*Texas kicker Cameron Dicker hit a 40-yard field with :09 left to give No. 19 Texas a 48-45 win over No. 7 Oklahoma. The Longhorns actually led the game by as many as 21 points in the fourth quarter before a furious rally by Oklahoma. It was the 6th straight cover by Texas in the series.*

## ATS Notables

Washington St is 6-0 ATS this year while Appalachian St, Georgia Southern and Utah St are all 5-0 ATS. On the other side, Wyoming, Wake Forest, Louisville, UL-Monroe, Florida Atlantic, Connecticut, Bowling Green and Arkansas St are all just 1-5 ATS this year.

Missouri, South Alabama, New Mexico, Toledo and Wake Forest have all seen the OVER go 5-0 in their games this year. Meanwhile the UNDER is 5-0 in North Texas games and 5-1 in Ball State games.

## Misleading Finals

**Georgia Southern crushed South Alabama 48-13** but the Eagles only had 18-17 first down and 394-326 yard edges. USA was -4 in TO's that led to 21 points.

**Missouri lost 37-35 at South Carolina** but the Tigers had 23-18 first down and 490-377 yard edges. Mizzou also had a 286-128 rush yard edge. The Tigers had 8 trips inside SC's 20-yard line but only 3 TD's.

**Stanford lost at home to Utah 40-21** but the Cardinal had 26-22 first down and 423-421 yard edges. The Cardinal were -4 in TO's including a 100-yard interception return TD.

**Fresno St beat Nevada 21-3** but Nevada had 21-12 first down and 327-271 yard edges. Nevada's starting QB Ty Gangi was out and the backup QB Cristian Solano was only 22 of 43 with 3 int's.

**Cal lost at Arizona 24-17** but the Bears had 25-13 first down and 476-265 yard edges. Cal had 4 TO's including not one, but two "Pick 6's" go against them.

**Rice fell at home to UTSA 20-3.** However, the Owls had a 222-178 yard edge but were -4 TO's. UTSA got 17 points off 38 yards of total offense after those TO's.

## Bad Beats From Last Week

**NC State (-6)** dominated Boston College for most of last Saturday. The Wolf Pac had 34-12 first down and 533-318 yard edges. NC State won with 4 TO's and actually led 28-3 late 3Q but Boston College got a blocked punt TD late in the game to get the back-door cover.

While we talk mostly college on these weekly recaps, arguably the worst bad beat of the weekend came in the pros. **Miami a 6-point underdog to Cincinnati** actually led 17-0 with under 20 minutes left. The Bengals would score the last 27 points of the game but two of their scores came via defensive touchdowns.

## Recapping Last Week's Best Bets

It was another winning week for our best bets on these pages (that's 5 in a row!) as they went 6-2. The Colleges went 4-1 including both 3★ selections winning. While some may have considered our Texas A&M -5.5 pick to be lucky because we covered in OT thanks to a TD. Please note, the Aggies were leading by 7 late 4Q, until Kentucky returned a fumble 40 yards for a TD to force OT. Also notable was our only college loser being on Wyoming who closed as a 3.5-point favorite. We gave the Cowboys out at +3.5! The Hawaii starting QB was a late scratch but a late TD got Hawaii the 4-point win. On the other side, the NFL continued their great start to the season with a 2-1 week. We're now 13-2 on the season in the NFL and remarkably now 120-76-3 (61%) all-time on these pages in the pros. Please remember gambling is a marathon, not a sprint. And while there's plenty of football left, we do find the last five weeks somewhat fitting considering we wrote dozens of full-season refund checks after the colleges had an 0-5 start to the season in week one. **Thursday, October 11th**

**TCU 34 Texas Tech 26.** Both teams come in off byes. TCU beat Iowa St in their last game 17-14 as they had a 299-198 yard edge but 3 TO's. Meanwhile, Texas Tech lost to West Virginia 42-34. Texas Tech had a 28-26 FD edge but also had 3 TO's. Both teams have banged up QB's here. We're passing.

**Georgia Southern 33 TEXAS ST 19.** Preparing for the option on a short week could be a daunting task for Texas St. Last week the Bobcats lost to UL-Lafayette 42-27 as ULL had a 557-425 yard edge including 327-124 on the ground. ULL led 28-0 at halftime and Texas St QB Tyler Vitt was 28 of 39 for 296 yards and 3 TD's. On the other side, Georgia Southern crushed South Alabama 48-13 but the Eagles only had 18-17 first down and 394-326 yard edges. USA was -4 in TO's that led to 21 points. That's the second week in a row Georgia Southern had a misleading final. That gives us some value on the home dog here.

**Friday, October 12th**

**South Florida 40 TULSA 30.** The Bulls are making their second straight long road trip. Last week USF beat UMass 58-42. The Minutemen did have a 29-18 first down edge but UMass had 5 TO's that led to 28 USF points. USF had a 365-85 rush yard edge led by USF RB Cronkite's 302 rushing yards and 3 TD's. On the other side, Tulsa lost at Houston 41-26 last Thursday but Tulsa actually led 26-17 with 13:00 left in the game. True frosh QB Seth Bonner made his 1st start (13-31-227-1-1). We lean with the road team and the OVER.

