But not before. One at a time, because we are living life one day at a time. We are NOT trying to look too far ahead, but instead letting Jesus light the path right in front of us.

We will actually have at least TWO Thanksgiving Days this year- we will celebrate with the boys and Joanne's mom on THE day. And then, on the 1st of December, almost all of my extended family (siblings, spouses, grandkids) will be here for a Thanksgiving/Christmas celebration. I pray you have an awesome Thanksgiving this year. I pray, whether it's on the actual day or some other day, that you get to spend time with people you love, breaking bread, sharing fellowship, sharing life. THAT'S what "Thanksgiving" means to me! God is good, all the time!

WHERE: In the Fellowship Café, next to the Sanctuary



Sunday, November 25, 2018 Diotrephes the Unwelcoming (3John 1:9-14)

What you DO reflects how you see God.

(Psalm 37:1-4, Galatians 3:26-29)


