Mrs. Opal G. Hund, 90, of Ubly, passed away Thursday morning, January 8, 2004, at the Courtney Manor in Bad Axe after a lengthy illness. She was born October 13, 1913 in Argyle to the late Benjamin and Ellen (Boag) Peters. Opal attended Argyle Country School and was a graduate of Ubly High School. She was united in marriage to Francis A. Hund on September 27, 1934 at St. Joseph Catholic Church in Argyle and lived most of her married life in Ubly.