**UTAH 34 Arizona 21.** Both teams had misleading upset wins last week. Utah got a 40-21 upset win over Stanford but the Cardinal had 26-22 first down and 423-421 yard edges. The Cardinal were -4 in TO's including a 100-yard interception return TD. On the other side, Arizona beat Cal 24-17 but the Bears had 25-13 first down and 476-265 yard edges. Cal had 4 TO's including not one, but two "Pick 6's" go against them. We have a slight lean on the OVER.

**SAN DIEGO ST 30 Air Force 17.** Under head coach Rocky Long, San Diego St has defended the option well winning 7 straight over Air Force while also covering 7 of the last 8. Last week, the Aztes pulled the biggest upset of the week beating Boise St 19-13 as 2-TD underdogs. San Diego St won with only 9 first down's but had a 267-229 yard edge. Keep in mind, San Diego St was playing with a backup QB and backup RB. On the other side, Air Force dominated rival Navy 35-7. The Falcons had 17-9 first down and 399-178 yard edges and held Navy to 127 rushing yards. Slight lean on the home team here.

**Saturday, October 13th**

**BOSTON COLLEGE 38 Louisville 24.** Last week, BC was dominated by NC State. The Wolf Pack had 34-12 first down and 533-318 yard edges. NC State actually led 28-3 late 3Q but Boston College got a blocked punt TD late in the game to get the back-door cover. On the other side, Louisville has arguably been the biggest disappointment in CFB this season. We've downgraded no team further in our power ratings than the Cardinals (see page 6). Last week they lost 66-31 at home to Georgia Tech while allowing 542 rushing yards. It was their worst home loss in Cardinals Stadium (built in 1998). With BC All-American RB AJ Dillon still ?, we're passing.

**Miami, FL 27 VIRGINIA 23.** Miami actually trailed 28-14 last year at home to Virginia before scoring the game's final 30 points. This is a nice situational play as Virginia comes in off the bye while Miami is off a thrilling come-from-behind win over arch rival Florida St last week. UM had a 306-200 yard edge and QB Perry was 13 of 32 but threw 4 TD's. Lean on the home team here.

**Toledo 33 EASTERN MICHIGAN 31.** Toledo has won 11 straight series meetings over Eastern Michigan. Last week Toledo got their 9th straight win over arch rival Bowling Green 52-36. QB Eli Peters was 17 of 35 for 184 yards and 3 TD's filling in for an injured Guadagni who is ? here. On the other side, Eastern Michigan lost to rival Western Michigan 27-24, which was yet another close loss for the Eagles. We lean with the road team to make a dozen in a row here.

**Texas A&M 28 SOUTH CAROLINA 26.** Last week we cashed a 3★ on Texas A&M on these pages. While some may have considered our pick to be lucky because we covered in OT thanks to a TD. Please note, the Aggies were leading by 7 late 4Q, until Kentucky returned a fumble 40 yards for a TD to force OT. Also note A&M had 21-8 FD and 390-178 yard edges. The Aggies were -2 TO's, missed a FG, and were stopped on downs in UK territory. On the other side, South Carolina beat Missouri 37-35 but the Tigers had 23-18 first down and 490-377 yard edges. The Tigers had 8 trips inside SC's 20-yard line but only 3 TD's. QB Jake Bentley was out for SC while Michael Scarneccia was 20 of 35 for 249 and 3 TD's. It was a wild game with 5 lead changes and a FG with :02 left for SC. There was also a lengthy weather delay. We're passing.

**COASTAL CAROLINA 36 UL-Monroe 30.** Last week ULM was steam-rolled by Ole Miss 70-21. Remarkably, the War Hawks allowed 826 yards!!! Meanwhile, Coastal Carolina comes in fresh off a bye. We're passing.

**Purdue 35 ILLINOIS 26.** This is Purdue's largest away favorite role since 2007! The Boilers come in fresh off a bye. Meanwhile, Illinois got their 3rd win of the season last week 38-17 at Rutgers. The Illini broke their 13-game

conference losing streak in the process as they had a 330-119 rushing yard edge. QB AJ Bush came back from injury (missed 2 prior games) and added 118 rushing yards. Slight leans on the home team and the UNDER.

**CENTRAL MICHIGAN 27 Ball St 24.** Last week, Central Michigan lost to Buffalo 34-24 at home. Buffalo had a 434-346 yard edge including 307 on the ground. However, CMU had 4 TO's and while QB Tommy Lazzaro ran for 108 yards, he was only 9 of 23 for 117 yards with a 1-4 ratio. On the other side, we cashed a 2★ against Ball St on these pages last week. They trailed 14-0 early and their opponent Northern Illinois never looked back. Pass.

**3★ Duke 30 GEORGIA TECH 27.** Duke is in a nice spot here coming off a bye with extra time to prep for the option. The Blue Devils have excelled in defending the option under head coach David Cutcliffe as they are 8-1 ATS their last 9 games vs option teams including 4 straight covers in this series by an average of 16 ppg (3 outright wins as a dog)! They've already seen the option earlier this year in a 20-point win and cover over Army and their QB Jones should be healthier after the bye. Meanwhile, we're selling Georgia Tech high off back-to-back blowout wins over Bowling Green and Louisville with their offense topping 60-plus points in both games. The Blue Devils make it 5 straight covers in this series.

