- TITLE: APPROVAL AND ADOPTION OF ADDENDUM TO NONPOINT SOURCE MANAGEMENT PLAN
- WHEREAS, the Summit Lake Paiute Tribe, is organized pursuant to Section 16 of the Indian Reorganization Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984) as amended, with the Articles of Association, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on January 08, 1965, granting certain powers to the Summit Lake Paiute Council; and
- WHEREAS, the Summit Lake Paiute Council has the responsibility for the general welfare of its tribal membership including natural resources; and
- WHEREAS, over time the members of the Summit Lake Paiute Tribe have regained a I shall shall be small fraction of their historic land base, including the Tribe's reserved and lands (Reservation), and the Indian allotments outside the Reservation boundaries; and, and the Indian allotments of the Reservation boundaries.
- WHEREAS, the Summit Lake Paiute Council is the duly constituted governing body within the boundaries of the Summit Lake Paiute Reservation; and
  - WHEREAS, the Summit Lake Paiute Council has been organized to represent, develop, protect and advance the views, interests, education, resources, and general welfare of the Summit Lake Paiute Tribe membership; and
  - WHEREAS, the Summit Lake Paiute Council has organized a Natural Resources
    Department to provide technical expertise and services to manage air,
    water, soil, fish, wildlife, and plants within the Summit Lake Paiute
    Reservation and off-reservation areas considered the aboriginal homeland
    of the Summit Lake Paiute Tribe; and
  - WHEREAS, the most recent version of the Nonpoint Source Assessment and Management Plan for the Reservation approved in 2013 and updated with new nonpoint source pollution concerns and clarification provided to several sections within the plan in 2015; and,
  - WHEREAS, in 2016 a total of 941 acres were added to the Summit Lake Indian Reservation through the Nevada Native Nations Land Act; and

- WHEREAS, nonpoint source pollution concerns exist on these newly acquired lands that were not included in the 2015 update but were recently catalogued and described by Natural Resources Department employees; and, SUMMETT ARE PARTERED FOR VATION, VEVADA
- WHEREAS, the Natural Resources Department of the Summit Lake Paiute Tribe has outlined these new concerns and consequently finds it necessary for the Summit Lake Paiute Council to formally adopt this new information as an addendum to the existing Nonpoint Source Assessment and Management Plan for the Reservation to guide department activities, priorities, and decisions.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Summit Lake Paiute Council approves this addendum to the 2013 Nonpoint Source Management Plan presented by the Natural Resources Department and adopts this document for the Summit Lake Paiute Tribe.
