




endless supply of energy, ideas and enthusiasm. If things don't rapidly change for the better, I guess we can all blame Mike...Welcome!



You can keep track of your highest score

and shoot against that for practice, or you can shoot against another player or two or three...

Any number may play from one on up. Each player begins with 27 points. The first throw is at double one (d1). Any hit are added to the score. If none are hit, a d1 (2 points) is subtracted from your total.

The second throw is at d2, with any hit added while a miss results in d2 (four) subtracted from the total. The hardest thing to remember is that after every throw, your score will change, so don't forget to subtract a double if you miss.

You shoot all doubles and then bulls. The player with the highest score at the end or

Sound familiar? I guess this has happened to us all one time or another. There doesn't seem to be a standard time for warming up before a match.

For some, 9 darts seems to be enough. Their idea is to just loosen their arm before they throw. To them darts is a mental game & getting focused is what they aim for. Some say "you are either on or off and no matter how many darts you throw it just doesn't change." I've seen this happen many times, its why even the best darter can be beaten on a given night.

But there are those on the other side of the coin. You know the ones who are the first to arrive, and by play time they've already played several practice matches. These guy, or gals, seem to be the once a week shooter who needs a lot more loosening up.

Or maybe the newer darter who needs to settle their nerves. They aren't quite as sure of their darts as the old timers, and need to get the feel, or at least a few drinks down to settle their nerves.

It wasn't that long ago I felt I needed a few drinks to throw, we all get nerves, doubts, aches, tightness or just an off night. This is why we have warm ups. No matter how long you take or how many darts you throw, we all need some sort of warm up, either mental or physical, its much like the athlete who stretches before the run, you can't expect much if you don't first prepare.

So give yourself the time you yourself need & be patient with the guy whos able to walk straight in and throw.
