AMERICANISM

DECEMBER 2016

On Sunday morning, December 7, 1941, the Imperial Japanese Navy Air Service attacked Naval Station Pearl Harbor, Hawaii, without warning and without a declaration of war, killing 2,403 American non-combatants, and injuring 1,178 others. The attack sank two U.S. Navy battleships and damaged five others. It also damaged three cruisers, three destroyers, and one minelayer. Aircraft losses were 188 destroyed and 159 damaged. Twenty years later I lived on Hickman Air Force Base and in the back of each housing building were bomb shelters for "Just in Case". On the beaches were wooded lookouts hidden in the palm trees, the same ones used in 1941, and adjacent to the sunken USS Arizona was a long wooden dock. My Father and I went fishing there sometimes and even then the mood was solemn knowing that 1,102 of the 1,177 Sailors and Marines were trapped inside, their final resting place, a watery grave. A year later the USS Arizona Memorial was built over the sunken battleship and was dedicated on May 30, 1962 in honor of the crew members who were killed.

Did you know that, Canada declared war on Japan within hours of the attack on Pearl Harbor, the first Western nation to do so. Then on December 8th, the United States declared war on Japan and entered World War II on the side of the Allies. In a speech to Congress, President Franklin D. Roosevelt called the bombing of Pearl Harbor "a date which will live in infamy." A famous quote remembered, even today. And still gives me shivers when I hear President Roosevelt's speech replayed on the History Channel.

On December 7, 2016, will be the 75th Pearl Harbor Remembrance Day. Please take time to remember and honor those who were killed or suffered injuries as a result of this vicious attack. Those who survived suffered great loss and lasting horrific and painful memories. And please add some prayers for a peaceful future.

I would like thank District's 7, 8, 11, 12, and Unit's 29 and 62, for bringing their colors to the Department Conference. I would also like to thank Naomi Rains from Unit 78 for continuing to send in monthly reports. Please follow her example.

Remember, mid-term reports are due to me by December 15th.

My sincere wishes to all of you for a Happy Hanukkah, a very Merry Christmas, and a most wonderful and successful New Year!

The following are program funds that need to go through the Department Books. Checks are to be made payable and sent to American Legion Auxiliary, 4701 N. 19th Ave. Suite 100, Phoenix AZ 85015-3727. Please write separate checks for MEMBERSHIP, and Mandates. All others may be included in one check with an explanation as to where the funds are being donated to.

REMINDER: ALL MANDATES ARE DUE 30 DAYS PRIOR TO CONVENTION OR YOUR UNIT WILL FOREFIT IT'S RIGHT TO VOTE. DO NOT SEND DISTRICT MANDATES TO DEPARTMENT, SEND THEM TO YOUR DISTRICT.....

- DUES:Current and previous years dues are \$16.00 per Senior and \$4.00 per Junior. This includes
Department and National dues. It also includes a subscription to the National News
magazine for senior member.
- <u>MANDATES</u>: 2016 Department Close of Books membership totals are used to determine the base for assessments District AND Department. Rehabilitation Per Capita (RPC) is twenty cents per <u>SENIOR</u> member. (RPC is sent on to National for their use in veterans programs.)
 Delegate Per Capita (DPC) is twenty cents per member, <u>SENIORS</u>. (DPC is used by the Department to send delegates to National Convention.) Junior Activities Per Capita (JAPC) is twenty cents per member, <u>JUNIOR AND SENIOR</u>, and is paid whether or not your Unit has any Juniors. This is used to send Junior President and Chaperon to Junior National Convention. Junior Delegate Per Capita (JDPC) is twenty cents per junior member and is used by the Department to support the Junior Activities Fund. Blanket Position BOND covers all Unit members, and is forwarded to National yearly. Bond fee per Unit is \$5.50.
- POPPIES:Units are urged to order poppies. Poppies are \$120.00 per thousand and can be ordered
in increments of 100 (\$12.00 per hundred). Poppies must be ordered by September 30,
2016. Please use the enclosed form to order poppies. Units must order at least 100 poppies
to compete for Department Awards except membership. After Poppy Distribution is
completed, 10% of NET Poppy proceeds are to be sent to Department. Poppy Funds are
restricted funds see the Guide for Volunteers for explanation.
- **WELFARE PLEDGE**: This money stays in Department for use in the Welfare Budget for Veterans programs and direct aid.
- <u>CHRISTMAS PLEDGE</u>: This money stays in Department for use in the Welfare Budget for each VA Medical Center (VAMC) in Arizona to place dollar bills in Christmas Cards for the hospitalized veterans. It's just a small gift, but is very much appreciated.

HOSPITAL PARTIES &

- **SOCIAL SERVICES:** This money is sent to the VAMC's as designated by Units for monthly Bingo Parties, comfort items, recreation & medical equipment, carnivals, etc.
- **<u>GIFT SHOP</u>**: Money is used for purchasing gifts that enable hospitalized veterans to pick out gifts (free of charge) for themselves and their families to celebrate the Christmas Holiday.

PAST PRESIDENT'S

- PARLEY:
 This money funds scholarships in nursing and health care occupations for students attending Arizona schools.
- **<u>SPIRIT OF YOUTH</u>**: This money goes to National to for National Scholarships and youth programs.

AUXILIARY EMERGENCY

- FUND:
 This money is sent to National for assistance to Auxiliary members during a personal crisis or natural disaster. Certain Pre-req. are required.
- **JUNIORS**: This money stays in Department and helps pay the way for our Junior representative and her chaperon to attend the National Junior Meeting, as well as, off-setting Department Junior Meeting Expenses.
- <u>GIRLS STATE</u>: Fees are \$200.00 for the Unit and a <u>\$100.00</u> registration fee from the girl total \$300.00. Units are to deposit all monies received for your Girls State program and write one check to cover fee and registration for the girls. <u>Fees must be sent to the Department Girls State</u> <u>Director with delegate and alternate cards, NOT to Department Headquarters</u>. **Donations** to the Girls State fund may be sent to Department Headquarters.

ARIZONA'S COURTESY &

- <u>CAMPAIGN FUND</u>: This money stays in Department to help with expenses when Arizona has a candidate for National Office.
- **DEPARTMENT OFFICE OVERHEAD EXPENSES FUND**: This money stays in Department to help keep the Department Headquarters Office open with proper furniture and equipment, and all expenses incurred.

CAVALCADE OF



I would ask that this information be made a part of your ruling documents and available whenever a question needs to be answered.

To all Units, in the Fall Conference packet on FINANCE, the form to Register with the Secretary of State was included for your use. All American veteran organizations soliciting funds or support MUST REGISTER WITH THE Secretary of State. This is a class 3 misdemeanor if you do not register. No fees are necessary to file – just get it done!! Also information on the new IRS E-Postcard filing was made available.

The year-end Finance Report form has some changes – rather than make 2 separate report forms, one for Units & one for Districts, all the person has to do that is making out the form is circle which one they are filing for and indicate the name of either a Unit or a District. DEADLINE FOR THIS REPORT TO BE BACK TO ME IS MAY 15th, 2017. Also by May 17th all other Department Chairmen will be notified of the Units not reporting according to Department Policies and Procedures. Timely reporting will be necessary.

To all those individuals that brought items for the raffle table at Fall Conference, the Finance Committee thanks you and with your help and the generosity of all purchasing tickets we banked \$628. for the Department overhead fund.

Reminder – check the dates for Units to file their annual IRS reports AND the report to the AZ Corporation Commission. You must keep on top of your reporting.
