Pastor's Corner

I stumbled across something I read exactly one year ago (9/1/2023). It's a quote that I think goes well with the current sermon series and Christ's sobering letters to his Church. But I'm going to take the liberty to change it just slightly (the redacted parts have been struck through):

This is My Christ's Church

It is composed of people like me ... It will be friendly if I am ... It will do a great work if I work ... It will be filled with the Spirit if I keep on being filled with the Spirit ... It will make generous gifts to many causes if I am generous ... It will bring others into fellowship if I bring them ... Its seats will be filled if I fill them ... It will be a church of loyalty and love, of faith and service if I, one member among many in the Body, am filled with these. Therefore, with God's help, I dedicate myself to the task of being all these things I want the church to be. *Old Union Reminder*

I imagine everyone who reads this newsletter wants Puckety Church to be a healthy and vibrant congregation, a place where worship inspires, where God's word is heard, where we honor God, grow in faith, and improve our community by being the heart, voice, and hands of God making a lasting difference in the world (sound familiar? How have you been using the parts of our logo lately in your prayer and work?)

I also imagine that anyone reading (or better, *listening*) to Christ's words to the 7 churches of Revelation (chs. 2 & 3) - as a way to hold up a mirror and take a good at

ourselves – that we will be convicted and moved to respond in faith, love and obedience. Thank God we can do this from a place of grace – in a community in which the love we receive is a reminder of God's love for us. We were reminded of this powerfully just recently with the Baptism of Clint and Marti Motosicky's daughter, Clare! What a blessing! But of course, baptism is the starting point, not an end in itself. It's initiation into the greater Body of Christ, where "we're all in this together." As we face the fall season (and all the activities and events and programs that go with it), what will it take for Puckety to be obedient to the Alpha and the Omega, to the One with the doubleedged sword proceeding from his mouth, the One who stands alive forever in the midst of his Church? What will it take for "the Church in the region of Redstone" to be transformed and move toward that future? It will take all of us committing ourselves to a *growing faith and a life of discipleship* (practically this takes shape in weekly gatherings like Small Groups – it's a great time to join right now – you're welcome in our Wed. one starting on 9/25 – just let It will take everyone being willing to serve in some capacity, using the gifts God has given you. It will include each person having a passion for God (the "burn" of remembering our First Love), and compassion for the people God loves. I could add a couple other things here, but I imagine most of you know what "the Pastor is going to say." If you're tired of me talking, that's okay, just listen to the living Word himself in Revelation chs. 2 & 3. I trust the Spirit to encourage you with the words of commendation that are true about our congregation, and I trust the same Spirit to convict us in the places where we have departed from Christ's way. Just remember, when it comes from our Savior, it all has grace behind it to restore us. This isn't just "your" church; it is CHRIST'S Church. Will we dedicate ourselves to this vision? Jesus is with us; why would we want to say "No"? For all God's promises in Christ are "Yes" and "Amen" (2 Corinthians 1:18-21).



From the Hearts & Hands of Session

As part of our mission to *personally* and *collectively* "Improve our community and world," we want to encourage all our members to please join the members of the Outreach Team in very particular ways this year:

*Burrell School District Partnership

- We hope to start "Homework Helpers" again in October with students from National Honor Society and/or Interact Club doing the "tutoring" but we need volunteers to help host and monitor the gatherings (goal of one day a week) contact Matt Wehrle for info and to sign up.
- Weekend Food Project "Meals for Children" we're going to need LOT of help with this one we've been told by BSD that approximately 75 to 90 students have food insecurity / need food assistance for the weekends. A few of our leaders are reaching out to other churches to try and make a viable inter-church partnership, but we need "helping hands" volunteers and support to do things like: purchase/pick up food ... deliver to the church ... help prepare food kits. Our goal is to do this once a week from late October through May, but we need your help. Again, contact Matt Wehrle or Pastor Brian.

*MUST Special Collection – The Session has decided that *in lieu* of the (PCUSA) *Peace* & *Global Witness Offering*, we will *instead* use the opportunity again to take up a special collection for our missionary partners who work with the Myanmar Undergraduate School of Theology, to help not only with the school, but also with the orphans, food needs, and bills associated with facility improvement. For the Sundays of Sept. 22nd, 29th, and Oct. 6th, you can use the envelopes for the Global Witness offering which will be in the pews, but please NOTE that instead of the denominational use, it will be fully designated for our global partnership with MUST. The final collection and dedication will be on World Communion Sunday – October 6th – during worship. Thank you for your generosity to this cause.

