

## s for all 130 College Foothall Teams **Projected Season**

Using my power ratings as a guideline, we have developed a line on each game played this college football season. This line factors in the difference between the two teams' ratings while also taking into consideration where the game is played. After you have a line for each game, you can come up with a win percentage on the game. Usually 3-point favorites tend to win straight up between 55 and 60% of the time while 7-point favorites win straight up between 65 and 70% of the time.

Many "Joe Public" bettors make the mistake of computing a season win total just by counting wins and losses by who is favored in the game. While that method is a start, it is not the most accurate. When a team is favored by 3-points, they have around a 57% chance to win that game straight up. Therefore, instead of just mark-ing down a full win for that team, you would reward that team with 0.57 of a win. On the other side, if a team is a 3-point underdog, instead of just marking down a full loss for that team, you would reward that team with 0.43 of a win. Then after you have done this for call 12 games, you add um all the decimals and that should be you have done this for all 12 games, you add up all the decimals and that should be a more accurate season win total for each team.

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## Games in Rotation Order

HOME TEAM IN CAPS

Thursday, August 29th CINCINNATI 31 Ucla 30. Rematch of last year's opener where Cincy pulled the outright upset as 14.5-point underdogs 26-17. Chip Kelly's first season in "La La Land" was one to forget as the Bruins started off 0-5 for the first time since 1943. However, the Bruins did show improvement especially on offense in the latter part of the season averaging 486 ypg on offense in their final 4 games (only 346 ypg in the first 8). This year the Bruins welcome back a nation-high 19 starters led by RB Joshua Kelly (1,243 rush yards last year). On the other side, the Bearcats were one of the most improved teams in the country last year going from 4-8 in 2017 to 11-2. This year's team looks just as good with 14 returning starters. They are led by QB Desmond Ridder who had 25 total TD's and just 5 INT's. The early money has come in on the Bruins here and we agree with it. Lean UCLA.

CLEMSON 49 Georgia Tech 12. The Yellow Jackets are just 1-10 SU/4-6-1 ATS getting 21 or more points since 1980 and they are in their largest underdog role in modern school history. It looks like a rebuilding season for first-year head coach Geoff Collins (from Temple) as he transitions GT from the option offense. Meanwhile, the defending National Champs are loaded on offense led by QB Trevor Lawrence who some say is the best QB prospect since Andrew Luck. The defense does have to replace all 4 starters on the DL. Note Clemson won their last 10 games of last season all by 20 points or more. However, this number is just too big for us to get involved especially with Clemson having Texas A&M on deck.

TULANE 28 Fiu 27. One of the more interesting week 1 match-ups here with two of our favorite Group of 5 head coaches in FIU's Butch Davis and Tulane's Willie Fritz. Both teams come in off rare bowl wins. The Green Wave finished last season on a 5-1 SU run and return 13 starters led by QB Justin McMillan who had an upand-down season a year ago (only 51% completion rate). On the other side, FIU returns 16 starters from a 9-4 team that went 10-3 ATS last season. The Panthers are led by QB James Morgan who led the team to a school-record 34.6 ppg and 422 ypg

last season. This game is too close to call. TEXAS A&M 45 Texas St 14. The Aggies clearly showed improvement in Jimbo Fisher's first season as they went 10-3 ATS. While they do return QB Kellen Mond (3,581 total yards last year), the Aggies lose their top rusher Trayveon Williams (1,760 rush yards), their top receiver and their top 6 tacklers on defense. On the other side, Texas St has 19 returning starters and have a new coach in Jake Spavital who was the OC at A&M in 2014-15. Do you really want to lay this kind of number with the Aggies having a road trip to Clemson on deck? We'd prefer to lean with the OVER especially with Texas St playing more tempo under new O.C. Bob Stitt. ARIZONA ST 41 Kent St 17. The Sun Devils will go with a true frosh QB here in Jayden Daniels. While short on experience, Daniels is the 3rd highest rated recruit here since 2000 (only LB Vontaze Burfict in 2009 and TE Zach Miller in 2004 were rated higher). Head coach Herm Edwards surprised many including us by getting ASU to a bowl last year and this year's team looks comparable. Meanwhile, Kent St head coach Sean Lewis had the Golden Flashes improved a year ago even though their record didn't reflect it as they went from -22.3 ppg in 2017 to -12.8 ppg in 2018). The Golden Flashes welcome back 15 starters led by QB Woody Barrett (formerly at Auburn). We don't see too much value in this one.

