# PASTOR'S POST

I shared a story in worship recently connected to thoughts about the will of God. I have received feedback about the illustration and decided to share a portion of it here. It goes like this:

Once upon a time . . . in the heart of an ancient Kingdom, there was a beautiful garden. And there, in the cool of the day, the Great Gardener would walk. Of all the plants of the garden, the most beautiful and most beloved was the gracious and noble bamboo. Year after year, bamboo grew yet more noble and gracious, aware of his Master's love and watchful delight, but always modest and gentle.

One day the Gardener drew near to Bamboo. And Bamboo, in a passion of adoration, bowed his head to the ground in greeting.

The Gardener spoke: "Bamboo, Bamboo, I would use you."

Bamboo flung his head to the sky in delight. His voice came low: "Master, I'm ready. Use me as you wish."

"Bamboo," The Gardener's voice was grave, "I would have to take you and cut you down!"

We currently have 22 households who shop at Fry's.