**MARYLAND 38 Rutgers 14.** This is Maryland's largest conference favorite role since 2003 when they were in the ACC! Rutgers is off a 38-17 loss at home to Illinois. The Scarlet Knights had a 24-17 FD edge but were out-rushed 330-119. They were also -3 in TO's. On the other side, Maryland was thumped at Michigan by 3 TD's. They get right here.

**Virginia Tech 31 NORTH CAROLINA 27.** The situation favors North Carolina here who comes in fresh off a bye with most of their players back from suspension. The Tar Heels had a misleading blowout loss to Miami, FL in their last game as they allowed 3 defensive TD's. Meanwhile, they are taking on a Virginia Tech team off a high-level effort game at home, at night vs Notre Dame last week. The Hokies only trailed 17-16 at halftime but were out-classed by the Irish in the second half. Slight lean on the home team.

**Western Kentucky 28 CHARLOTTE 21.** Both teams are coming in off byes. The markets have really been high on WKU in recent weeks and the Hilltoppers nearly pulled outright upsets over Louisville and Marshall. However, this number is a little steep for our liking. We lean with the home team and the OVER.

**Houston 42 EAST CAROLINA 28.** Last week Houston only had a 477-426 yard edge but had 312 yards rushing. Tulsa led 26-17 with 13:00 left in the game before the Cougars scored the game's final 24 points (still not enough to cover). On the other side, ECU HC Scottie Montgomery should be on the hottest of hot seats. Last week was a complete no-show in a 49-6 loss at Temple. We're passing here as we'd like to fade both teams.

**BUFFALO 31 Akron 20.** Last week Akron was thumped at home to Miami, OH 41-17. Miami had a 422-259 yard edge while Akron had 5 TO's. On the other side, Buffalo got a 34-24 win vs Central Michigan. The Bulls had a 434-346 yard edge including 307 on the ground while forcing 4 TO's. We're passing.

**Marshall 31 OLD DOMINION 27.** Last week, the Thundering were upset at home to Middle Tennessee 34-24. Marshall had 3 TO's. The Herd were up 17-10 at halftime but missed a FG and then 24 unanswered MT points! Alex Thomson started in place of an injured Isaiah Green and was 17 of 34 for 173 yards and a 2-1 ratio. On the other side, Old Dominion lost at FAU 52-33. ODU QB LaRussa was 38 of 50 for 383 yards. We're passing until Green's situation clears.

**Middle Tennessee 28 FLORIDA INTERNATIONAL 27.** FIU comes in fresh off a bye as the Panthers have impressed yet again under head coach Butch Davis this season. Meanwhile, Middle Tennessee comes in off an upset win at Marshall. MT was down 17-10 at halftime but scored 24 unanswered. QB Stockstill became the 24th player in NCAA history to top 10,000 career pass yards. Even though it's not a great spot for them, our numbers say the value is with the road team here.

**MIAMI, OH 35 Kent St 26.** Kent St has been much improved under new head coach Sean Lewis this season. Last week, they nearly upset heavily favored Ohio as the Golden Flashes led 20-7 at halftime and ended up with a 472-414 yard edge. Meanwhile, Miami head coach Chuck Martin got a much needed win as the RedHawks destroyed Akron 41-17. Miami had a 422-259 yard edge. We lean with the road team here who has back door potential.

**UTAH ST 45 UNLV 17.** Last week UNLV looked helpless and hopeless without QB Armani Rodgers. New Mexico had 24-13 FD and 502-166 yard edges in a 50-14 win as UNLV was a TD-plus favorite! UNLV QB Max Gilliam was only 15 of 35 for 123 yards and had -43 yards rushing. Keep in mind, UNLV came in averaging 300-plus rushing ypg and only managed 43! On the other side, the Aggies continue to roll (now 5-0 ATS) as they crushed BYU 45-20. Utah St had a 223-39 rushing yard edge and it was Utah St's first back-to-back wins in the 88-game series since 1973-1974. QB Jordan Love threw for a career-high 4 TD's. Aggies go to 6-0 ATS.

**New Mexico 34 COLORADO ST 32.** Last week the Lobos looked mighty good in a blowout win at UNLV. New Mexico had 24-13 FD and 502-166 yard edges while QB Sheriron Jones threw 4 TD passes. On the other side, Colorado St won a wild one over San Jose St 42-30. It was a back and forth game as the Rams led 28-0 at halftime. However, San Jose St rallied to take a 30-28 lead but Colorado St scored final 2 TD's. We have the slightest of leans on the road team here.

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**Troy 37 LIBERTY 28.** Liberty games continue to be very high variance this year as the Flames lost outright at New Mexico St last week. Liberty's 2 TO's resulted in 14 points for New Mexico St. That was the difference. However, we're still wondering why in the heck did they not stay in New Mexico all week? We felt it was foolish to make back-to-back long trips to the same state. On the other side, Troy beat Georgia St 37-20 but it was a costly game as QB Kaleb Barker was hurt at end of first half and is out for year with torn ACL. Troy did have a 554-388 yard edge including 337-116 on ground. We're passing.