With 24 BYU 20. The 100th meeting of the Holy War as the Utes have incredibly won 8 straight meetings but 7 of those have come by 8 points or less including last year when the Utes rallied from a 20-point deficit to stun the Cougars 35-27 (-11). Utah is getting more preseason hype than at any point in their modern history. They do return 14 starters and get their starting QB Tyler Huntley and starting RB Zack Moss back from injury. The Utes do have one of the nation's best defensive lines. However, this is probably BYU head coach Kalani Sitake's best team yet as the Cougars return 17 starters led by QB Zach Wilson who was a perfect 18 for 18 in the bowl game. While we respect Utah this season, we think they're starting to get a little over-priced in the market place.

### Friday, August 30th

ARMY 37 Rice 13. Army is coming off a school-record 11 wins and this year's team looks like it is capable of giving Army their third straight double-digit win season. Meanwhile, Rice has been the complete opposite off a combined 3-22 SU mark the last two years and it doesn't look like it will get any better this season as the Owls could be an underdog in all 12 games. Despite this, money has been coming in on the big dog here as Army has a big game vs Michigan on deck. Note that Army is only 4-12 ATS as a 21-point or more favorite since 1980. With that being said, our power ratings call for a lean on the home team who has won 13 straight at Michie.

WAKE FOREST 34 Utah St 30. The Demon Deacons crushed the Aggies 46-10 (-13) here a couple years ago. Wake Forest head coach Dave Clawson is doing a great job here as he has led the Demon Deacons to 3 straight bowl wins. Meanwhile, Gary Andersen returns to Logan where he was the head coach here from 2009-2012. Since then his tenures at Wisconsin and Oregon St both ended abruptly. While all-everything QB Jordan Love returns (39 total TD's), only one other starter returns for Utah St as the Aggies figure to take a step back after setting the Mountain West record with 618 points in a season last year. We don't see much value. Pass. **Wisconsin 34 USF 20.** The Badgers should be improved this season as after notching

4 straight double-digit win seasons, they only went 8-5 last year. The Badgers return arguably the best RB in the country in Jonathan Taylor (2,194 rushing yards last year). Wisconsin will start Jack Coan at QB. The Badgers defense should be improved this season despite losing 4 of their top 5 tacklers as the secondary should be healthier

(used 10 different starters last year). Meanwhile, it was a tale of two seasons for USF last year as the Bulls started 7-0 only to lose their last 6 by 19 ppg. Their defense allowed a school-record 32 ppg (at FBS level) but they do return 15 starters and are better than what they were at the end of last season. Surprisingly, the Bulls have won S straight vs Power 5 opponents, but we think that comes to an end here. MICHIGAN ST 37 Tulsa 13. We think Michigan St could be one of the surprise

teams in the country this year as the Spartans have 17 returning starters. All 5 starters are back on the offensive line and all 4 starters are back on a defensive line that was No. 1 in the country in rush defense (allowed just 78 rush ypg, 2.6 ypc). Keep in mind, MSU was banged up last year (lost 55 starts to injury) and we look for a much improved offense. On the other side, Tulsa was better than their 3-9 record indicated last year as they were just -5.5 ppg and -30 ypg. This year's team is even better with 14 returning starters. Note that Michigan State head coach Mark Dantonio is 30-0 SU laying 21-points or more but the Spartans are on a 0-7 ATS run in that role failing to cover by 16.4 ppg. That prevents us from liking MSU here (still lean Sparty).

2★ RUTGERS 37 Massachusetts 19. After 11 straight losses to close the 2018 season, Rutgers needs a "feel-good" win to start off 2019. The Scarlet Knights hammered Texas St 35-7 as a 16.5-point favorite in last year's opener and we expect more of the same here. Also note in their only other big favorite role in the last two years, Rutgers beat Morgan St 65-0 (-41) so head coach Chris Ash is certainly not afraid to run it up. This should be a much improved Rutgers offense with 8 starters back. On the other side, UMass is the least experienced team in the entire country with only 8 returning starters. It's clearly a rebuilding year under new head coach Walt Bell. The Minutemen lose their top 2 passers, their top 3 rushers and an All-American at WR in Andy Isabella who led the country with 1,698 receiving yards last year. On defense they lose their top player in Bryton Barr who had 147 tackles.

