WEEKLY THOUGHTS CORPUS CHRISTI SUNDAY JUNE 6th 2021.

Dear friends, today we celebrate the Corpus Christi Sunday. This feast is more or less a revisit to the events of Holy Thursday- when Jesus instituted the Holy Eucharist at the last supper meal with his disciples. Jesus gave to us the Eucharist as a Gift of his abiding presence in our midst and Nourishment for our Spiritual life as we journey to eternity.

This feast gives us an opportunity to learn and meditate on the Real presence of Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament so that one can easily have a personal relationship with him. We are all invited to this moment of a personal encounter with Jesus in the devotion known as Eucharistic Adoration or to some Holy hour with Jesus.

Typical to this event is the Eucharistic procession as we try to show the world Jesus present in the Eucharist deserving respect through adoration. In our case, we will not be able to make procession; we will instead celebrate Benediction and blessing of Jesus as the priest will be passing by our pews.

There have been major events celebrated in the Church last week. Last Sunday, we celebrated the Mystery of the Trinity. We normally begin our prayer by the invocation of the Blessed Trinity and end it in the doxology calling upon the Holy Trinity. The relationship that exists between the three Persons is one of unity and love to which we are all called to embrace.

On Thursday June 3rd was a celebration of the Uganda Martyrs. The 45 young men and pages at the King's court led by Charles Lwanga were burned alive at Namugongo on the order of King Mwanga on June 3rd 1885. King Mwanga had asked all the pages that had embraced Christianity to abandon their faith or else be killed. St. Charles Lwanga and his companions chose to die for the faith through the painful death of being burnt alive on the fires of Namugongo execution site. This place became a place of Pilgrimage and Prayer as a result of the heroic witness of the Uganda Martyrs canonized to Sainthood on October 18th 1964 by Pope Paul VI.

Three Popes have made a pilgrimage to Namugongo. Pope Paul VI in July 1969, John Paul in February 1993 and Pope Francis in November 2015.

On Friday June 11th is the feast of the Most Sacred Heart of Jesus. There will be Mass at Holy Infant at 10.00 AM. Saturday June 12th is the Feast of the Immaculate Heart of Mary. There will be Mass at Holy Infant at 9.00 AM to commemorate the feast followed by our regular Saturday Mass at 5:00 PM.