**NOTRE DAME 38 Pittsburgh 20.** The Irish are flying high at 6-0 fresh off a 45-23 win at Virginia Tech last week. It was ND's largest road win over a ranked team on the road since 1966. On the other side, Pitt got a much-needed win for head coach Pat Narduzzi as they beat Syracuse 44-37 in OT. Pitt usually gives ND a tough game as 6 of the last 7 have been decided by a TD or less. Also note that since Lou Holtz left in 1996, Notre Dame is just 37-52-2 ATS (41.6%) as a double-digit favorite.

**USC 34 Colorado 24.** We feel Colorado is overrated. The Buffs are currently No. 19 in the AP Poll, but No. 50 in our power ratings. Keep in mind, Colorado has only played one team in the Top 65 (Arizona St). Meanwhile, USC has played a much tougher schedule and is coming off a bye week. USC is 18-0 SU at home under Clay Helton. Since Colorado joined the Pac-12, they're 0-7 vs USC with an average loss by 19 ppg. Fight On!

**Army 36 SAN JOSE ST 20.** Army comes in fresh off a bye after back-to-back impressive performances against Oklahoma and Buffalo. This is the largest away favorite role for the Black Knights since 1996. On top of that, Army is just 2-7 ATS as a double-digit road favorite since 1980. Meanwhile, San Jose St is off a back and forth game with Colorado St last week. The Spartans trailed 28-0 at halftime but out-scored the Rams 30-0 in the 3Q before allowing the game's final two TD's. It's not often that we lean with a team in a historic role but Army continues to defy expectations under head coach Monken

**Washington 30 OREGON 29.** Nice spot here for Oregon fresh off a bye and should be unbeaten as the Stanford collapse could haunt them the rest of the season. Meanwhile Washington is on back-to-back road trips after struggling with a winless UCLA team last week. We feel the Huskies are a little overrated and keep in mind, that loss to Auburn in the opener doesn't look good now. Washington has dominated the last two years winning by 49 and 35 points. However, Oregon was on a 12-0 SU/ATS run in the series prior. To the wire.

**NORTHERN ILLINOIS 30 Ohio 24.** Last week Ohio rallied from a 20-7 halftime deficit to beat Kent 27-26. Kent St actually had a 472-414 yard edge. Meanwhile we cashed a 2H on these pages on Northern Illinois in their win over Ball St. The Huskies led 14-0 early and never looked back. Ohio QB Nathan Rourke is ? here. We lean with the Huskies again.

**Louisiana Tech 30 UTSA 17.** Last week Louisiana Tech lost outright as a TD home favorite to UAB 28-7. UAB had a 365-256 yard edge but were also +2 TO's and scored 2 TD's off them. On the other side, UTSA beat Rice 20-3. However, the Owls had a 222-178 yard edge but were -4 TO's and UTSA got 17 points off 38 yards of total offense after those TO's. We thought we would be having a strong lean on LT here, but this line is too steep for our liking.

**Western Michigan 42 BOWLING GREEN 28.** Last week BG got a rare cover under head coach Mike Jinks as they played well against arch rival Toledo in a 52-36 loss. Still, the Falcons are 1-5 SU/ATS on the season and have only covered 8 games in 3 years under Jinks. Meanwhile, Western Michigan is making progress under 2nd year head coach Tim Lester. Last week, the Broncos got a 27-24 win over rival Eastern Michigan (EMU scored a TD with :20 left). Again we thought we would liking the road favorite here, but the line is pricey.

**Ole Miss 35 ARKANSAS 31.** @Little Rock, AR. Ole Miss comes in off a 70-21 best down of UL-Monroe. Amazingly, the Rebels had 826 yards on offense and Ole QB's Ta'amu and Corral combined for 31 of 34 for 517 yards and 5 TD's! On the other side, Arkansas got a back-door cover over the Crimson Tide. It was still a 65-31 loss as the Hogs were done in by 3 crucial TO's again. Since 2002, Ole Miss is just 7-21 ATS as a road favorite. Lean Hogs.

**MICHIGAN 24 Wisconsin 20.** Last week the Badgers beat Nebraska 41-24. The first down's were even at 26 and Wisconsin only had a 533-518 yard edge. However, the Badgers did own a 370-111 rushing yard edge as RB Taylor had 221 rushing yards and 3 TD's. The Badgers are dealing with cluster injuries in the defensive secondary. On the other side, Michigan beat Maryland 42-21. It was another slow start for UM: Down 14-0 at ND, 7-7 mid 2Q vs SMU, down 17-0 at NW, down 10-7 mid 2Q vs MD. The Wolverines did have 24-11 first down and 465-220 yard edges. QB Patterson now has 1,187 yards on the year and is completing 69% of passes with a 10-3 ratio. Obviously, there is pressure on Harbaugh to win a big game. Haven't had one in two years. Meanwhile Wisconsin is used to performing well in big games. The Badgers are 16-1 their last 17 Big Ten road games and Wisconsin hasn't loss by more than 7 points in any of their last 33 Big Ten road games! Finally, Wisconsin is 9-1-1 ATS vs Michigan this century. We lean with the Badgers.

**OHIO ST 45 Minnesota 14.** Last week, we won a 3★ on these pages fading the Gophers in their surprising high-scoring 48-31 loss at home to Iowa. Meanwhile, Ohio St only led Indiana 35-26 at the end of the 3Q and Indiana missed a FG early 4Q. QB Haskins had a career-high 455 yards and 6 TD's as the Bucks had a 609-406 yard edge. The Buckeyes' defense remains a concern as they have already given up as many 30-yard plays as all of last year. However, Minnesota is a depth-shy team. They have gotten off to 3-0 starts each of the last two years and then have been exposed in Big Ten play (just 2-8-1 ATS last two years).