Colorado 34 Colorado St 21. @Denver, CO. Colorado head coach Mel Tucker makes his head coaching debut here. While he made his hay on the defensive side of the ball at Georgia and in the NFL, Tucker inherits a lot of talent on offense led by All-American WR Laviska Shenault. However, note the defense returns only 4 starters. On the other side, Colorado St head coach Mike Bobo enters 2019 on the hot seat as the Rams are just 5-14 ATS in their last 19 games. Totals' players note the UNDER has gone 10-1 in the Colorado/Colorado St series by an average of 9.7 ppg. This week's total is 57. We're passing on the side.

Purdue 35 NEVADA 24. This is only the third time since 2007 that Purdue is laying double-digits on the road. However, note the prior two happened last year as head coach Jeff Brohm clearly has upgraded this program. While the Boilers return all-everything WR Rondale Moore (first Big Ten true frosh to be named consensus All-American), they only have 2 other starters back on offense. We're not as high on them as the rest of the market. On the other side, Nevada managed 8 wins last year for the first time since joining the Mountain West in 2012. This year's team though could take a step back with only 11 returning starters and they've had some injuries at QB in fall camp. We're passing.

Oklahoma St 42 OREGON ST 30. We think both teams will be "Play-On" teams this year but right now we think there is more value with the home dog. The Beavers should be much better in year two under head coach Jonathan Smith and analytically we love that he was 25 for 36 (69%) on 4th down last year. OB Jake Luton is back along with their leading rusher Jermar Jefferson (1,380 yards), top receiver and their top 8 tacklers on defense. On the other side, Oklahoma St loses their starting QB, top rusher and top tackler. Yough laying more than 2 TD's on the road in a rare West Coast trip (farthest West OSU has been since 2008). Lean Beavers.

Saturday, August 31st OHIO ST 46 Florida Atlantic 17. The Ryan Day era starts in Columbus for the Buckeyes as the last 5 Ohio State head coaches are either in the CFB Hall of Fame (Hayes, Bruce, Cooper, Tressel) or heading there (Meyer). OSU will be breaking in a new QB in UGA transfer Justin Fields but there's plenty of talent around him including RB JK Dobbins (2,456 rush yards last two years). The defense should be improved with 9 returning starters after allowing the most ppg since 1988. On the other side, it's been feast (11-3 in 2017) or famine (5-7 last year) for Lane Kiffin at FAU. The Owls should be improved, but we have a tough time getting last year's opener (63-14 loss at Oklahoma +20) out of our minds. Slight lean on the Buckeyes. NEBRASKA 49 South Alabama 13. It was a rough beginning to head coach Scott Frost's first year in Lincoln. The Huskers started off 0-6 for the first time in school history, but they improved dramatically in their final six games going 4-2 SU/5-1 ATS. Nebraska went from getting out-scored by 15 ppg in the first six games to out-scoring their opponents by 13 ppg in their final six. This year Nebraska wel-comes back 13 starters led by QB Adrian Martinez who had 3,246 total yards and 25 total TD's as a true freshman While we think the Huskers could be one of the most improved teams in the country, they are starting to get a little pricey here as this is their largest favorite role over an FBS opponent since 2010.

NC STATE 37 East Carolina 20. A lot of money coming in on the underdog here as the expectation is that East Carolina was one of the poorly coached teams in college football the last 3 years. It certainly showed ATS wise as the Pirates were just 10-25-1 and were also -40 in TO's. Note that new head coach Mike Houston brought his former team (James Madison) here last year and only lost by 11. Meanwhile, ECU lost by 55 to NC State in last year's regular season finale. The Wolf Pack have to replace their 2nd all-time leading passer in Ryan Finley (10,505 career yards), a 1,000-yard rusher last year and two 1,000-yard receivers from a year ago. While our in the power ratings are quite strong on NC State here, we are passing. ILLINOIS 40 Akron 23. With 17 returning starters, this should be Lovie Smith's

best team yet in Champaign. The Illini will go with Michigan transfer Brandon Peters at QB, but the major concern is fixing a defense that allowed a school record 39.4 ppg last year. On the other side, Akron games should be higher scoring this year (7 starters back on offense, only 3 on defense) in new head coach Tom Arth's first game. Our power ratings are right on the number here. Pass.