A Devotional For You Read 1 Corinthians 6:12-13 [Important to realize Paul is quoting his readers as saying, "Everything is permissible for me" – he's responding to that claim. Also read 1 Corinthians 10:6-7, 11-14 Some of you may know I have mixed feelings on "AI" (artificial intelligence). At the risk of sounding like a Luddite (hey if I'm not going to be technologically savvy, I may as well have a decent vocabulary right?), let's just say I have concerns. Don't worry, I'm not one of the full-blown sci-fi conspiracy people who think a T-1000 is right around the corner (there are more realistic AI sci-fi films 2). But it's also not a simple matter of worrying about the amount of plagiarism, fake internet content, and general decrease in personal work ethic. There's something more we're losing in my opinion, and we're trying to replace it with something else. Guess what? That comes very close to the biblical definition of idolatry. Let me share an excerpt - I believe I meant to include this before. The following (in part) includes a piece by a colleague pastor, Rev. Pete Goetschius (Poke Run Church): "For many people in our time, God may or may not exist, but it doesn't matter because 'I can and will do what I want' – or – 'my judgment and value system is supreme.' This is, to put it bluntly, why soccer is more important than a Sunday morning worship service. Soccer (or social media, AI generation, etc.) gives my life a kind of temporary meaning and is fun while we feel that God has nothing to say to us, or far worse, demands obedience from us. Now that we have reached this point in time, we hear what was warned by Karl Barth 100 yrs. ago "...the word may come 'God may just be an empty formula.' (Karl Barth, Church Dogmatics, 3.2 p.567). Barth, prophetically, writing in war torn Europe, saw this time coming."

Quick summary: We live in crazy times. We think we can get along without God which is even crazier. This leaves us too often living a life without meaning, or little meaning. We have forgotten, if we ever knew, only God gives life meaning. How do we, who have heard God speak to us, who have come to faith and union with Christ by the Holy Spirit, speak to those who cannot hear the Divine voice? Here is a way forward: following Jesus as he winds his way through another time, a time very different than ours but with the same challenges. In Jesus' time people isolated themselves from God, perhaps by the rigidity of Israelite Law or the pagan idolatry of the surrounding culture. These are people suffering the very same symptoms as people today: illness, emotional wounds, isolation, rejection, poverty, hunger and the like. Their religion gives them little relief and the political powers of the time exploit them. Jesus goes about His life touching here, healing there, sharing mealtimes with all sorts of good and not so good people. Jesus was for the world of His time. And the opening of the book of Revelation (see current sermon series on our FB page) shows that Jesus stands amidst his Church of THIS time. And, if you will take note, he demonstrates who he is, the Son of God, God's Messiah. We are called to do the same with the lampstand we have been given (Revelation 2:3-5). So let your light so shine – don't expect a technologically advanced program to do it for you - don't hide it "under a bushel." Let Christ's light be seen for what it is. Amen. - Pastor Brian



This is a message from your Upkeep Team. We would like to first thank the congregation members, friends of Puckety and the various groups that have contributed to the Capital Fundraising Campaign. Thanks to your efforts we are able to make the newest announcement update. The first phase was the parking lot and driveways that was completed in June. The second phase of the capital improvement projects is now done. The new roof installation is complete. You now can gaze at the new metal roof that has a color name of Old Town Gray which is an exact color match with the roof of our manse.

The old shingle roof was very problematic to say the least. It needed frequent repairs and its reliability was in question. It was 25 years old. We are hoping the metal roof will give us even longer reliable service. The installation took three days and required a crew of seven very talented young men from Andrew's Construction Company in Dubois. They were able to successfully undertake a challenging and dangerous job without a hiccup. The workers were blessed with sunny skies and unusual cool temperatures for mid-August. Every member of the Upkeep team was on site at sometime during the project to help monitor and provide guidance and insight. Their knowledge and experience were so valuable. They always would ask the right question and checked and rechecked every detail.

It has been a remarkable, exciting summer for Puckety Presbyterian Church. Who would call a new parking lot and driveways exciting? We at Puckety know who, your Upkeep Team. We hope the congregation is joining in the excitement as you drive in on the parking lot and gaze at the new church roof.

We now are happy to say and most thankful to God for the good fortune which he has provided us.