**Temple 26 NAVY 23.** Last week, Navy got crushed by rival Air Force 35-7. Air Force had 17-9 FD and 399-178 yard edges and Navy was held to 127 rushing yards. "We got our butts whupped, Navy coach Ken Niumatalolo said.

"It's hard to put into words. We've been playing these guys for a long time and this was one of the worst whuppings we've gotten in a long time." On the other side, Temple smashed East Carolina 49-6. The Owls had 26-12 FD and 470-196 yard edges and QB Russo was 21 of 25 for 254 yards and 4 TD's. We liked Navy a lot in this game (5-1 ATS as a home dog) but the QB injuries (see page 1 have us waiting until later in the week for further clarification.

**2★ IOWA ST 31 West Virginia 30.** We think West Virginia is overrated. Here's a team that sits No. 6 in AP Poll but only No. 12 in our power ratings. Keep in mind, the Mountaineers haven't played a Top 35 team yet. On the other side, Iowa St is much more battle-tested with games against Iowa, Oklahoma, TCU and Oklahoma St. Last week in their upset win at Oklahoma St 3rd string QB Brock Purdy was the hero going 18 of 23 for 318 yards and 4 TD's and Purdy also had 84 rushing yards as RB Montgomery was out. On the other side, it looks like West Virginia QB Will Grier with all the Heisman talk is pressing as he had 3 red zone TO's last week vs Kansas. We like the Cyclones in their preferred home dog role.

**NORTH TEXAS 34 Southern Miss 26.** In one of the biggest head-scratching finals of last weekend, North Texas as nearly a 4-TD road favorite nearly lost outright to a UTEP playing with a backup QB and haven't won a single game since 2016. The Mean Green only had a 428-417 yard edge. On the other side, Southern Miss comes in fresh off a bye. We're passing.

**NORTHWESTERN 31 Nebraska 24.** This is the second week in a row, Nebraska has taken big time money throughout the week. Last week the Wisconsin line went from Nebraska +23 to +17.5 and the Huskies only lost by 17. The FD's were even at 26 and Wisconsin only had a 533-518 yard edge. Nebraska QB Martinez was 24 of 42 for 384 yards. Now this week the line has gone from Nebraska +8.5 to +3.5. On the other side, we cashed on these pages with a 2★ Northwestern last week as they beat Michigan St outright as a double-digit road underdog. We lean with the Wildcats here.

**Iowa 30 INDIANA 23.** Last week we cashed on these pages with a 3★ Iowa as they beat Minnesota 48-31. The Hawkeyes had a 420-320 yard edge and Minny had 4 TO's. On the other side, Indiana played a great game vs Ohio St last week. The Hoosiers only trailed the Buckeyes 35-26 entering the 4Q as they notched their 7th cover in their last 8 meetings. Iowa is now on a 16-0 SU/14-1-1 ATS run as a road favorite but we thought there was more value with them last week.

**Central Florida 40 MEMPHIS 37.** This is a decent spot here for Memphis. The tigers have double-revenge from last year and this is UCF's first road trip since August 30th! UCF is vulnerable against the run (allowed 300-plus yards to FAU) and they are taking on the nation's leading rusher in Memphis RS Darrell Henderson (934 yards). Last week, Memphis had 634 yards in a blowout win over UConn. Meanwhile, UCF notched their 18th straight win with a beat down of SMU. UCF had a 541-320 yard edge including 256-83 on the ground. We lean with Memphis.

**AUBURN 33 Tennessee 16.** Tennessee comes in fresh off a bye while Auburn is reeling now. Last week the Tigers were out-rushed by Mississippi 349-90 and the Bulldogs had a 41:43-18:07 time of possession edge. However, we think Tennessee still has a ways to go under first-year head coach Jeremy Pruitt and this line now seems cheap with it dropping 3 points this week.

**TEXAS 37 Baylor 24.** Obviously, the Horns had a big emotional win over Oklahoma last week. Texas almost blew a 45-24 4Q lead as Oklahoma's 3 TO's were critical. Texas QB Ehlinger was 24 of 35 for 314 and had 3 TD's rushing. However, neither Texas nor head coach Tom Herman has handled expectations well. Herman is 4-13 ATS his last 17 games as a favorite. Meanwhile, Baylor is off a 37-34 win over Kansas St as the Bears had 38-20 FD and 557-468 yard edges. Baylor had 5 trips inside KSt's 35-yard line in the first half and managed only 12 points. It's tough laying more than 2 TD's vs a Baylor offense averaging 36 ppg and 500 ypg. We lean with Baylor.