† Indiana 40 Ball St 20. *@Indianapolis, IN.* Indiana is one of those teams we're a little higher on than the market place. After back-to-back 5-7 seasons, this is an important year for head coach Tom Allen. He does have 14 returning starters and despite one of those being Peyton Ramsey at QB, the Hoosiers have decided to go with Michael Penix. On the other side, it's year 4 for Ball State head coach Mike Neu who is also starting to feel a little pressure after going just 10-26. The Cardinals will be improved but there's certainly some ground to be made up here as they fell by 28 at Indiana a year ago. We lean with the favorite.

**KENTUCKY 34 Toledo 24.** A lot of early money has come in on the dog here. The expectation is that Kentucky off their best season in 40-plus years will take a step back this season. It makes sense considering they lost a generational talent for them on both sides of the ball including their all-time leading rusher Benny Snell and a Top 5 NFL Draft pick in DE Josh Allen. The Rockets come in off a season where they averaged 40.4 ppg on offense and they return both of their QB's. Note that Kentucky is on a 0-10 ATS run as a home favorite. We lean with the dog. **† Mississippi St 40 UL-Lafayette 17.** @New Orleans, LA. Mississippi St did crush

**† Mississippi St 40 UL-Lafayette 17.** *@New Orleans, LA.* Mississippi St did crush ULL last year in Starkville 56-10 (-34). Generally speaking, we think there could be value betting the OVER in Mississippi St games this year as new QB Tommy Stevens should be a better fit for Moorhead's schemes and the Bulldogs lose a lot of talent from one of the best defenses in the country. That defense will be tested here against a powerful ULL ground game that returns 3 players that combined to rush for 2,920 yards a year ago and note the Cajuns return all 5 starters on the offensive line. Originally, we thought we'd be leaning with the dog here, but money has been flowing in on them the last week.

**MEMPHIS 36 Ole Miss 31.** It's very tough backing an AAC team laying a TD vs an SEC team but we think it is deserved here. The Tigers were better than their 8-6 record indicated last year as they blew four double-digit leads. Brady White is back at QB for them and their defense should be better. On the other side, Ole Miss head coach Matt Luke brought in a pair of former head coaches in new O.C. Rich Rodriguez and new D.C. Mike MacIntyre. Their potent offense only returns 3 starters while their poor defense brings back 10. Note there should be plenty of Ole Miss supporters for this one as Oxford is a little over an hour away.

**TENNESSEE 43 Georgia St 13.** We like the favorite here. The Volunteers offense should be much improved this season with 10 returning starters. Jarrett Guarantano is one of the more underrated QB's in the country as last year during the season he went 166 passes without throwing an interception (broke school record). On the other side, Georgia St took a major step back last year but the Panthers do look improved this season with 14 returning starters. Note that their offensive stats were a little inflated last season thanks to scoring a combined 8 TD's in the final 5:00 of games when trailing by double-digits.

**Eastern Michigan 30 COASTAL CAROLINA 26.** We lean with the home dog here. Eastern Michigan head coach Chris Creighton is doing a great job in Ypsilanti with two of the school's bowl berths the last 3 years. However, we think this year's team will take a step back. On the other side, Jamey Chadwell takes over but he's not your typical new head coach as he was the interim here in 2017 (went 3-9) and has been the OC the last couple of years. While Eastern Michigan is on a 17-4 ATS run on the road, note they are only 2-2 ATS as a road favorite during that stretch.

**†** South Carolina 34 North Carolina 23. @Charlotte, NC. Mack Brown makes his return to Chapel Hill where he was the head coach from 1988-97. Still it should be noted his tactics grew stale his last couple of years in Austin and he's been out of coaching for 5 years. Brown faces a steep test here against a South Carolina team that could be Will Muschamp's best yet (14 returning starters). Jake Bentley is back at QB for the Gamecocks and will be making his 33rd career start here. Meanwhile, North Carolina true freshman Sam Howell will be making his first start. We like the favorite. **†** Alabama 45 Duke 13. @Atlanta, GA. Nick Saban is a perfect 12-0 SU/11-1 ATS in season openers at Alabama with an average cover of 9.3 ppg (average score 41-12). However, this is the biggest point spread in an opener for him since 2011 (-38.5 at nome vs Kent St). On the other side, Duke head coach David Cutcliffe is 25-10-1 ATS as an underdog since early 2013 with an average cover of 6.6 ppg. The Blue Devils are actually 19-17 SU in those games! While losing a first round pick at QB is never easy for a school like Duke, note that Quentin Harris was just fine filling in for him last year (7-to-1 TD-to-INT ratio). With the big line move, we're actually leaning with Duke. STANFORD 26 Northwestern 21. We're not very high on either team this season

