant, gun powder or bullets, dynamite, blasting caps or radioactive materials;
- Household hazardous waste or dangerous goods including solvents, oven cleaners, paints, automotive fluids, wet cell batteries, pesticides, herbicides or any other commonly referred to as household, commercial or industrial hazardous waste,
- Hypodermic needles, sharp objects or broken glass unless packaged in a sealed, secure, safety container.
- Pathogenic or biomedical waste,
- Florescent lighting tubes and compact florescent light bulbs
- Compressed propane and butane cylinders
- Large and bulky items such as mattresses, box springs, furniture or major appliances,
- Electronics equipment including televisions, computers, computer monitors, keyboards and associated cables
- Automotive parts including lead acid batteries, scrap metal, oil filters, empty oil containers, tires and automotive bodies or body parts,
- Oil or other petroleum by-products,
- Sawdust unless double bagged before placing in the waste container
- Hot ash or other burning matter,
- Liquid waste or sludge,
- Trees, shrubs, branches over 0.5 meters in length and 1 cm in diameter, soil, sod rock, stumps and any other woody material.
- Animal waste including dead animals, carcasses, offal, manure, kennel waste, animal parts or excreta, unless the animal excreta is placed in a double bag and securely tied before placing in a waste container.