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## BRAD POWERS' ATS STAT OF THE WEEK:

**Wisconsin hasn't loss by more than 7 points in any of their last 33 Big Ten road games. This week the Badgers are 7.5-point underdogs at Michigan.**

**ALABAMA 49 Missouri 21.** Last week Alabama notched their 77th straight win over an unranked team as they crushed Arkansas 65-31. However, Alabama is 0-3 ATS in their last 3 games getting back-doored in all 3 games. QB Tua Tagovailoa has 18 TD passes this year and only 25 incompletions with 0 interceptions. On the other side, Missouri had a misleading 37-35 loss to South Carolina last week. Missouri had 23-18 FD and 490-377 yard edges and a 286-128 rush yard edge. Missouri had 8 trips inside SC's 20-yard line but only 3 TD's. If you're looking to bet Alabama bet the Crimson Tide in the first half. They are 6-0 ATS out-scoring their opponents 238-34 (40-6 average). In the second half, the Tide are 1-5 ATS outscoring their opponents just 16-10.

**2★ Florida 31 VANDERBILT 17.** The market feels like this is a let-down spot for Florida off the LSU game but Gators do have a bye on deck. Last week, Florida got 215 rushing yards against a good LSU defense and the Gators D continued to pressure the QB and force TO's. Meanwhile, Vanderbilt was stomped at Georgia. The Commodores are depth and while they were 3-1 in non-conference action, they are out-classed in the SEC at 1-9 ATS their last 10 conference games. Also Vanderbilt has no home-field edge. The crowd will be 50/50 as Nashville is a destination city in the South. Florida hasn't lost at Vanderbilt since 1988 winning 13 straight in Nashville and have gone 7-3 ATS their last 10 visits.

On the other side, Oklahoma St was outright upset as a TD-plus home favorite to Iowa St. The Pokes have revenge from last year when won outright as a 20-point underdog and knocked Oklahoma St out of Big 12 contention. Pass.

**2★ Rice (plus the points) Uab 33 RICE 20.** Nice spot for Rice here catching UAB in back-to-back road trips off an upset over Louisiana Tech last week. Meanwhile Rice is off a misleading 17-point loss to UTSA. The Owls had a 222-178 yard edge but were -4 TO's and UTSA got 17 points off 38 yards of total offense after those TO's. This is UAB's largest away favorite role since 2004. Also since the Southwest Conference disbanded after the 1995 season, Rice is a remarkable 30-9-3 as a conference home underdog (includes all WAC and CUSA games). We like the dog.

**Georgia 24 LSU 20.** Last week Georgia got another blowout win as they are outscoring their opponents by 30 ppg so far this season. The problem for them here is that LSU is more battle-tested. UGA hasn't played a Top 20 team yet while LSU has played 3. The Tigers are coming off a loss at Florida but still acquitted themselves well as they led late 4Q. This is only the 4th time since 2002, that LSU has been getting more than a TD at home. We lean with the UNDER and the home dog.

**UL-LAFAYETTE 38 New Mexico St 28.** ULL had a nice comfortable win at Texas St last week. The Ragin Cajuns had a 557-425 yard edge including 327-124 on the ground and ULL led 28-0 at halftime. On the other side, New Mexico St got a 49-41 win over Liberty. The Aggies had a 573-524 yard edge and it was by far their best offensive performance of season as they hadn't topped 368 yards in any game. Liberty's 2 TO's resulted in 14 points for New Mexico St. That was the difference. Slight lean on the home team here.

**PENN ST 34 Michigan St 20.** The Nittany Lions come in off a bye as they had to time regroup after the heart-breaking loss at home to Ohio St. On the other side, we cashed a 2★ against Michigan St on these pages last week as they lost outright as a double-digit favorite at home to Northwestern. MSU did have 22-19 FD and 425-373 yard edges and the Spartans' No. 1 rush defense held NW to only 8 yards. It's been a struggle for the Spartans all year but note they are in their preferred underdog role for the first time this season. Michigan St is 16-5 ATS and 11-10 SU their last 21 games as an underdog. "We'll find the answers. I feel pretty confident in that, Michigan State coach Mark Dantonio said. "We'll right the ship." Not sure it happens this week. Pass.

**BYU 35 Hawaii 21.** This is a nice spot for BYU with an extra day to prep catching a Hawaii team playing for an 8th straight week. However, last week was ugly as they were crushed by Utah St 45-20. If not for the upset win over Wisconsin, we have a feeling head coach Kalani Sitake would be on the hot seat. Last week Hawaii's starting QB Cole McDonald was a late scratch but a late TD got Hawaii the 4-point win and cover over Wyoming. The Rainbow Warriors have essentially already locked up a bowl berth already and QB McDonald will be back here.

**3★ CALIFORNIA 34 UCLA 20.** We have a Cal team who is off back-to-back misleading losses to Oregon and Arizona. Last week the Bears had 25-13 FD and 476-265 yard edges. However, Cal had 4 TO's including two "Pick 6's". QB McIlwain got his first start and was 32 of 43 for 315 yards and had 107 rushing yards but 3 INT's. He was the first Cal QB to run for 100 yards in a game since Joe Kapp in 1958. Keep in mind, two weeks ago Cal allowed two defensive TD's to Oregon so that is 4 in just two weeks. Now they face a UCLA team that played their best game of the season last week only losing by 7 to Washington. However, the Bruins are just 0-13 SU/4-9 ATS on the road and the home team is on a 16-2 SU/14-3-1 ATS run in this series.

