### **Misleading Finals**


Western Michigan lost in OT to Ball St but the Broncos had 33-22 first down and 548-349 yard edges including 361-67 on the ground.

Northern Illinois lost 13-7 to Miami, OH. However, the Huskies had a 369-201 yard edge including 212-94 on the ground, but were -2 in TO's. NIU had clinched the MAC West the night before with Western Michigan's loss to Ball St. Miami, OH got a 28-yard interception return TD in the 3Q for the game-winner.

Kent St lost to Toledo 56-34 but the Golden Flashes actually had a 23-21 first down edge and were only out-gained 517-497. Toledo scored on an 83-yard punt return TD and also got a 31-yard interception return TD.

Virginia lost in OT to Georgia Tech but the Cavaliers actually had 24-13 FD and 403-305 yard edges. UVA surrendered a safety and a special teams TD but also botched a punt return. GT recovered the fumble, leading to their only offensive TD.

**USF lost to Temple 27-17.** However, Temple benefited from 5 USF TO's. USF actually led 17-0 at halftime. In the 4Q, Temple got a 73-yard punt return TD and also recovered a fumble in the end zone for a TD.



FIU beat Charlotte 42-35. However, Charlotte had 28-21 first down and 534-490 yard edges but were -2 in TO's including a fumble that was returned 61 yards for a TD.

29-point favorite Utah State only beat Colorado St 29-24. Colorado St had 29-16 first down and 506-310 yard edges and the Rams held the ball for 42:05! Utah St got a 95-yard interception return TD (14-point swing) and a 32-yard interception return TD. Utah St also got a 33-yard TD pass with :43 left but Colorado St scored on the final play of the game only to get called back on penalty.

Texas A&M beat UAB 41-20. However, UAB had 3 TO's including a fumble on the opening kickoff that was returned for a TD. UAB also missed 3 FG's.

Ole Miss lost in OT to Vanderbilt but the Rebels had 28-21 first down and 578-387 yard edges including 457-191 through the air. Ole Miss QB Ta'amu had a career-high 457 yards passing while Ole Miss WR AJ Brown had 212 receiving yards.

Virginia Tech was drilled by Miami, FL 38-14. However, VT had a 22-17 first down edge and were only out-gained 339-335. However, the Hokies were -3 in TO's. Miami got a 3-yard TD "Drive" after a TO and also got a 51-yard punt return TD.

HOME TEAM IN CAPS

Thursday, November 22nd AIR FORCE 34 Colorado St 21. We're wondering how either team recovers after last week. AF actually led 27-14 Wyoming late 3Q but allowed the game's final 21 points. Air Force had 25-18 first down and 415-373 yard edges including 362-111 on the ground. Meanwhile, Colorado St nearly pulled one of the biggest upsets of the season vs Utah St. Colorado St had 29-16 first down and 506-310 yard edges and the Rams held the ball for 42:05! Utah St got a 95-yard interception return TD (14-point swing) and a 32-yard interception return TD. Utah St also got a 33-yard TD pass with :43 left but Colorado St scored on the final play of the game only to

get called back on penalty. We lean dog and the UNDER.

Mississippi St 33 OLE MISS 24. Egg Bowl. Mississippi St has revenge for an upset loss to Ole Miss last year. Miss St has the huge defensive edge here and last week hammered Arkansas. Miss St had 29-17 first down and 475-219 yard edges including 287-69 on the ground. Meanwhile, Ole Miss comes in losers of 4 straight. Last week, Ole Miss had 28-21 first down and 578-387 yard edges including 457-191 through the air but lost in OT at Vanderbilt. QB Ta'amu had a career-high 457 yards passing while WR AJ Brown had 212 receiving yards. This is Ole Miss' bowl game and we lean with the home dog.

Friday, November 23rd

OHIO 40 Akron 16. Ohio needs a win and a Buffalo loss to get to MAC Championship game. Last week the Bobcats had their most impressive game of the season as they crushed Buffalo. Ohio dominated with 32-13 first down and 646-277 yard edges including 437-157 on the ground. Meanwhile, Akron has been pathetic on offense recently and last week the Zips were upset at home to Bowling Green. Ohio would be the only way to look here but this number is steep.

CINCINNATI 37 East Carolina 18. Cincy was outclassed at UCF last week but note the Bearcats actually had a 20-18 first down edge but were out-gained 402-379. We had the OVER on these pages but the two teams missed a combined 3 FG's and an extra point. In addition, both teams came up empty once in the red zone. ECU is off a blowout win over UConn. ECU dominated with 34-16 first down and 657-274 yard edges including 415-91 on the ground. ECU QB Holton Ahlers had 5 total TD's. We lean with the OVER here.

