Be sure to put **Thursday**, **August 17** down for the People to People picnic. For many years, Dale and Mitzi Stoltzman have prepared pulled pork for


this event, and they are willing to do so again next summer. This is always a really nice evening in a comfortable air-conditioned room at the Howards Grove Village Hall.
