President's Byline : EARLY VOTING STARTS MONDAY, OCTOBER 24, 2016!!!



I cannot begin to express the urgency of voting early this year. Since voters, at least for now, do not have to show a picture voter id, you want to be sure that no one votes 'for" you. If you should go to the polls and are told that you have already voted, you will be allowed to vote provisionally and your vote will count, but unfortunately so will the vote of who ever used your identity to vote in the first place.