**Eastern Michigan 31 KENT ST 19.** EMU is off a late season bye while Kent St lost to Toledo 56-34 last week. However, the Golden Flashes actually had a 23-21 first down edge and were only out-gained 517-497. Toledo scored on an 83-yard punt return TD and also got a 31-yard interception return TD. Eastern Michigan is a 13.5-point favorite here. That's the largest away favorite role for the Eagles since 1995. However, note that Eastern Michigan is on a 15-2 ATS run on the road. **Buffalo 35 BOWLING GREEN 20.** A win here for Buffalo would clinch the di-

vision and put the Bulls in the MAC Championship game. However, last week the Bulls played their worst game of the season as they were crushed by Ohio 52-17. Ohio dominated with 32-13 first down and 646-277 yard edges including 437-157 on the ground. Buffalo did have 5 TO's. Meanwhile, Bowling Green had 22-15 first down and 401-227 yard edges including 221-79 on the ground in their win over Akron. The back-to-back road victories are the first for the Falcons since they beat Purdue and Buffalo in 2015. Bowling Green is just 2-15 ATS at home in their last 17 games. However, we lean UNDER

3★ Nebraska (plus the points) IOWA 30 Nebraska 24. The Huskers are certainly playing their best ball of the season as they have covered 6 straight games vs Big Ten teams. Last week we cashed on these pages with them but Nebraska trailed 3-0 entering the 4Q. They got 3 FG's from their frosh kicker including a 47-yarder with 5:13 left. It was the first time the Cornhuskers had won a game without scoring a TD since a 3-0 victory over Kansas State in 1937. "Every week I've been coaching them there's a little more fight. Today's the most I've seen, said first-year Huskers coach Scott Frost. Speaking of fight, Iowa showed plenty of it last week. Off 3 straight losses they hammered Illinois 63-0. Iowa had 20-11 first down and 400-220 yard edges and benefited from 4 Illinois TO's (Iowa scored 2 non-offensive TD's). Iowa, in their last home game was laying doubles to Northwestern and lost outright and we feel Nebraska is just as good

**Texas 34 KANSAS 19.** Texas needs a win here to get to the Big 12 Championship game. Note the Horns did lose their last trip here that promptly ended the Charlie Strong era. Last week, Texas got an impressive win over Iowa St. Texas had 20-12 first down and 405-210 yard edges. Texas QB's Ehlinger and Buechele were a combined 22 of 25 for 226 yards and 2 TD's. However Ehlinger re-injured his shoulder and is ? here. On the other side, Kansas has not quit on out-going head coach David Beaty (welcome Les Miles). Last week, Jayhawks put up 524 yards and 40 points at Oklahoma. Kansas RB Pooka Williams might be the best player in the country you've never heard of as. Pooka had 252 rushing yards last week. Lean OVER.

MISSOURI 41 Arkansas 17. Last week Arkansas showed no heart in a blowout loss at Mississippi St. "This is completely unacceptable, Arkansas coach Chad Morris said. "Unacceptable in all areas. Unacceptable coaching, unacceptable playing, unacceptable at all levels. This is not what this program is about -- not what it's going to be built on. We're in major gut check time." Meanwhile, Missouri dominated Tennessee as the Tigers had 29-11 first down and 484-255 yard edges. The Tigers usually are playing their best ball this time of year but this is a big number.

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Coastal Carolina 28 SOUTH ALABAMA 26. Coastal has been sitting on 5 wins for 3 straight games but has lost all 3. Last week they were run over by Georgia Southern. Meanwhile, South Alabama had 27-17 first down and 477-407 yard edges in a loss to UL-Lafayette. The Jags did have 3 TO's. To the wire.

TOLEDO 35 Central Michigan 17. Toledo has won 8 straight in the series going 7-1 ATS. Last week, Toledo got to bowl eligibility with a win over Kent St. The game was a bit misleading Toledo scored on an 83-yard punt return TD and also got a 31-yard interception return TD. Meanwhile, Central Michigan is off a late-season bye as this has been a season to forget for the Chips. Pass.

Central Florida 38 SOUTH FLORIDA 27. We lean with the home dog here. UCF is off one of their biggest wins in school history as ESPN College Game Day was on hand for them last week. UCF did have a 6.6-4.7 yards per play advantage vs the Bearcats. USF has lost 4 straight since a 7-0 start. However, last week was a misleading loss to Temple. USF actually led 17-0 at halftime. In the 4Q, Temple got a 73-yard punt return TD and also recovered a fumble in the end zone for a TD as the Bulls had 5 TO's in the game. Remember UCF was only -3.5 here in the West Gate "Game of Year" lines this summer.

Oregon 42 OREGON ST 27. Oregon was a right side loser on these pages last week. The Ducks had a 449-324 yard edge but were -3 in TO's. Still Oregon was covering for most of the game until Arizona St's last TD in the 4Q. The Ducks led 28-13 at halftime. Meanwhile, Oregon St is off a cover vs Washington. The early week money has been on Oregon (line opened -14.5) but at the current number of "17.5" we lean with the Beavers.

