SHOOT: Saturday, August 31, Emerald Empire Gun Club, McGowan Creek Road, NE of Springfield. Set-up is 9:30 a.m., shoot starts at 10. Eye and ear protection required and available. Shoot fee is \$5. Your host is Walt Evens.

Note 1. fire rules are in place - greased patches are not allowed; wet patches only for our shoot this month.

Lorraine and I will be at Fort Umpqua Days in Elkton so your scorekeeper will be Mathew Penkauskas's mom Eleanor, who was in training with me and actually did most of the scoring herself last month.

FIRE SEASON REMINDERS FROM THE EEGC:

Fire season designations are displayed on the right side of the road near Hayden Bridge and in front of the fire station across from the golf course as you are traveling to the range.

Our fire fighting equipment consists of barrels of water located at each range. Each barrel is equipped with a bucket and at least one burlap bag (gunny sack) which are to be wetted and used to beat out or smother a fire. Each range also has at least one dry chemical (ABC) rated fire extinguisher. There are garden hoses on the NE corner of the Clubhouse and on the east side of the MultiPurpose Building.

PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE by Walt Evens
