President's Byline :EARLY VOTING STARTS MONDAY, OCTOBER 24, 2016!!!



I cannot begin to express the urgency of voting early this year. Since voters, at least for now, do not have to show a picture voter id, you want to be sure that no one votes "for" you. If you should go to the polls and are told that you have already voted, you will be allowed to vote provisionally and your vote will count, but unfortunately so will the vote of who ever used your identity to vote in the first place. We have contested races here in Collin County as well as statewide and we need to make sure that we do not give up one single seat to the Democrats.

The easiest way to ensure a Republican victory is to **vote a straight Republican ticket** and urge your friends, neighbors and family to do the same. We all

have people who ask us who to vote for and they in turn will pass that information on to other voters. According to Bruce Sherbet, Collin County Elections Administrator, voter registration is up 26% since 2008 with a swell of 19,919 voters registered just under the October 11th deadline. 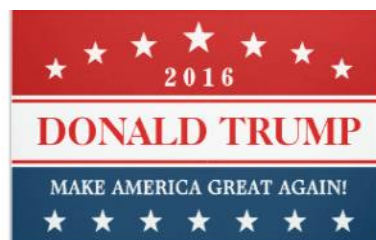
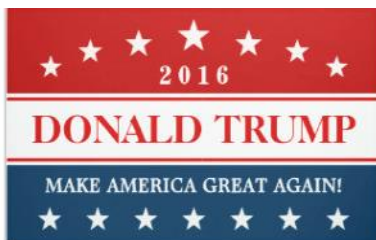

Because, unlike HRC, he has actually held a job, worked hard, and achieved success.

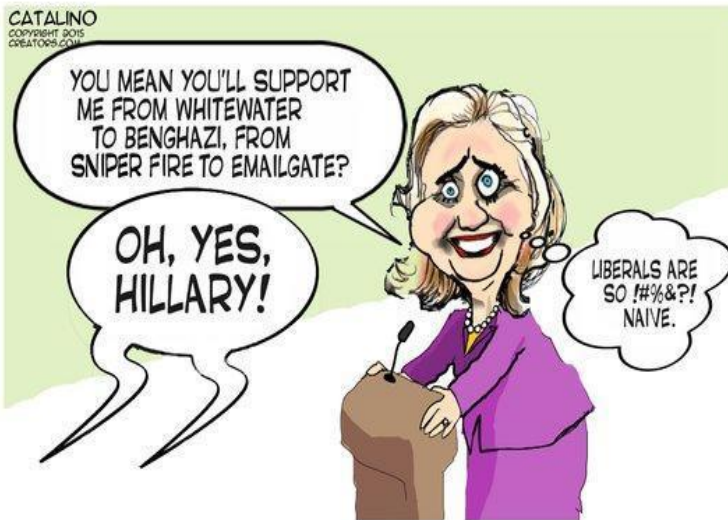
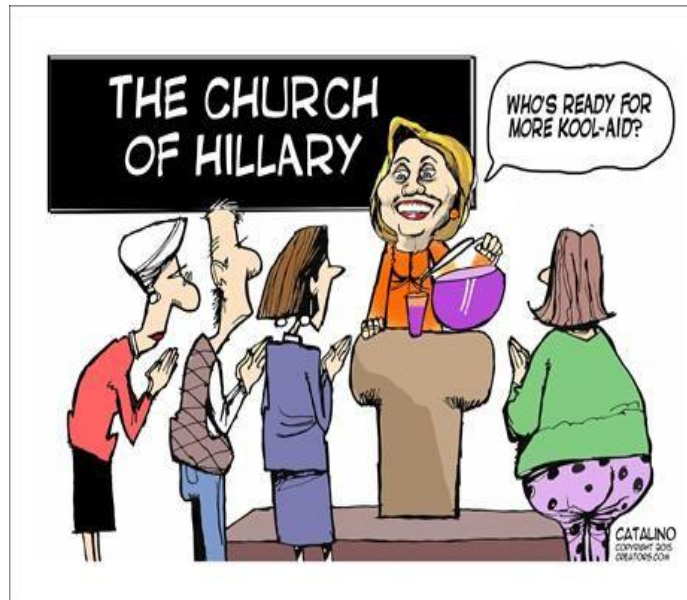
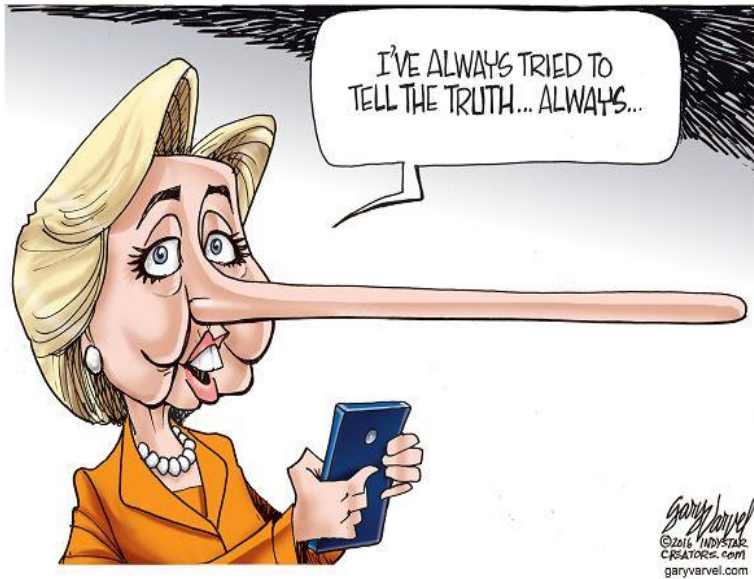