2★ MEMPHIS 41 Houston 30. The winner of this one will go to the AAC Championship game and face UCF next week. Memphis is playing their best ball of the season off 3 straight wins and covers. Last week Memphis had a 434-366 yard edge including 208-25 on the ground in a win at SMU. While Ed Oliver's sideline antics with head coach Major Applewhite got most of the media attention last week in Houston's blowout win over Tulane, the real story revolves around Houston star QB D'Eriq King who left with a knee injury and is out for the season. King has accounted for 50 total TD's this season! That's more than any player in college football.

Virginia 26 VIRGINIA TECH 24. Virginia Tech is on a 14-0 SU/10-4 ATS run in the series but now find themselves a home dog here. Last week Virginia Tech was drilled by Miami, FL 38-14. However, VT had a 22-17 first down edge and were only out-gained 339-335. However, the Hokies were -3 in TO's. Miami got a 3-yard TD 'Drive" after a TO and also got a 51-yard punt return TD. On the other side, Virginia lost in OT to Georgia Tech but the Cavaliers actually had 24-13 FD and 403-305 yard edges. UVA surrendered a safety and a special teams TD but also botched a punt return. GT recovered the fumble, leading to their only offensive TD. VT is trying to keep their 26-year bowl streak in tact. They take home the cash here but UVA breaks the long losing streak.

Oklahoma 44 WEST VIRGINIA 41. Winner goes to the Big 12 Championship game and will likely face Texas. Last week Oklahoma only had 31-25 first down and 566-524 yard edges last week vs Kansas. The OU defense allowed 348 rushing yards and the last 3 games are allowing 44 ppg and 546 ypg! Meanwhile, West Virginia's National Title hopes went down the drain in Stillwater last week. WV blew a 31-14 halftime lead and still had a 93% chance of winning with 6 minutes left according to ESPN's win probability rate. OU has been a bad match-up for WV. OU 4-0 SU/ATS with an average win by 22 ppg and average cover of 11 ppg. Totals' players note that this is the highest total (84) in college football this season. If you're wondering how high totals do, any total priced at 80 or above has gone 27-18-2 to the OVER in college football history.

WASHINGTON ST 26 Washington 24. The winner goes to the Pac-12 Championship game. Washington has been a bad match-up for Washington St. The Huskies are 4-0 SU/ATS with an average win by 27 ppg and an average cover of 20 ppg. Note that in the summer "Game of Year" lines, Washington was around a 2-TD favorite here but now Washington St is favored in the series for the first time since 2006. However, the Cougars are 10-1 ATS this year while Washington is 2-9 ATS. Both teams are off blowout wins. Washington St actually led Arizona 55-14 at half-time! QB Gardner Minshew was 43 of 55 for 473 yards and 7 TD's! The Cougars have won 13 straight at home by 20 ppg but this one goes down to the wire.

MIAMI, FL 27 Pittsburgh 21. Miami clearly has the motivational edge here but it is priced into the line. The Canes have revenge for losing to Pitt last year that ended the Canes' 10-0 season. Also the Panthers clinched the ACC Coastal Division last week in their win at Wake Forest and have Clemson on deck for the ACC Championship. Miami did snap their 4-game losing streak last week in a 38-14 win over Virginia Tech. However, Miami got a 3-yard TD "Drive" after a TO and also got a 51-yard punt return TD. We're passing.

**Temple 48 CONNECTICUT 20.** Temple is a 30-point favorite here. That's the largest road favorite role for the Owls in our database dating back to 1980! It is deserved considering UConn has one of the worst defenses in college football history. Last week the Huskies were crushed by lowly ECU. Meanwhile, Temple benefited from 5 USF TO's in their come-from-behind win last week. USF actually led 17-0 at halftime. In the 4Q, Temple got a 73-yard punt return TD and also recovered a fumble in the end zone for a TD. We're passing.

Kentucky 34 LOUISVILLE 17. Kentucky beat Middle Tennessee 34-23 last week. However, MT had 24-15 first down and 392-324 yard edges. MT had 2 early TO's that were converted into 2 Kentucky TD's including a 66-yard interception return. Kentucky is on a 0-12 ATS run as a favorite. The Wildcats are 17-point favorites here and that is the biggest favorite role for Kentucky in the series. However, we want nothing to do with a Louisville team that is 1-10 ATS, off several blowout losses and are playing with an interim coach. Pass.

