2. CenCON Business

- A. President's Report, Gerry Cummins
 - Cummins gave an update on the Southglenn lawsuit
 - CenCON must agree to a conduct remedy which will be included in both its next meeting's minutes and filed as part of any stipulation for dismissal of this action;
 - This conduct remedy includes an admission that CenCON incorrectly stated in Dec. 2021 that it "approved" the rezoning of streets located within Southglenn; as per CenCON bylaws, CenCON can only approve of any issue after taking a membership vote which did not occur prior to taking that position; and that, moving forward, CenCON will not take a position on any issue without taking a membership vote; and
 - o For the remainder of the current board's term, a Southglenn member will serve on CenCON's board in an ex officio capacity but, that this member shall be included in all CenCON board meeting discussions and decisions. If a position on the board opens, then this ex officio member shall be appointed to a regular board member position for the remainder of the term.
 - It was requested that the lawsuit documents be included with the minutes.

 - (Too late) DA Kellner held a Community Conversation on 6/30
 - A District Attorney's Academy will be held this fall, 9/15-10/26. See attached flyer.

 - The DA's newsletter came out on 6/29.
 - Major murder case was settled with a 48-year sentence handed down to convicted Aurora man. (https://www.da18.org/2022/06/aurora-man-sentenced-to-48-years-in-prison-in-alleyway-murder/)
 - Consumer Fraud Advisory this is the season for homeowner/contractor fraud.
 - When dealing with a contractor, get 2-3 bids even on small projects. See website for tips.
 - Homeowner title/deed theft you can monitor your own info on the county website. There is no need to pay a service to do this and they only notify you after the crime has already been done.
 - ◆ Should this happen, you will not lose your home and you are not liable for the debts resulting in criminal theft of such documents. Forged documents are null and void.
 - ◆ Always use a title company when doing a buy-sell of your propert.
 - Never use a virtual notary called "RON" system (remote online notarization). These services are usually fraudulent.