**STANFORD 26 Northwestern 21.** We're not very high on either team this season but we think Stanford could have their weakest team in a decade with only 9 returning starters. On the other side, while Northwestern loses their all-time leading passer in Clayton Thorson (10,731 career pass yards), keep an eye on his replacement Hunter Johnson who was a former 5-star recruit at Clemson. Northwestern is 27-9 ATS as a road underdog since 2008 and the Wildcats have actually covered 10 in a row in this role by an average of 14.3 ppg (8-2 SU!) That's good enough for us.

Virginia Tech 31 BOSTON COLLEGE 24. The mis-pricing here comes with a Virginia Tech team that had their first losing season since 1992 last year. However, this year's team will be much improved with 16 returning starters including 10 on the defensive side. The Hokies D should be plenty motivated in the final year under long-time defensive coordinator Bud Foster. As far as Boston College goes, we expect the Eagles to take a step back this season especially with only 9 returning starters. The betting public usually just looks at the skill positions and BC does return their starting QB, RB and top WR. However, they are woefully inexperienced in most other areas including the defensive secondary. Syracuse 44 LIBERTY 26. We thought we were going to be liking Liberty in this game but their new head coach Hugh Freeze had back surgery on Aug. 16 (due to Liberty in the starting of the here there are turn the starting on Aug. 16 (due to Liberty in the starter areas the term in the starter are the information of the show are turned in the starter of the starter areas t

Syracuse 44 LIBERTY 26. We thought we were going to be liking Liberty in this game but their new head coach Hugh Freeze had back surgery on Aug. 16 (due to a life-threatening staph infection) and has been staying in a hotel near campus because he's not allowed to climb steps. The school's IT department set him up with video monitors from numerous camera angles that enable him to watch practice from his room. He's also able to speak with coaches and players during the practices via an audio hook-up and has even called plays to be run during some of the workouts. Still, it's not an ideal spot for a new head coach. Meanwhile, Syracuse comes in off their best season in two decades, and there's certainly a premium on them as this is the Orange's largest away favorite role since 2001.

**3★** † **Florida St 31 Boise St 23.** *@Jacksonville, FL.* We're buying a Florida State team that is off their worst season since 1976 as we expect to see some regression to the mean here. The Seminoles return 16 starters and are much improved on both sides of the ball. Obviously, year one under head coach Willie Taggart wasn't a good look. However, note that in his career, his teams improved upon the previous year's season win total in 6 of his previous 8 years (one win total remained the same). Meanwhile, Boise St has to replace a 4-year starting QB, a 1,400-yard rusher and their top 2 receivers. Their new QB Hank Bachmeier while talented is a true freshman making his first career start. This game is also in Jacksonville and as of a few weeks ago, FSU has sold 34,000 tickets for the game. Boise State requested only 2,500 tickets. There will be at least 90% Florida St fans in the crowd.

**ARKANSAS ST 31 Smu 30.** Arkansas St has one of the better home field advantages at the Group of 5 level as they are 39-8 SU the last 8 years. The Red Wolves do have to replace their Justice Hansen who is 2nd in school history in career pass yards (10,133). Their head coach Blake Anderson also will be coaching with a heavy heart as he lost his wife recently and had to take a leave of absence from the team. On the other side, SMU should be better this season as they return 16 starters from a team that went 5-7 a year ago but faced 4 Top 20 teams (first time since 1994). Texas transfer Shane Buechele will take over for the school's all-time leading passer Ben Hicks (9,081 career pass yards, transfered to Arkansas). We lean OVER. **MICHIGAN 45 Middle Tennessee 10.** The Wolverines return 8 starters on offense and are moving to a more up-tempo style under new O.C. Josh Gattis. On the other side, the Wolverine defense should be plenty motivated after allowing 103 points in the last two games of 2018. Remember they only allowed only 13.5 ppg in the first 11 games of the season. Meanwhile, Middle Tennessee is one of the least experienced teams in the country. They lose a 4-year starting QB in Brent Stockstill, who was the school's all-time leading passer (12,495 career passing yards) and they will be starting a brand new QB on the road in a rare night game in Ann Arbor. VIP customers got this pick when Michigan was -30.5.

