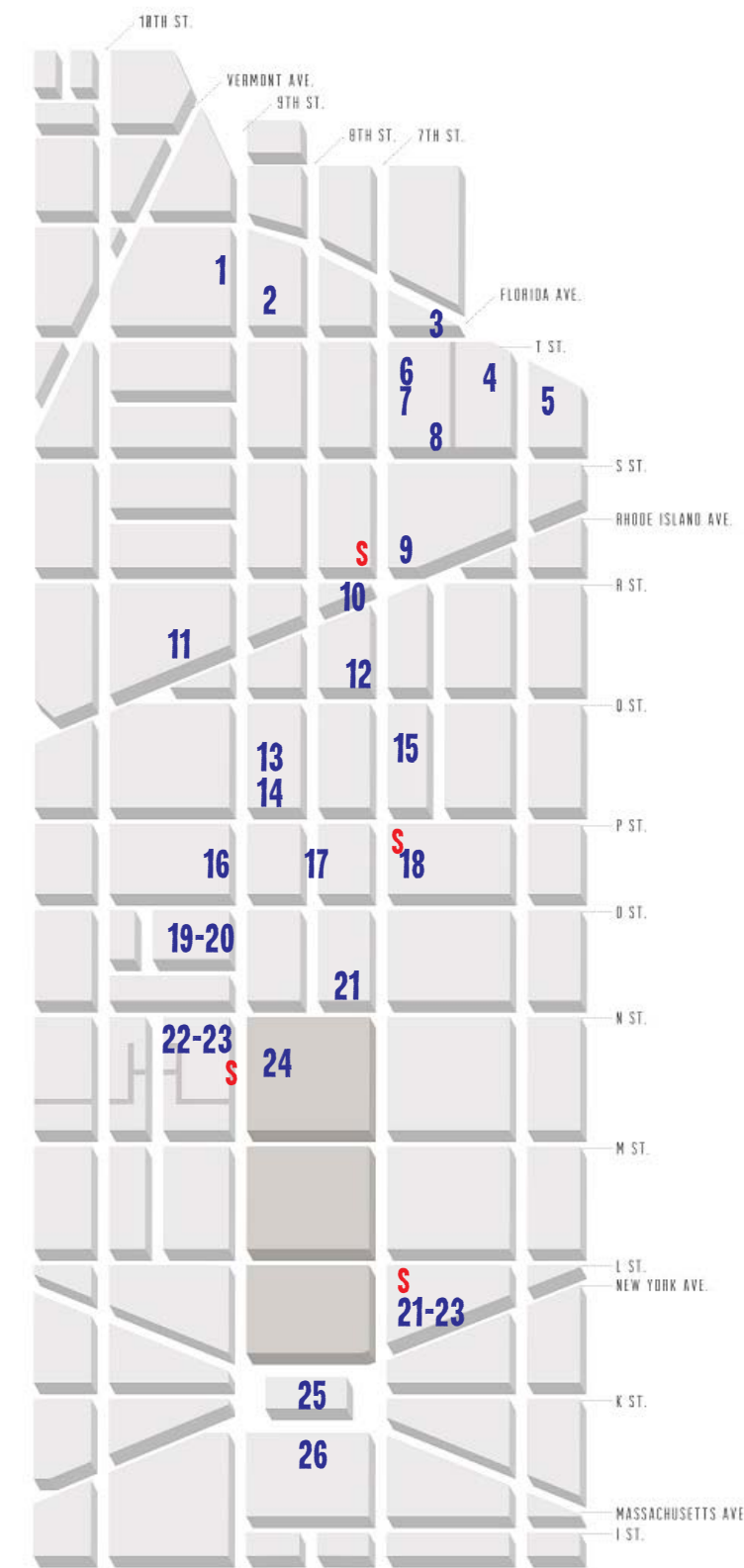

- 1 DC9, 1940 9th Street, NW:** 12:00 AM—A People’s Choir DC, interactive sing-along (lyric sheets provided).
- 2 Simon Vintage, 1911 9th Street, NW:** *Angillian Anne was Her Name!* Come take a peek into the closet of a local female impersonator, the late Mark Hinton. “Angillian Anne” performed in the DC area and was associated with The Academy of Washington for many years. This Drag Fashion collection includes 90 striking dresses, hats and accessories, including handmade work. And see master re-upholsterer Sarah Carrier Stough demonstrating various techniques while working on vintage furniture.
