Christian Education Committee: The Children's Christmas program will be on December 11 during the worship service. Confirmation will begin on October 5 with six students. Sunday School teachers are needed.

Discussion was held regarding church carpeting with emergent issues being addressed first. The 'no parking' signs in the parking lot will be replaced. Bruce Steele will form several focus groups to see what the congregation's feelings are regarding music selection, AV options, piano/ organ/keyboard, etc.

Several of the proposed amendments to the constitution that will be voted on at the Presbytery meeting in October were discussed. Session members shared their opinions on the issues.


