





LAOH ELECTIONS ARE COMING!

Nominations and elections for all Division Offices for the 2025-2026 term are being held at the November meeting. All members are highly encouraged to consider running for an office. If you have any questions, please feel free to reach out to any member of the current board.

Here is an excerpt from the 2024 National Constitution concerning elections.

ARTICLE XVIII PROCEDURES FOR NOMINATIONS AND ELECTIONS

Part Two Procedures for State Board, County Board and Division Nominations and Elections

Section 5. Nominations for Division Board Office shall be taken annually or biennially in accordance with State Board or County Board and Division Board Bylaws and shall be taken between October 1st and December 31st

Section 6. To be eligible to hold a Division Board Office, the Candidate must be a member in good standing for a minimum of 30 days prior to the Division Election; the Candidate shall have attended at least four (4) business meetings of the Division during the calendar year, and ideally shall have received the Degrees of the Order.

Section 7. Nominations for State Board, County Board, and Division Board Offices shall be accepted in the following order: President, Vice President, Secretary, Treasurer, (Financial Secretary – Division only), Irish Historian, Missions & Charities Officer, Catholic Action Officer, Mistress-at-Arms, Sentinel and two (2) members of the Grievance Committee at the Division level and County Board level only.

Section 8. Nominations from the floor do not require a Nominating Speech. If a Nominating Speech is made on behalf of a Candidate, the nomination and the second shall be limited to three (3) minutes.

Section 9. After each nomination, the Presiding Officer shall ask the Candidate to stand before the Delegation and verify that she accepts the nomination.

Section 10. After each candidate is nominated, the Presiding Officer shall ask three times, "Are there any other nominations?"

Section 11. After closing the nominations for any uncontested office, the Presiding Officer shall direct the Secretary to cast one (1) ballot for the Nominee.

Section 12. After closing nominations for all offices, the Presiding Officer shall direct the Secretary to prepare the ballots for all contested offices.

ELIGIBILITY TO VOTE

Section 14. All registered Delegates and Alternates at a State or County Convention shall be eligible to vote, pursuant to the State Board or County Board Bylaws. All Division Members in good standing shall be eligible to vote, pursuant to the State Board, County Board, or Division Board Bylaws.

Section 15. All eligible voters must be physically present to vote at the designated voting site during the designated voting time period. There shall be no Absentee Ballots.

Burrito Spaghetti Squash Boats

Shared by Kris Bucko

Ingredients

FOR SPAGHETTI SQUASH

2 medium spaghetti squash, halved, seeds removed

1 Tbsp. extra-virgin olive oil Kosher salt

1/2 tsp. chili powder

1/2 tsp. cumin

FOR FILLING

1 Tbsp. extra-virgin olive oil

1/2 onion, chopped

2 cloves garlic, minced

1 lb. ground beef

1 Tbsp. taco seasoning mix

Kosher salt

Freshly ground black pepper

1 (15-oz.) can black beans

1 1/2 c. chopped cherry tomatoes

1 c. corn, canned and drained or frozen

1 c. shredded Monterey jack

1/2 c. shredded cheddar

2 Tbsp. freshly chopped cilantro (optional)

Directions

Step 1

Preheat oven to 400°. Drizzle cut sides of spaghetti squash with oil and season with salt, chili powder, and cumin. Place cut side down on a large, rimmed baking sheet. Roast until tender, 30 to 35 minutes. Let cool slightly. Using a fork, break up squash strands.

Step 2

Meanwhile, make filling: In a large skillet over medium heat, heat olive oil. Add onion and cook until soft, about 5 minutes. Stir in garlic and cook until fragrant, about 1 minute more. Add ground beef, breaking up the meat with a wooden spoon. Cook until beef is no longer pink, about 6 minutes. Drain fat.

Step 3

Stir in taco seasoning, then season to taste with salt and pepper. Stir in black beans, cherry tomatoes, and corn.

Step 4

Fill each spaghetti squash with beef mixture and top with cheeses. Return to oven to melt cheese, 5 minutes. Garnish with cilantro and serve.