**IOWA 38 Miami, OH 13.** With so much hype around Nebraska in the Big Ten West, we think the Hawkeyes are flying a little under the radar. QB Nathan Stanley returns after throwing 52 TD passes the last two years (most in a 2-year span in Iowa history). On the other side, the Redhawks lose their starting QB, top 2 rushers and leading tackler from a 6-6 team. Our power ratings say Iowa is the play here and note that the Hawkeyes are actually on 14-4-2 ATS run as a favorite the last 3 years. **LSU 41 Georgia Southern 10.** We thought Georgia Southern was one of the most overrated teams in the country last year. The Eagles benefited from +22 TO's, were out-gained in SBC play, and were +3 in net close wins but yet managed 10 wins. Meanwhile, we think this could be Ed Orgeron's best team yet at LSU as they return 16 starters from a 10-win team led by QB Joe Burrow. Our power ratings are really strong on the Tigers in this game, but do you really want to lay this kind of number vs an option team and knowing LSU has Texas on deck? **Georgia 38 VANDERBILT 18.** In the last two seasons, Georgia has gone a perfect

**Georgia 38 VANDERBILT 18.** In the last two seasons, Georgia has gone a perfect 12-0 SU/8-4 ATS vs SEC East foes with an average win by 40-15 and an average cover of 8 ppg. We think could be in store for a special season this year as the Bull-dogs bring back QB Jake Fromm and have arguably the best OL in the country (avg 6-5 330). Vanderbilt has a really good trio at RB, WR and TE but are breaking in a new QB and have several question marks in the defensive secondary. We certainly don't want to lay 3 TD's on the road in conference play in Week 1, but we're certainly not going to buck UGA recent past history.

Virginia 24 PITTSBURGH 23. Generally speaking, we think Virginia could be one of the surprise teams in college football this season. Bronco Mendenhall is quietly building a very good program (2 to 6 to 8 wins) and last year's team could've won even more (1-3 in games decided by 7 or less). This is his best team yet (14 returning starters) and Bryce Perkins is one of the most underrated QB's in the entire country (3,603 total yards, 34 total TD's). The Cavs were a top 20 defense last year and 8 starters are back. On the other side, the Panthers despite winning the ACC Coastal last year were a very average team as they were outgained by 18 ypg and outscored 2.2 ppg. However, the market seems to be all over this. Pass. **Missouri 36 WYOMING 17.** Missouri hammered Wyoming last year 40-13 (-19.5)

**Missouri 36 WYOMING 17.** Missouri hammered Wyoming last year 40-13 (-19.5) as the Tigers had a massive 601-248 yard edge. The Tigers have been great "bullies" under head coach Barry Odom as they are 11-0 SU/9-2 ATS laying double-digits with an average cover of 13.8 ppg! The average score in those games is 55-18 so obviously Odom isn't afraid to run it up. Yes, the Tigers have to replace QB Drew Lock, but his replacement is Clemson transfer Kelly Bryant who should be plenty motivated here. He is surrounded by plenty of talent led by RB Larry Rountree (1,216 yards rushing last year). On the other side, Wyoming has to replace a lot of their best players including RB Nico Evans (1,325 yards rushing last year), their top 2 receivers and 3 of their best defenders.

2 receivers and 3 of their best defenders. † **Auburn 29 Oregon 27.** *@Arlington, TX.* Obviously, this is the biggest game of the week and only ranked vs ranked match-up. We will be very intrigued at who wins the line of scrimmage as Oregon has the most experienced offensive line in college football in 8 years (153 career starts) against an Auburn defensive line that is easily one of the top 5 in the country. One of the big edges for Oregon here is QB Justin Herbert making his 29th career start here vs Auburn true freshman QB Bo Nix making his first career start. However, with that being said Oregon is just 4-12 SU on the road the last 3 years and after backing a Pac-12 team (Washington) vs Auburn last year, we're a little more gun shy this time around.