CLEMSON 41 South Carolina 17. This is tied for the largest spread in series history. Both teams come in off blowout wins. In fact, Clemson has won their last 6 games by 42 ppg and has won the last 4 series meetings by 24 ppg. Meanwhile, the Gamecocks have been a good dog as of late going 9-3 ATS the last 12 in that role. The Tigers do have the ACC Championship game on deck. Slight lean on the dog. MICHIGAN ST 31 Rutgers 6. Can you really trust a Michigan St offense that is averaging just 20 ppg to cover this big of a number. Especially considering the total is only 37! Note that while Rutgers is 1-10 SU this season, the Scarlet Knights have covered 4 straight games and are also playing well on the defensive side. However, their offense has been atrocious and last week Rutgers QB's were a combined 5 of 16 for 46 yards and 2 INT's.

Georgia Southern 33 GEORGIA ST 24. Last week, Georgia Southern had 19-11 first down and 442-189 yard edges including 409-74 on the ground in their win over Coastal Carolina. Meanwhile, Georgia St was hammered at Appalachian St and have now lost 6 straight games. Georgia St has actually won 3 straight meetings in this rivalry and we'll back them catching "doubles" at home.

FIU 24 Marshall 23. If FIU wins this game, they head to the CUSA Championship game next week. However, all the early week money has come in on Marshall here. Last week, the Thundering Herd Marshall dominated UTSA with 22-10 first down and 505-137 yard edges. The Herd defense limited UTSA to -26 yards rushing, a school record for fewest yards allowed. Marshall QB Isaiah Green was only 19 of 36 but threw for a career-high 387 yards. Meanwhile FIU beat Charlotte 42-35. However, Charlotte had 28-21 first down and 534-490 yard edges but were -2 in TO's including a fumble that was returned 61 yards for a TD. We lean with the home dog. BOSTON COLLEGE 31 Syracuse 24. Obviously, we were wrong on these pages last week with our Syracuse recommendation as they were crushed by Notre Dame. Syracuse QB Eric Dungey was KO'd from the game early and backup Tommy DeVito was just 14 of 31 for 105 yards and 2 INT's. Meanwhile, BC lost outright at Florida St as they gave up a long TD pass late. BC QB Anthony Brown returned from injury and was 18 of 36 for 297 yards but only had a 1-2 ratio. BC RB Dillon ran a season-high 37 times for 116 yards. Dillon is the first BC rusher to have back-to-back 1,000-yard seasons in the 120-year history of the program. Until Dungey's status clears, we're passing.

2★ OHIO ST 27 Michigan 26. The Game. Winner goes to the Big Ten Championship game. Obviously, the Buckeyes have owned the rivalry as of late as they are 13-1 SU the last 14 years. However, Ohio State is a 4.5-point home underdog here. It's the first time the Buckeyes have been an underdog in any game since the National Championship vs Oregon 52 games ago! It's also the first time Urban Meyer has been an underdog at home since 2003 when he was at Utah. Note that Ohio St is on a 14-2 ATS run as an underdog and are a perfect 6-0 SU/ATS in that role under Meyer. Michigan is the superior team especially on defense but the Buckeyes have the better offense (688 yards last week). We'd be kicking ourselves if we didn't take the Buckeyes in this unique role and they were more than a TD favorite in the summer "Game of Year" lines.

NORTHWESTERN 34 Illinois 17. Obviously, we weren't the only ones fading Northwestern last week as the Gophers were actually favored by a FG on game day. That was a joke, Northwestern head coach Pat Fitzgerald said, adding: "The level of respect for the guys in that locker room is not very high because of a couple games earlier in the year." On the other side, Illinois was run over by lowa last week 63-0. It tied the largest margin of defeat in Illinois history, matching a 63-0 loss to the University of Chicago in 1906. Note that Northwestern does have the Big Ten Championship game on deck and the underdog in Northwestern games is on a 11-0-1 ATS run. We lean with the UNDER here.

GEORGIA 37 Georgia Tech 20. Is UGA looking ahead to Alabama next week?

**GEORGIA 37 Georgia Tech 20.** Is UGA looking ahead to Alabama next week? Keep in mind, UGA still needs to win out to get to the playoff. Meanwhile Georgia Tech is off a phony OT win last week vs UVA (see page 1). Still you have to give credit to Paul Johnson for turning the season around after a poor start. While the visitor is on a 17-2-1 ATS run in series, 21 of Georgia's last 23 wins have come by 14 points or more including all 10 this year. We lean UNDER. **DUKE 34 Wake Forest 24.** Wake Forest needs a win to get to bowl eligibility.

**DUKE 34 Wake Forest 24.** Wake Forest needs a win to get to bowl eligibility. Last week the Demon Deacons actually led Pitt 10-6 at halftime but were run over in the second half. Last week Wisconsin had a 545-462 yard edge including 385-76 on the ground in their come-from-behind 3OT win at Purdue. The Boilers actually led 27-13 with under 10 minutes left and according to ESPN's win probability had a 96% chance of winning. Wisconsin RB Taylor ran for 321 yards and 3 TD's. On the other side, we dropped a 3★ on these pages with Minnesota last week. The yards were pretty close as Minnesota had a 18-16 first down edge but Northwestern had a 325-306 yard edge. Minnesota was -3 in TO's. This line is way too cheap. We like Wisconsin and the UNDER.