## Top 20 CFB ATS Trends for Week 7

- Under head coach Rocky Long, San Diego St has defended the option well winning 7 straight over Air Force while also covering 7 of the last 8. This week the Aztecs are 10.5-point favorites over the Falcons.
- Purdue is a 10.5-point favorite at Illinois this week. That's the largest away favorite role for the Boilers since 2007!
- Duke has fared well vs option teams under head coach David Cutcliffe going 8-1 ATS. This week the Blue Devils are +3 at Georgia Tech.
- Since Lou Holtz left in 1996, Notre Dame is just 37-52-2 ATS (41.6%) as a double-digit favorite. This week the Irish are 21-point favorites hosting Pitt.
- Army is a 15-point road favorite at San Jose St this week. That's the largest away favorite role for the Black Knights since 1996. On top of that, Army is just 2-7 ATS as a double-digit road favorite since 1980.
- Oregon was on a 12-0 SU/ATS run vs Washington until the Huskies have dominated the last two years by an average of 42 ppg. This week Washington is a 3-point road favorite at Oregon.
- Since 2002, Ole Miss is just 7-21 ATS as a road favorite. This week the Rebels are 6.5-point favorites at Arkansas (game is in Little Rock).
- Wisconsin hasn't loss by more than 7 points in any of their last 33 Big Ten road games. This week the Badgers are 7.5-point underdogs at Michigan.
- Since 2000, Wisconsin is 9-1-1 ATS vs Michigan.
- Iowa is now on a 16-0 SU/14-1-1 ATS run as a road favorite. This week the Hawkeyes are 5.5-point road favorites at Indiana.
- Texas head coach Tom Herman is just 4-13 ATS his last 17 games as a favorite. This week the Horns are 14.5-point home favorites to Baylor.
- Alabama is a perfect 6-0 ATS in the first half this season as they're outscoring their opponents by an average of 40-6. However, the Tide are 1-5 ATS in the second half only outscoring their opponents 16-10.
- Florida hasn't lost at Vanderbilt since 1988 winning 13 straight in Nashville and have gone 7-3 ATS their last 10 visits.
- Vanderbilt is just 1-9 ATS in their last 9 SEC games. This week the Commodores are 7-point home dogs to Florida.
- Since the Southwest Conference disbanded after the 1995 season, Rice is a remarkable 30-9-3 as a conference home underdog (includes all WAC and CUSA games). This week the Owls are 16.5-point home underdogs to UAB.
- UAB is a 16.5-point favorite at Rice this week. That's their largest away favorite role since 2004.
- Only 4 times since 2002 has LSU been than a TD underdog at home. This week the Tigers are 7.5-point home underdogs to Georgia.
- Michigan St is 16-5 ATS and 11-10 SU their last 21 games as an underdog. This week the Spartans are 13.5-point underdogs at Penn St.
- The home team is on a 16-2 SU/14-3-1 ATS run in the UCLA/Cal series. This year the Bears are 7-point home favorites.
- Boise St is 38-17 ATS as a road favorite the last 11 years. This week the Broncos are 17-point favorites at Nevada.

HOME TEAM IN CAPS

**Philadelphia 24 N.Y. GIANTS 20.** Remarkably the Eagles are on a 16-3 SU run vs the Giants the last 10 years. It's a must-win game for both teams if they want to remain in the playoff hunt. Injuries have taken their toll on the Eagles this season while the Giants offense finally came alive last week in the loss at Carolina (topped 30 points for first time in nearly 3 years). Every Eagles game so far this season has been decided by 6 points or less.

Sunday, October 14th

**MINNESOTA 27 Arizona 14.** Minnesota got their season back on track last week with an outright win at Philadelphia (Cousins 30 of 37). Meanwhile, Arizona got their first win of the season at San Francisco cashing a 2★ on these pages. It was misleading as they were out-gained 496-220 but benefited from +5 TO's. We expect the Vikings to be much more motivated than the last time they were a big home favorite (losing outright to the Bills). Keep in mind, Minnesota is 16-4 ATS as a home favorite in their last 20 and Arizona is 0-9 ATS their last 9 games in the 1pm ET start time.

**CLEVELAND 23 L.A. Chargers 21.** One of our rare NFL losers this year (now 13-2) happened last week when we faded the Chargers in their impressive win over the Raiders. QB Rivers now has a 13-2 TD-to-INT ratio on the season. Meanwhile, Cleveland got their 2nd win of the season, this time in OT over the Ravens. Something to keep an eye on is the possibility of Cleveland wearing out, considering they've played 3 OT games in the first 5 weeks. However, this is a 10am local start time for the Chargers who have London on deck. Slight lean on the home team.

**MIAMI 21 Chicago 20.** One of the baddest beats of the entire NFL so far happened to Dolphins backers last Sunday as Miami, a 6-point underdog to Cincy actually led 17-0 with under 20 minutes left. The Bengals would score the last 27 points of the game but two of their scores came via defensive TD's. That might give us some value here on the Dolphins at home. Meanwhile the Bears come in off a bye. Prior to it, Chicago QB Trubisky threw 6 TD passes in a blowout win over the Bucs. "Buy Low/Sell High".

**Carolina 23 WASHINGTON 22.** Carolina comes in feeling good about themselves after the 63-yard game-winner by Graham Gano (longest game-winner since Tom Dempsey in 1970). Prior to that the Panthers had looked like they were going blow a double-digit lead. Meanwhile, the Redskins were destroyed on MNF at New Orleans. To the wire.

