La diócesis no puede subsidiar todos los programas necesarios y le pide a las parroquias para que ayuden a nuestros hermanos en necesidad.

¿POR QUÉ NECESITAMOS MINISTERIOS Y PROGRAMAS? La iglesia católica responde a las necesidades de muchas personas en la diócesis. Mientras que algunos de estos servicios se ofrecen al nivel de la parroquia, es mucho más eficaz cuando nos unimos todos para los ministerios y para servir a toda la gente de la diócesis.

¿CÓMO PODEMOS AYUDAR? De hecho, no oficialmente, el Pastor ha estado discutiendo esta posibilidad por más de dos años, con los Feligreses Hispanos y siente que llegó la hora ante el ruego formal a la solución para todos.

Las opiniones de los feligreses están bienvenidos y tendremos en el boletín una encuesta para saberlas. Por ahora, nos queda orar al Espíritu Santo, para que nos guie en el cambio de horario propuesto para las Misas del fin de semana y así mejorar la asistencia a las mismas por todos de nuestra comunidad.

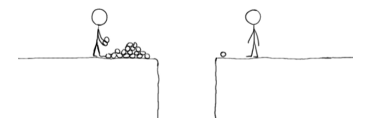

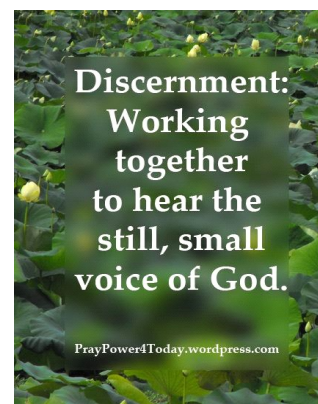

Possible Change of Mass Times Process



The Bishops of the United States are engaged this year in an initiative called the V Encuentro. Our Bishop, Gregory Hartmayer, along with Bishops across the United States, desires parishioners to participate in this initiative in some way. The American Bishops V Encuentro, is supported by Pope Francis. It calls

upon the laity, the priests, and the Bishops "to listen with profound attention o the needs, challenges and aspirations that the growing Hispanic/Latino population faces in daily life. It especially prepares us as a Church to better recognize, embrace, and promote the many gifts and talents that the Hispanic community shares in the life and mission of the Church and in the society." (Bishops Gustavo Garcia-Siller and Nelson Perez) This initiative provides a context for the current process of our parish to discern a more accommodating weekend Mass schedule mainly, not exclusively, for our Hispanic brothers and sisters.

The schedule presented above is the only feasible one under consideration based on the information presented in previous bulletins.

This week the bulletin first recalls some points presented the past two weeks, both in the bulletin and in the pastor's remarks before or at the end of Masses, then moves the process along by providing further information. We begin by reminding ourselves our parish is engaged in a process of discerning a possible change of Mass times. The impetus for this change has already been pointed out and salient facts shared, e.g., Mass attendance levels and trends, the lack of a Spanish language Mass opportunity on Saturday eve, we have one priest, the bilingual option on Saturday is the viable option (adding a Mass is unwarranted given Saturdays can have counselling sessions in the office, Baptisms, Marriages, Quinceañeras , etc.)

Previous bulletins also mentioned the ongoing need for us as a parish to pray for guidance to be led by the Holy Spirit in this process from beginning to end (so as not to let the ubiquitous Evil Spirit hold sway). Also previously mentioned, parishioners' input into the process is welcomed and to achieve this goal they will be provided surveys. These surveys, like the Stewardship Forms parishioners have filled out the past two years, will be bilingual. Here we remind ourselves that the use of a surveys was the tool Pope Francis used to gather information from Catholics all over the world in his data gathering process leading up to the Synod on the Family.



On the bilingual surveys parishioners will be asked the usual sorts of questions including name, contact information, which weekend Mass they most often attend during the year, would they be open to attending that Mass if it were moved back an hour, and such like. They also will be invited to write in any comments they've prayerfully reflected on (see first point about the Holy Spirit). Subsequently these completed surveys will be read by the pastor who afterwards will be assisted in their compilation by a few members of the Pastoral Council and Hispanic Leadership group. A bilingual represented of the Vietnamese community has been and will continue to be consulted. The results of these important surveys will be summarized and shared through the bulletin for all parishioners to inform themselves. Finally, it is helpful to bear in mind the following: the priority throughout is with the process rather than with a deadline; there is no preset decision on the proposed schedule; the assumption is parishioners are praying to the Holy Spirit and that they are informing themselves as always by reading their bulletins; they timely participate in the process filling out and returning their surveys and not absenting themselves from it.