NC State 33 NORTH CAROLINA 27. The Wolf Pack come in off a blowout win

NC State 33 NORTH CAROLINA 27. The Wolf Pack come in off a blowout win over Louisville last week. NC State had 29-19 first down and 518-411 yard edge edges but were +2 in TO's. The Wolf Pack outscored the Cardinals 35-7 in the second half. Meanwhile, NC got only their 2nd win of the season as they beat FCS Western Carolina. NC had a 654-433 yard edge including 296-133 on the ground. The dog has gone 15-5 ATS in the series but we don't see a lot of value.

LOUISIANA TECH 31 Western Kentucky 17. Last week WKU crushed UTEP 40-16. WKU had 22-11 first down and 422-392 yard edges but also picked off UTEP 5 times in the first half that led to 31 WKU points as the Hilltoppers actually led 40-0 at halftime. Meanwhile, LT had 20-19 first down and 311-280 yard edges in a 1-point loss at Southern Miss. We lean with the home team.

Old Dominion 34 RICE 26. Last week Old Dominion crushed FCS VMI 77-14. ODU had 32-15 first down and 509-288 yard edges including 339-72 on the ground. ODU scored two non-offensive TD's. On the other side, Rice covered at LSU in a 42-10 loss. LSU had 31-15 first down and 552-198 yard edges. Rice got a late TD with under 3 migrates left to one of 55 yard drige.

with under 3 minutes left to cap a 75-yard drive. We're passing.

Southern Miss 31 UTEP 17. Southern Miss can clinch bowl eligibility with a win here. Last week they got a 1-point win at home vs Louisiana Tech. LT actually had 20-19 first down and 311-280 yard edges. However, Southern Miss scored the game-winning TD with 6:02 left. Meanwhile, UTEP actually trailed WKU 40-0 at halftime last week. UTEP QB Kai Locksley was just 1 of 9 for 2 yards and had 3 INT's before getting pulled. We're leaning OVER.

**LIBERTY 40 New Mexico St 31.** We get the super rare regular season rematch here as New Mexico St beat Liberty 49-41 as 3.5-point underdogs back on October 6. Both teams come in off blowout losses. New Mexico St lost 45-14 at BYU (-3 TO's) while Liberty was shut out by Auburn (-4 TO's). Liberty gets revenge here but we don't see too much value on the side. We lean UNDER.

BOISE ST 34 Utah St 30. The winner goes to the Mountain West Championship game. Boise St comes in with extra time to prep after playing on Friday last week. The Broncos dominated New Mexico with 30-15 first down and 449-262 yard edges. Meanwhile, 29-point favorite Utah State only beat Colorado St 29-24. Colorado St had 29-16 first down and 506-310 yard edges and the Rams held the ball for 42:05! Utah St got a 95-yard interception return TD (14-point swing) and a 32-yard interception return TD. Utah St also got a 33-yard TD pass with :43 left but Colorado St scored on the final play of the game only to get it called back on penalty. Since 1999, Boise St is 120-8 SU at home. Nuff said.

UTAH 27 Byu 17. Utah has beat rival BYU 7 straight times in the "Holy War" but 6 of those have come by 7 points or less. The Utes do have their first ever appearance in the Pac-12 Championship game on deck. BYU comes in off a blowout win over New Mexico St. BYU had 25-20 first down and 510-312 yard edges including 317-48 on the ground. Meanwhile, Utah out-scored Colorado 23-0 in the second half last week. Utah had 19-14 first down and 390-196 yard edges including 169-34 on the ground. Slightest of leans on the Cougars here.

APPALACHIAN ST 30 Troy 21. The winner of this one goes to the first ever Sun Belt Championship game. Appalachian St is off a 28-point win over Georgia St. The Mountaineers had 25-15 first down and 524-329 yard edges. QB Zac Thomas was 20 of 24 for 282 yards and 3 TD's. Meanwhile, Troy was +6 TO's vs Texas St last week and still only won 12-7 as 22.5-point favorites! Texas St had a 284-220 yard edge. Troy is on a 8-0-1 ATS run as a road underdog and that's where we are leaning. Wyoming 27 NEW MEXICO 21. Wyoming needs a win to get to bowl eligibility. Last week, they actually trailed Air Force 27-14 late 3Q. Wyoming lost its top two offensive players in early in the game. QB Chambers is out for this one while RB Nico Evans is questionable. QB Vander Waal came off the bench and tossed 2 TD passes, including the go-ahead score on a 22-yard strike with 1:09 left in the game. On the other side, this could be New Mexico head coach Bob Davie's final game. Last week, the Lobos were drilled at home to Boise St. We don't see too much value here with the Wyoming injuries.

