Are You Ready:

We are getting ready to head into spring, which traditionally can have bad storms. Following are some suggestions to make sure you and your family are ready for any emergency.

Register your cell phone with LEAN (Lexington's Emergency Alerts and Notifications). This

- service provides automated community notification during emergency events. http://www.lexingtonky.gov/index.aspx?page=25
- ❖ Be Aware each home should have a working NOAA all-hazards weather radio and batteries. The primary emergency notification system radio station in Central KY is WUKY-FM (91.3); other stations may also provide information in an emergency situation.
- Get a Kit Does your family have an emergency kit? Every kit should include food and water for 3 days, a first aid kit, flash lights and a battery operated radio. Please see the following link for more suggestions for your emergency kit. http://www.lexingtonky.gov/index.aspx?page=74
- Make a Plan Discuss, agree and document an emergency plan with family members. Designate an out-of-town relative or friend as an emergency contact. During an emergency, long distance calls can be easier to make than local calls.
- ICE (In Case of Emergency) Program your emergency contact phone number in your cell phone's contact list under ICE. Police, fire and other first responders will look for an ICE number on a person's cell phone if the person is unresponsive or unable to talk.

<u>Contact information for Officers and Board Members:</u> Please always feel free to contact a board member or officer when you have a question or concern. The board and officers will do their best to resolve any issues or answer questions that are brought directly to their attention. It is hard to know how to handle situations that we hear about indirectly. Please remember that your board members and officers are volunteers who give freely of their time to help keep our neighborhood a wonderful place to live. We need your input and your support.