**2★ Indianapolis 23 N.Y. JETS 21.** Yes the Colts are just 1-4 on the season but they've lost two coin flip games to Cincinnati and Houston. We actually came away impressed with their second half performance against the Pats last Thursday and they will have extra rest here. They're taking on an overrated Jets team that ran for 300-plus yards last week vs a tired Denver defense. Rookie QB Darnold had a couple of nice long throws but other than that he was ineffective. The Colts get back on track here.

**2★ Pittsburgh 27 CINCINNATI 23.** Obviously the Bengals are coming off a very fortunate win where they scored the game's final 27 points vs Miami including not one but two defensive TD's. That's now 3 coin-flip wins for the Bengals this year (Colts, Falcons and Dolphins games) who are now 4-1 but very easily could be 1-4. They take on a Pittsburgh team that showed their potential last week in a blowout win over the Falcons. Pittsburgh has won 8 of the last 9 meetings here in Cincy (6 straight overall). In the early summer lines, Pittsburgh was laying 4 here...have these two teams really changed that much in the first 5 weeks? We don't think so.

**ATLANTA 30 Tampa Bay 26.** Obviously, the Falcons are reeling at 1-4 having allowed 40 ppg in their 3-game losing streak. Last week they were crushed by Pittsburgh and their playoff hopes are now on life support. Meanwhile, the Bucs have lost 2 straight games but are coming off a bye. Jameis Winston will be back behind center after "FitzMagic" turned into "FitzTragic" the last couple of games. We're passing.

† **Seattle 26 Oakland 21.** @London, England. The first London game of the season pits these two old AFC West rivals. Seattle's run offense has got it going the last two weeks with 361 yards. Meanwhile, the Raiders were a big disappointment on these pages last week in their loss against the Chargers. While the Raiders lost a couple of close games vs the Broncos and Dolphins, they're also a replay review away from being 0-5. Obviously we have Marshawn Lynch vs his old team but also Ken Norton the Seattle DC was on the Raiders staff the last 3 years. Lean on the Seahawks.

**HOUSTON 24 Buffalo 16.** Both teams are coming off last-second wins with the Texans winning in OT over Dallas on SNF while the Bills got a last second FG to beat the Titans. Obviously, we had a nice outright winner on the Bills on these pages last week but we were a bit concerned going in as the line moved 2.5-points against us. QB Allen threw for just 82 yards but led the game-winning drive. There's no line on this game with the status of Houston QB Deshaun Watson up in the air. He had a fine game vs Dallas last week (33 of 44 for 375). We're passing for now.

**L.A. Rams 28 DENVER 20.** Despite taking the Seahawks' best shot the Rams remained perfect on the season thanks to a gutsy 4th Down call by head coach Sean McVay. On the other side, the Broncos were blown out by the Jets as after allowing 300 yards passing for the first time in 38 games vs KC, the Broncos then allowed 300 yards rushing last week. They are now on a 4-13 SU/2-14-1 ATS run dating back to last season. While the home dog is tempting, we prefer the UNDER.

**Jacksonville 21 DALLAS 19.** Obviously, Dallas head coach Jason Garrett has come under fire this week after not going for it on 4th Down & 1 at the Houston 42 with 5:33 left in OT last week. It was an opportunity for the Cowboys to steal a win in a game, they were out-classed in (outgained 462-292). Meanwhile, Jacksonville had a nightmare afternoon in the rain in Kansas City last Sunday. Bortles had 4 INT's just a week after a career day. Not sure we can trust either team. We're passing.

**3★ TENNESSEE 21 Baltimore 20.** The look-ahead line here had Baltimore favored by only 1. Sure, Tennessee disappointed vs Buffalo, but the Titans dropped a sure-fire TD in the 4Q, otherwise they would've won (we're glad they didn't as we had Buffalo). Meanwhile, Baltimore failed to meet expectations in an OT loss at Cleveland (were 3-point favorites). So how does this line go to Baltimore -3? This is the third straight road game for the Ravens and Tennessee has already pulled 3 outright upsets this year. The Titans are on a 8-1 SU/7-1-1 ATS run at home including a win over Baltimore in Week 9 a year ago. Also note that new Tennessee DC Dean Pees was the Baltimore DC the previous 6 seasons.

**NEW ENGLAND 31 Kansas City 26.** Arguably the best match-up in the NFL so far this season as the unbeaten Chiefs head to Foxboro to take on a rejuvenated Patriots team off back-to-back double-digit wins at home. Obviously, last year KC went into New England on opening night and shocked the defending champs. While Chiefs QB Mahomes is the NFL MVP favorite right now (15-2 ratio), the Chiefs defense still ranks dead last. How long can KC sustain this kind of success with such a poor D? Should be a good one.

**GREEN BAY 28 San Francisco 18.** A lot of steam has been taking out of this one with the injury to Jimmy G and the Packers disappointing start. Last week the 49ers had a misleading loss to the Cardinals (we cashed the Cardinals outright on these pages) as the 49ers were -5 in TO's. On the other side, the Packers fell behind 24-0 at halftime in Detroit, saw kicker Crosby miss 5 kicks and still out-gained the Lions 521-264 in a 31-23 loss. Rodgers threw for 442 yards but still struggled mightily in the 1H. We're passing on this one for now.