MIDDLE TENNESSEE 26 Uab 25. UAB has already clinched a berth in the CUSA Championship game next week. Meanwhile, Middle Tennessee needs a win and an FIU loss to get there (they will know their fate as FIU game is a Noon start). Both teams are off misleading losses last week to SEC teams. Middle Tennessee lost 34-23 at Kentucky. However, MT had 24-15 first down and 392-324 yard edges. MT had 2 early TO's that were converted into 2 Kentucky TD's including a 66-yard interception return. Texas A&M beat UAB 41-20. However, UAB had 3 TO's including a fumble on the opening kickoff that was returned for a TD. UAB also missed 3 FG's. We're taking the home team here who has more to play for.

**CALIFORNIA 28 Colorado 17.** After a 5-0 start to the season, Colorado has lost 6 straight games and fired head coach Mike MacIntyre. Last week the Buffs were actually tied with Utah 7-7 at halftime but were out-scored 23-0 in the second half. Meanwhile, California is off an unscheduled bye last week as their game against rival Stanford was post-poned due to the wild fires. We lean OVER.

2★ Stanford 34 UCLA 23. We like Stanford here. The Cardinal got an unexpected bye last week with the postponed Cal game That allows two of their best players WR JJ Arcega-Whiteside and RB Bryce Love to be as healthy as they've been in weeks for this game. Meanwhile, UCLA is off a huge win over arch rival USC last week. Is there a let down for the Bruins here? Note that Stanford has owned the series with a 10-0 SU/9-1 ATS run. Make it 11-0 with 10 covers.

VANDERBILT 27 Tennessee 24. The winner gets to bowl eligibility. Last week Vanderbilt got a misleading OT win over Ole Miss as the Rebels had 28-21 first down and 578-387 yard edges including 457-191 through the air. On the other side, Missouri dominated Tennessee with 29-11 first down and 484-255 yard edges but it was a 13-10 game late in the 2Q. Tennessee QB Jarrett Guarantano was KO'd early and Keller Chryst was just 7 of 19 for 173 yards and an 0-2 ratio. Until Guarantano's injury situation clears, we're passing.

Oklahoma St 28 TCU 24. Last week, TCU was down to its third string QB and last scholarship RB but took advantage of 3 Baylor TO's in a 16-9 win. "That was a gutsy win, Patterson said. "Want to know what kind of heart and what this program is about, you just need to watch that ball game. There wasn't any reason why we should have won." The Frogs have had at least 36 players miss much or all of the season and that is a major reason why they are 5-6 needing a win here to get to a bowl. Meanwhile, Oklahoma St rallied to beat West Virginia 45-41. Oklahoma St had 35-25 first down and 604-553 yard edges and won despite being -3 in TO's. We're leaning with the UNDER as we question TCU's ability to score.

Florida 27 FLORIDA ST 21. The early money has come in on Florida here. The Gators have a match-up advantage with their pressure defense vs FSU OL that is bottom 5 in the country in TFL's allowed. Florida St is in jeopardy of missing out on a bowl game for first time since 1981. The Noles were fortunate to win last week vs Boston College as they got a long TD pass with under 2 minutes left. Florida St has gone 5-0 SU/4-1 ATS in series but find themselves a dog to Florida for first time since 2009. Pass on the side, lean with the UNDER which has gone 9-3 in the team's last 12 meetings.

PENN ST 34 Maryland 21. While Maryland needs a win to get to a bowl, how do they pick themselves back up after that heart-breaking loss to Ohio St in OT last week? Ohio St had 36-18 first down and 688-535 yard edges but had 3 TO's in that one. Meanwhile, Penn St failed to cover vs lowly Rutgers last week. Penn St had 19-17 first down and 322-234 yard edges and Penn St QB Trace McSorley was only 17 of 37 for 183 yards. The win was No. 30 for McSorley as a starter, moving him into the top spot in school history ahead of Todd Blackledge (1980-82) and Tony Sacca (1988-91). Slight lean on the OVER here.

† Texas Tech 35 Baylor 28. @AT&T Stadium in Arlington, TX. Both teams need a win to get to a bowl game. The Red Raiders had been averaging 383 yards passing per game, second-best nationally, but were shut down by Kansas St last week. On the other side, Baylor had a 20-14 first down edge vs TCU but were done in by a -3 TO margin. TCU scored 9 points off those TO's and that was the difference. We don't see too much value here

FRESNO ST 43 San Jose St 13. Fresno St has the Mountain West Championship game on deck so we're not sure you want to be laying the wood here. The Bulldogs have failed to cover in each of their last two games. Last week Fresno St did have a 17-8 first down edge and a 390-282 yard edge in a 23-14 win over San Diego St. Meanwhile, San Jose State covered at home vs Nevada in a 21-12 loss. However, Nevada had 24-11 first down and 463-200 yard edges including 149-30 on the ground. We lean with the OVER here.