CHAPLAIN'S CORNER

Hope is a Noun and a Verb!

These times of violence in our world, division and incivility in our society challenge all of us to keep healthy in mind, body and spirit. Easier said than done. So, I am suggesting a focus that, I "hope" will bring us all closer to the peace and joy God desires for us, for our families and for our world. God is present with us in all details of our lives and the life of our world. But where is God in all this?

This is what I know...

To live our lives, God gives us Hope. We need Hope to live each day. To encourage each other, we need to be able to explain Hope. Hope is both something we have and something we do. We use the word hope a bit carelessly at times...my students would hope for an A but never study, or we may hope for a promotion but never apply for the position. Hoping is not wishing. Hope is a way of being, but it requires action at times too. Hope is a virtue so sometimes it takes patience and hard work. So Hope is something we do, but it is also something we have. It is a noun and a verb. Hope is in us. God put it there. Jesus is our Hope. We need only claim it even if we don't feel it.

The poet, Emily Dickinson wrote: Hope is the thing with feathers

That perches in the soul

And sings the tune without the words

And never stops - at all -

Hope is a like a "bird." Hope is within us always ready to take flight or sing. Hope is a gift we all have available to us if we choose to. Sometimes we give up Hope. Life can bring us to that point. Suffering can make us lose sight of Hope. It takes faith to Hope and strong, deep faith to return to Hope when we've lost it. The Rio Statue of Christ the Redeemer reminds us that it takes courage, arms open wide to Hope...do we have the courage to hope? Sometimes courage to hope comes in the open arms of another. Hope "never stops" because God is a faithful provider. God...Jesus...His Mother...the angels and communion of saints, the person next to you can be sources of hope if we but have the courage and faith to open our arms to give and receive Hope.

So what exactly is hope? It is not a wish. What is the difference between a wish and a hope? We know the desired outcome of a wish...we do not of a hope. Hope requires trust and faith...a belief that God will provide.

This month, reflect on: Who or what gives you hope? Where do you find Hope? Go outside and find a symbol of hope...in nature... In Case You Missed September's Irish History Report:

Anne Bonny - Pirate Queen

Anne Cormac Bonny smashed the glass ceiling with a cutlass and became known as the Pirate Queen of the Caribbean. Despite a career of only two months, Anne Bonny is among the most famous pirates in recorded history, primarily due to her gender.

Born in Kinsale in 1698, Anne was the result of an illicit affair. A rebellious young woman, she defied her father's wishes and married John Bonny, a poor sailor.

The two traveled to the Bahamas, which was known as a sanctuary for pirates, but Anne soon left her husband to join a colorful pirate named "Calico Jack" (John Rackham). Along with a female pirate named Mary Read, they sailed the seas during the so-called "Golden Age of Piracy", wreaking havoc and raiding merchant vessels off the coast of Jamaica.

Female pirates were few and far between, and it was said to be bad luck to have a woman on board a ship. A testament to Anne's fiery temper, when a fellow crew member dared to say something to her along these lines, it is said that she stabbed him in the chest.

Anne once successfully plotted to steal the cargo of a French merchant ship by dismembering a dressmaker's mannequin with an ax and covering it with fake blood. When the French saw Anne standing over the bloody "corpse", they gave up their goods without a fight.

Anne's ship was eventually captured by the British Navy, with the crew in various states of drunkenness. Before his execution, Anne famously said to Calico Jack, "If you had fought like a man, you need not have been hang'd like a dog."

At Anne and Mary's execution trial, it was read "You, Mary Read, and Anne Bonny, alias Bonn, are to go from hence to the Place from whence you came, and from thence to the Place of Execution; where you, shall be severally hang'd by the Neck, till you are severally Dead. And GOD of His infinite Mercy be merciful to both of your souls."

Anne and Mary escaped execution due to them both claiming to be pregnant and begging for mercy. Mary Read died in prison the following year, but it remains unknown what happened to Anne Bonny. It has been said that she escaped Jamaica, moved to Virginia, remarried, had at least 8 children and died in her 80's.


