Edge Protection by Safety in a Second_

Fall hazards are a recurring theme on nearly every PCL project, and protecting our employees can take many forms. Traditional wooden handrail, although a common "fall restraint" system, is typically not designed for the much larger forces that occur with a "fall arrest" system. Edmonton Buildings' personnel worked with the manufacturer to refine the design of this fencing system to combine both capabilities in the required form, thus allowing the district to provide fall protection that will accommodate the bulk of its commercial projects on a continuing basis. The system also removes a significant waste item (2 x 4s and plywood) from projects, adding to the future profitability of the district.