IOWA ST 28 Kansas St 15. Kansas St needs a win to get to a bowl and this could be Hall of Fame head coach Bill Snyder's last regular season game. Last week Kansas St dominated Texas Tech with 22-11 first down and 367-181 yard edges including 154-31 on the ground. On the other side, Iowa St was out-classed at Texas last week which ended the Cyclones Big 12 Championship hopes. Texas had 20-12 first down and 405-210 yard edges. Lean OVER.

TEXAS A&M 24 Lsu 21. LSU is on a 7-0 SU/ATS series run vs Texas A&M. However, A&M has covered 7 straight home games. We feel Texas A&M is one of the most underrated teams in the country as far as the National Media goes. They are unranked in the AP Poll but yet find themselves a 3-point home favorite over the No. 8 Tigers. Vegas is spot on here. Remember, the Aggies have 4 losses this year and two are to the Top 2 teams in the country (Bama and Clemson). While A&M was fortunate to cover last week vs UAB, A&M did have a 8.2-5.5 yards per play advantage. We lean with the UNDER.

Purdue 31 INDIANA 28. Old Oaken Bucket and a bowl bid is on the line here. Is the Jeff Brohm to Louisville talk distracting the Boilers? Sure seems that way as Purdue has lost back-to-back games outright as a favorite. Last week, Purdue led Wisconsin 27-13 with under 10 minutes left and according to ESPN's win probability had a 96% chance of winning. However, they would end up losing in OT. Purdue QB David Blough was 31 of 48 for 386 yards and 4 TD's. Meanwhile, Indiana easily covered at Michigan last week but note Michigan settled for 6 short FG's (all less than 35-yards). We're leaning UNDER.

TULANE 30 Navy 24. Tulane needs a win to get to bowl eligibility. Remember they came up one-yard short on the final play of the game vs SMU in the finale last year of getting to a bowl. The Green Wave do have a couple extra days to prep for the option as they were crushed at Houston last Thursday. Meanwhile, Navy had a 389-164 rushing yard edge as they broke their 7-game losing streak in a win over Tulsa. We're passing

UL-Lafayette 35 UL-MONROE 34. The visitor is on a 12-1-1 ATS run in the series. ULL needs a win to get to the Sun Belt Championship game while ULM needs a win and an Arkansas St loss. Last week ULM lost to Arkansas St 31-17. Meanwhile, ULL got a 10-point win over South Alabama. Do note that South Alabama had 27-17 first down and 477-407 yard edges but had 3 TO's. We like the dog here.

3★ Smu 34 TULSA 24. We love the situation here for SMU. The Ponies, at 5-6 have everything to play for as they need a win to get to bowl eligibility. SMU has played a tough schedule this year and all of their losses are to solid teams (North Texas, TCU, Michigan, UCF, Cincy and Memphis). Tulsa, meanwhile is not a solid team as the Golden Hurricane are on a 1-15 SU run vs FBS opponents and their only win is against UConn, the worst team in the FBS this season

It was an even game as North Texas had 25-20 first down and 511-489 yard edges. North Texas did lead 17-0 early before FAU went on a 24-3 run. Meanwhile, Charlotte lost to FIU 42-34. However, Charlotte had 28-21 first down and 534-490 yard edges but were -2 in TO's including a fumble that was returned 61 yards for a TD. The 49ers then decided to fire coach Brad Lambert. FAU can name the score here.

Arkansas St 34 TEXAS ST 20. Arkansas St needs a win here and a UL-Lafayette loss to get to the Sun Belt Championship game. Last week, the Red Wolves got a 14-point win over ULM. Meanwhile, Texas St -6 TO's vs Troy and still only lost 12-7 as 22.5-point underdogs! Texas St had a 284-220 yard edge but QB Tyler Vitt was 9 of 23 for 155 yards and 5 INT's. Last week they got shutout 23-0 at Marshall (but UTSA did cover). Marshall dominated with 22-10 first down and 505-137 yard edges and the Herd defense limited UTSA to -26 yards rushing. On the other side, North Texas got a big win over FAU. It was an even game as North Texas had 25-20 first down and 511-489 yard edges. North Texas did lead 17-0 early before FAU went on a 24-3 run. NT RB DeAndre Torrey ran for 184 yards including a game-clinching 92-yard TD run. We're passing.