2★ Louisiana Tech (plus the points) TEXAS 37 Louisiana Tech 20. We think Texas is one of the most overrated teams in the country this year. The Longhorns have just 8 returning starters (tied for last in country) as they lose their leading rusher, leading receiver and entire front 7 on defense. We also feel there was an overreaction to their Sugar Bowl win vs an unmotivated Georgia team and note that the Horns won 10 games last year but 7 of those games were by a TD or less. Tom Herman is a great underdog coach but in his career as a favorite, he is just 14-22-2 ATS (39%). Note that Texas has failed to cover as a double-digit favorite in each of their previous two season openers (lost both games outright to Maryland). Meanwhile, Louisiana Tech head coach Skip Holtz is on a 14-4-1 ATS run as a road underdog. Finally, Texas has a huge look-ahead game vs LSU on deck..

WASHINGTON ST 48 New Mexico St 17. Mike Leach teams have gotten off to a slow start in recent years including a couple of shocking upset losses to FCS teams. The Cougars are coming off an historic season that saw them win a School-record 11 games. However, they lose a lot of key contributors including QB Gardner Minshew. Meanwhile, New Mexico St is much more experienced than what they were a year ago. The money has come in on the dog here and we agree. USC 33 Fresno St 17. USC needs a feel-good win here after a disappointing 2018 season. Head coach Clay Helton is clearly on the hot seat but he did make a great hire in bringing in O.C. Graham Harrell from North Texas whose offenses averaged 35 ppg the last two years. Harrell inherits a lot of talent as QB JT Daniels is back after starting as a true freshman last year along with one of the best sets of WR's in the country (top 3 return). Meanwhile, Fresno St is being overpriced because the Bulldogs are coming off their best season in school history (12 wins). We look for the Bulldogs to take a couple steps back this season as they have only 9 starters back. Fresno will be starting a brand new QB at night in a freshly renovated L.A. Coliseum. VIP customers got USC -10 but with the big line move, we only lean with the Trojans.

**OKLAHOMA 52 Houston 28.** This should be a fun match-up with two of the best offenses in the country. We feel the difference though could be Oklahoma's defense which should be much improved this season with 8 returning starters

and a new D.C. in Alex Grinch. The Sooners have a new QB in Alabama transfer Jalen Hurts and he already looked like an improved passer in the spring. On the other side, Houston QB D'Eriq King is back after accounting for 50 total TD's last year. Dana Holgorsen is the new hot-shot hire but his West Virginia teams never beat Oklahoma going 0-7 SU and they failed to cover 5 straight. The total in this game is now 82.5. That is the highest Week 1 total involving two FBS teams in college football history! Note that Totals' lined at 80 or above (in any week) have gone 28-18-1 (60.9%) to the OVER. We lean with the favorite. Sunday, September 2nd

2\* Louisville (plus the points) Notre Dame 37 LOUISVILLE 20. The Irish fresh off a CFB Playoff appearance figure to be down a notch this season as they must replace their leading rusher, leading receiver and arguably 4 of their top defenders. Ian Book is back at QB but he has lost their No. 3 and No. 4 receiving options in fall camp. On the other side, we have the Cardinals upgraded more than any team in the country. Basically, they quit last season on their former coach Bobby Petrino and we really like the new coach Scott Satterfield. The Cardinals bring back 16 returning starters and will feature more of a ground game this season (having a big dog that likes to work the clock is always a plus). Note that Notre Dame is in their largest away favorite role for the Irish since 2000.

Games where there was of difference of more than 3 points saw our computer lines actually beat the Vegas line at a 224-176-10 (56%) clip the last two years. Keep in mind, these computer lines don't take into consideration off-the-field factors like revenge or flat spots. They are basically a power-rating number difference between the two teams that son this week. That is their largest underdog role in also takes into consideration the home field advantage.

Of the 10 games where our computer is off more than 3 points compared to the Vegas line (highlighted), our favorite team this week to back would be Michigan St -22.5.

The Comp column is the computer projected line and the Diff column is the difference between the Vegas line and the Computer line. "+" numbers in the difference column say back the underdog. "-" numbers in the difference column say back the favorite. Let us know if you have questions.
