

If you renew online, don't pay your member dues through anything but <u>https://www.legion.org/renew</u> for Legion members, or <u>www.ALAforVeterans.org</u> for Auxiliary members. There is currently no link for SAL members to pay dues online.

Please be aware of a company called **Doxo**, which promotes itself as an official American Legion national bill pay site but is NOT affiliated with us. While this payment site *might* work, our members have reported delayed payments, missed due dates, and additional service fees when paying through Doxo. Using our name and logo is unauthorized, this service is not affiliated with the Legion.

If you renew your dues online, always use the official website listed above to pay your dues and update your contact information. The safest, fastest and easiest way to renew your membership is directly through your home Post in person or by mail.

All AUX members in good standing (paid) are also eligible to purchase a **PUFL (Paid Up For Life) membership**. Never again ask yourself "Did I pay my dues?" The cost of a PUFL membership is based on two factors -

the member's age at the time of application and the dues amount of the Unit. The cost for a 60 - 69 year old AUX member (Unit yearly dues \$40) would be \$822. *If you apply before June 30, 2022 that same PUFL fee would be only* \$624! Get your PUFL application



in before our 2023 dues increase goes into effect. Please ask Carol for your personal rate and a PUFL application today! Please note, PUFL fees are non-refundable.

We know how hard it is to remember everything you need to take care of when a loved one passes away, and even harder to know what benefits a deceased veteran may be entitled to.

This is one reason why the American Legion has Service Officers, to help the deceased veteran's family receive all the benefits they may be entitled to. Always remember, and tell your loved ones -

1) Know where your DD-214 is. An American Legion service officer can help you get a replacement copy if lost.

2) Tell your funeral director that the deceased was a veteran.

3) Contact your Post (or the nearest American Legion Post if your loved one was not a member), and not only can you receive the help of a Service Officer but, the Post's Honor Guard can help with a military funeral service. Other benefits might include a free burial plot, headstone, survivor benefits, burial expenses, and an American flag to drape the casket.

It's easy to request a copy of your military

service records from the National Personnel Records Center (NPRC) online, or by mail. Includes DD 214 separation documents, personnel records, replacement medals, and/or medical records. Just go to: <u>https://www.archives.gov/veterans/military-service-</u> <u>records</u> and follow the instructions. Same day service may be available for emergency requests (for example, medical procedures or funerals).

Generally there is no charge for basic military records provided to veterans, next-of-kin and authorized representatives. If your request involves a service fee, you will be notified as soon as that determination is made. Response time for records requested from the NPRC varies. Response times are typically within 10 days. However, requests that involve reconstruction efforts due to the 1973 fire, or older records which require extensive search efforts, may take 6 months or more to complete. **We cannot stress enough how important it is to have a copy your DD-214 on file!**

When you are a vet and wear a veteran's ball cap or clothing, or display a veteran license plate, those small things that show your pride in being a vet, you are, unfortunately, leaving yourself open to SCAMMERS.

Be aware of being approached by individuals and/or organizations with calls, texts or emails looking for donations. It's very easy to verify the validity of charitable organizations by checking with your State Attorney General's office at: <u>https://www.michigan.gov/ag/0,4534,7-359-82100---,00.html</u> or call 517-335-7622, the Better Business Bureau (<u>https://www.bbb.org/us/mi</u>), <u>charitynavigator.org</u>, <u>charitywatch.org</u>, or <u>www.AARP.org/money/scams/fraud</u> or call the AARP Fraud Watch Network at 877-908-3360.

Of these, your state attorney general's office is the most likely to pursue criminal action if you suspect you have already been scammed. And if you listen to podcasts, look up "The Perfect Scam" from AARP. They give incredible amounts of information to help keep you informed and aware of scams.

If you have already been scammed, please remember, this does not mean you are stupid or losing your faculties, and you are definitely NOT alone! <u>Literally millions of</u> <u>people of all ages get scammed every day!</u>

My ultimate goal here is not to scare you but to make you more skeptical and to check deeper into the calls, texts and emails that you probably receive every day. They may have told you "you've won money!", "please donate to our cause", "the IRS is preparing to auditing you!" "I really like your profile picture" or other common tactics. If they say to you "this must be done immediately" or "you can't tell anyone about this" or "you must send payment in gift cards" it is definitely a scam!


One more thing to remember, we live in a "way too much information society" where anyone can obtain as much info about you as they need to scam you from the internet. But, they can only see what you put out there, be smart about how much personal information you share on social media sites, dating sites, business sites, etc.

If you read nothing else, please read this. It's not necessarily those members that I always see at the Post, at meetings and dinners, it's those who are older, isolated, eager for personal contact, perhaps their only link with our Post may be this newsletter. Those are the people who may need our help in understanding and avoiding these kinds of issues. Please continue to communicate with friends and family, continue to educate yourself about these scams and keep yourself, your money and your future safe!

FYI: There may be a delay in the processing of online dues payments due to HQ computer issues. Please be patient when waiting for your new 2022 membership card. Remember, it's much easier and faster to pay at the Post.

On February 3rd we commemorate the ultimate sacrifice the Four Chaplains made onboard the USS Dorchester, but this is not a one day remembrance but an all-year commitment to keep others in your thoughts, prayers and actions.



You may ask; what is a Chaplain? Well let me tell you. Military Chaplain: 1 n A Chaplain in one of the military services. Synonyms: Holy Joe, padre, sky pilot. How long has the Chaplain been around: The U.S. Chaplain Corps is one of the oldest and smallest branches of the Military. The Chaplain Corps dates back to 29 July 1775, when the Continental Congress authorized one chaplain for each regiment of the Continental Army, with pay equaling that of a Captain.

One interesting aspect of a Chaplain is that they are considered a clergyman but do not have to be ordained by a religion, they must be a person of good standing and understanding and can fill the position with proper training. A Chaplain has no church, congregation or fixed location for their ministry. The area of operation is a post, camp, airfield or any place where they can provide solace, comfort and peace.

With that in mind please remember the spirit of sacrifice and giving to others exemplified by the Four Chaplains all year long. Please say this prayer not only in February but all year to remind you of the Four Chaplains:

Membership Eligibility



Legion membership eligibility. Veterans or active duty military who have served at least one day of active duty in the US Armed Forces since December 7, 1941 and have been honorably discharged or are still serving. Must present a DD-214 (DD-217, DD-256, or DD-257).

<u>Auxiliary membership eligibility</u>. 1) Relationship to veteran: Grandmother, mother, sister, daughter, grand-daughter, male or female spouse, or self (for female veterans).

2) Potential member must be related to a *living* veteran by one of the relationships stated **AND** veteran is a current member of the American Legion. **OR**, potential member is related to a *deceased* veteran who served at least one day of active service during eligible time periods (Apr. 6, 1917 to Nov. 11, 1918 and any time after Dec. 7, 1941) and was honorably discharged. Deceased veteran does not have to have been a member of the American Legion.

SAL membership eligibility. 1) All male descendants adopted sons, and stepsons. 2) Potential member must be related to a *living* veteran by one of the relationships stated **AND** veteran is a current member of the American Legion. **OR**, potential member is related to a *deceased* veteran who served at least one day of active service during eligible time periods (Apr. 6, 1917 to Nov. 11, 1918 and any time after Dec. 7, 1941) and was honorably discharged. Deceased veteran does not have to have been a member of the American Legion.

Membership applications are available NOW in the clubroom!