Notre Dame 34 USC 20. The motivation is simple for unbeaten Notre Dame. Win this one and the Fighting Irish are in the college football playoff. Meanwhile, USC is trying to avoid their worst season since 2000. Last week the Irish crushed us on these pages in their 36-3 win over Syracuse. ND's defense held the Cuse to just 234 yards and the Cuse got a field goal with :10 left to prevent shutout. On the other side, USC blew another second half lead, this time to cross-town rival UCLA. Now head coach Clay Helton is clearly on the hot seat and quite simply Helton is overmatched vs good competition. The Trojans are just 1-12 ATS in the underdog role and note that this is the largest home underdog role for USC since 1997

ALABAMA 38 Auburn 13. Alabama should be motivated here as they have revenge from last year's loss to Auburn. They also should be focused off that bad performance last week vs Citadel which saw the Tide tied 10-10 at halftime (Bama was a 42-point first half favorite!!!). Usually Alabama head coach Saban has taken the air out of the ball in these match-ups but now he has best offense since he's been here and they are capable of covering a huge number. Roll Tide!

They are basically a power-rating number difference between the two teams that also takes into consideration the home field advantage.

Of the 11 games where our computer is off more than 3 points compared to the Vegas line (highlighted), our favorite team this week to back would be Ohio St +4.5

The Comp column is the computer projected line and the Diff column is the difference between the Vegas line and the Computer line. "+" numbers in the difference column say back the underdog. "-" numbers in the difference column say back the favorite. Let us know if you have questions.

Note that Cincinnati has recently hired Hue Jackson and there will be some bad blood between these two in-state rivals. Cincinnati is on a 7-0 SU/ATS run vs Cleveland with an

average win by 21 ppg. **New England 28 N.Y. JETS 20.** Both teams come in off a bye after suffering blowout losses as TD favorites. The Pats have been rather pedestrian on the road this year suffering blowout losses to Jacksonville, Detroit and Tennessee (none of them world-beaters) and then got lucky covers vs Chicago and Buffalo thanks to several non-offensive TD's. However it's tough trusting a Jets team that has failed to cover in 4 straight and has QB issues as Sam Darnold is questionable.

2★ CAROLINA 28 Seattle 21. Seattle has extra time to prep off the Thursday Night win over Green Bay. Meanwhile, Carolina comes in off back-to-back losses but the Panthers have been much better at home this year (5-0 SU/4-1 ATS) as compared to the road (1-4 SU/ATS). The Panthers offense only averages 20 ppg on the road but that number jumps up to 32 ppg at home. More of the same here and this is also a dreaded 10am PT start for a West Coast team with a long travel spot.

INDIANAPOLIS 28 Miami 21. Sunday Night Owl customers got the Dolphins at +9 in this game as we anticipated a possible return of Miami QB Ryan Tannehill. Now the line is +7.5 and there has been clear value lost. The Dolphins come in fresh off a bye while the Colts are feeling great about themselves after 4 straight wins for the first time in 4 years. QB Andrew Luck hasn't been sacked in 5 straight games (a 27-year high in the NFL) and probably won't this week vs a Miami defense No. 29 in sack rate this year. Slightest of leans on the Dolphins.

L.A. CHARGERS 27 Arizona 17. Both teams lost in the final seconds last week as decent-sized favorites. Arizona rookie QB Josh Rosen does return to L.A. where played at UCLA. He will be up against it here as Chargers DE Joey Bosa returned last week. However, outside of the Denver game, the Cardinals defense has been playing well as of late and a couple weeks ago held the KC offense in check. Lean Cardinals

2★ DENVER 24 Pittsburgh 23. This is a really tough spot for the Steelers who are on back-to-back long road trips. Last week Pittsburgh got an emotional win over Jacksonville rallying from a 16-0 deficit to win on a Roethlisberger TD in the final seconds. That's now 6 straight wins for the Steelers with a 5-1 ATS run. Meanwhile, the Broncos are off a last-second win over the Chargers last week. Does that turn their season around? We think so at least for this week.

MINNESOTA 26 Green Bay 22. These two played to a 29-29 tie in earlier meeting as Minnesota kicker Carlson missed a chip-shot FG late. Obviously the Vikings disappointed greatly on these pages last week as they were clearly out-played by the Bears on SNF. Kirk Cousins looked rattled by the Chicago pass rush. Meanwhile, dating back to last season Green Bay has lost 7 straight games on the road going 1-5-1 ATS. Last week the Pack blew a double-digit lead in Seattle on Thursday Night. Minnesota has one of the best home-field advantages in the entire NFL.

HOUSTON 23 Tennessee 17. Last week the Titans were crushed at Indianapolis as QB Marcus Mariota left the game in the first half due to an elbow injury. Also note that Titans DC Dean Pees has been in the hospital this week. On the other side, the Texans have now won 7 straight games but are one of the luckiest teams in the NFL as they have won 5 "coin flip" games in that win streak including last week's 2-point win at Washington. Still they are the first 0-3 team to win their next 7 since 1925. We're passing until Mariota's status clears.
