The Lover of Our Souls



After God created the world, He saw that all was good and beautiful. We were to live free of sin and corruption, in a state of grace. But the Devil had his evil plans and our first parents fell for his tricks. And so in came sin, corruption, suffering and death. We lost our beautiful and natural relationship with God (state of grace) and needed to be saved.

Remember the parable of the weeds in Lk 13:24-30? The sower went out to sow seeds,

good seeds only. But then the Devil was at it again. He sneaked in during the night (Prince of Darkness), while everyone was asleep, and sowed his bad seeds. Once again, we see the beautiful love and care of our God. Rather than hastily pulling the weeds as suggested by the servants, and thereby destroying the wheat, He patiently waits for the harvest time.

So, rather than throw the human race out through the cosmic window. He decides to wait for the right time to redeem and reconcile us to Himself. Enters Christ Our Savior!

One part of the Passion of the Christ that is etched in my memory was when Jesus died on the Cross and descended into hell to free those who had died and had been waiting for redemption and freedom from the Evil One. It was like the climax of His mission.

That scene and the scriptural stories above echo the message from the three readings we have this weekend. In the First reading from the book of Wisdom, we hear of God's mercy on all, which overlooks people's sins that they may repent (Wisdom 11:22). As if that is not consoling enough, the author adds, "For You loathe nothing that You have made; for what You hated, You would not have fashioned" (v. 24). He calls the Lord "lover of souls" Who "rebukes offenders little by little, warn them and remind them of the sins they are committing, that they may abandon their wickedness and believe" in Him (Wis 12:1-2). In the Second reading. Paul prays that God may make us worthy of His calling and powerfully bring to fulfillment every good purpose and every effort of faith (2 Thess 1:11-22). The story of Zacchaeus (Luke 19:1-10) gives flesh to, and summarizes the whole message: God sent Christ to seek and find and rescue the lost.

When Christ, in deed, truly, sincerely comes into our home/ hearts, small and tremendous changes occur. Pentecostals have that favorite question we have heard so often, "Have you accepted Jesus as your personal Lord and Savior?" I always smile whenever I hear it. But there is an eternal truth in it. And when one indeed accepts Jesus as such, his/her emotions and actions will be like those of Zacchaeus: guilt, sorrow, repentance, restitution (righting wrongs done against others), joy, freedom, generosity rather than greed, the list goes on.

How do your emotions and actions and mine mirror those of Zacchaeus?

May the Lord fulfill every good purpose and every effort of faith we make. Amen!
