FEATHERS IN THE WIND

Today is Memorial Day. When it first started, in the wake of the Civil War, it was called "Decoration Day." People would go out and decorate the graves of those who had served in the military.

Today, we also decorate the graves of deceased family members. After World War II the name of this holiday because "Memorial Day."

Today, we remember those people who gave their oath of allegiance to God and county and donned military uniforms and went off to fight for our freedoms.

Our Amana church was, and still is, recognized as pacifistic. This has caused some problems in the past. During the Civil War, instead of sending men to fight, the community gave goods to the sanitary commissions and other organizations serving the soldiers at the front lines. During World War I many men enlisted in - mainly - noncombatant roles, although a few did serve on the front lines. Two men died during their World War I service, in both cases, due to illness.

During World War II, men, and even a few women, went in never using the continuous objector card to get out of active service. The Korean Conflict came along and Amana men served, as well as during the Vietnam War.

Those who know me are aware that I dislike gunfire. This is ironic, because both my Opa and my husband love to hunt and trap. Yet, gunfire makes me jump and even cry out in fright. I know it has to be necessary in some cases, but keep it away from me.

At military funerals nothing brings a lump to my throat more than those 24 notes played by a bugler for "Taps." It seems that it was first played to mark the end of day during the Civil War.

Big Brass for Wurst Festival

This year's Amana Colonies Wurst Festival is going to be one for the history books as the Wurst Brass Band contest adds to the festivities. There will be more brass bands here than you can imagine, so get excited.

Friday, June 14 the first of its kind in Iowa, The Wurst Brass Band Contest begins at 6 p.m. at three different locations in Amana: the Market barn, the Festhalle barn and Millstream Brewing Co.

Hosted by Iowa Brass, this competition is patterned after Whit Friday band competitions in England. To see what that looks like check out Whit Friday Bands on YouTube. The bands will make their way from venue to venue and at each venue perform for the public and panel of esteemed judges.

Five brass bands from Minnesota, Wisconsin, lowa, Illinois and Kansas will compete by performing two march songs (think of your favorite Sousa or Karl King tunes) at each of these venues. That means you'll see all five bands performing in all three venues. Each performance won't last more than 15 minutes then the bands will rotate. Competing: Madwaukee Brass Band, Milwaukee; Chicago Brass Band; Sheldon Theatre Brass of Redwing MN; the Iowa Brass Band; and the Fountain City Brass Band of Kansas City.

So get to a venue and stay put to see the five competing bands Friday night. Following the last performance all the bands will assemble at the Festhalle for the awards and back-slapping congrats with beverages and snacks on offer. No admission charge to any venue Friday night.

Judging the bands will be: Mark Heidel, director of Bands and Prof. of Music in the School of Music, University of Iowa and Anthony Williams, Associate Prof. of Trombone, University of Northern Iowa. The Wurst Brass is hosted by Iowa Brass. Serving as host and "emcee" will be our friend Justin Roberts of KCRG.

Saturday the music continues as the bands perform at the Festhalle 10 a.m. - 6:30 and down the street at Millstream Brewing Co. 10:30 a.m. - 9 p.m. Meanwhile the AC Wurst Festivals begins in earnest. Several bands from across the Midwest are joining in the fun on Saturday so the number of bands in town Saturday will be a record-breaker.

Closing the day at Millstream Brewing Co. from 6 - 9 p.m. Millstream changes it up with Mill Creek Band, a rock cover band. There's no admission to Millstream Brewing Saturday.

There is \$5 admission to the Brass Band Festival Saturday at the Festhalle. Hear all the bands perform one after the other at the Festhalle, snacks and beverages available. There is an admission fee to Wurst Fest Saturday with a combo ticket that gets you into both the Wurst Fest and the Band Festival at the Festhalle.

The Amana Colonies Wurst Festival is Saturday, June 15 at the Market barn in Amana in celebration of all things sausage. Saturday at 11 a.m. the AC Wurst Fest gets rocking with two bands. Here's the schedule thus far:
