made a special request; then, at the end of each month Lula will pull items off the shelves and take them to the Cherokee County Food Bank, Inc. In Andrews since they have access to the Cherokee County community atlarge and average about 100 clients a week. NOTE: Our pantry is small, so we try not to over stock. We only give out food if someone is here doing work in and around the church building and have access to the building.

March 25th Lula took all the food items to the Cherokee County Food Bank in Andrew's. The bank is opened to the public on Tuesdays and Saturdays from 10-12.

We will need your help to restock our pantry.

PLEASE NO PERISHABLE ITEMS, e.g. loaves of bread or baked goods because they increase the potential for bugs, and they lose their freshness within a short time span. The staff at the Food Bank has requested that we give them our empty egg cartons.

REACH, Inc. - Community Project

The ladies made a commitment to supply the REACH, Inc. of Cherokee County domestic violence shelter with cleaning supplies and laundry detergent. If you have items of clothing, children books, etc. to donate please place them in the bin provided in the pantry area or you can take them to the REACH office located behind the thrift store on HWY 64. We can always use some small tote bags and small travel size items to fill them with, e.g. combs, hand sanitizer, toothbrush, travel size toothpaste, deodorant, etc. for their clientele. Recommended size for the tote bags is 9"X9". Put them on the table in the pantry and we will fill them as time permits.

There is also a small <u>donation</u> jar on the table in the back of the <u>church</u> if you would prefer to give money. If you would like to donate on a recurrent basis, please fill out the card on the back table. You can take

it directly by the office or give it to Lula to take for you.

Often the victims leave home with only the clothes on their back, so they are given clothes and furniture from the Thrift Store until they can get back on their feet. They can always use volunteers to help with some of their community outreach activities and local fundraiser events. Call the office at 828-837-2097 or 828-837-8064 for more information.



Fundraisers are always being planned. Fundraisers are needed to supplement government grants. The next major fundraiser is a "Duck Race" co-sponsored with Mountain True. International Year of the Nurse

This year has been deemed the International Year of the Nurse and Midwife by the World Health Organization, shining a light on the vital role played by nurses and midwives in providing healthcare around the world, and calling for a strengthening of the nursing and midwifery workforce.

Especially during this worldwide health crisis, it is important to acknowledge nurses and all healthcare works as they are on the front line of battle daily to care for those not only stricken with this deadly virus, but also other patients who require care in hospitals, schools, nursing homes, urgent care centers and even in remote triage centers being set up all over this country.

GET SMART Know When Antibiotics Work

Most illnesses are caused by two kinds of germs: bacteria and viruses. Antibiotics can cure bacterial infections – not viral infections.

Bacteria cause strep throats, some pneumonia and sinus infections. *Antibiotics can work.*

Viruses cause the common cold, most coughs and the flu. *Antibiotics don't work.*

Using antibiotics for a virus:

- Will NOT cure the infection
- Will NOT help you feel better
- Will NOT keep others from catching your illness.

Seek medical advice, if you are having a fever, nausea and vomiting, difficulty breathing and/or diarrhea. These symptoms can lead to complications especially if you have an underlining chronic health problem, e.g. diabetes, bronchitis and/or heart problems. The latest CDC recommendation is to avoid crowds of 5 or more people!



THINGS YOU CAN DO

According to the CDC here's how you can help stop the spread of the coronavirus. (NOTE: This is also applicable to other bacteria and virus spread prevention)

- Regularly wash your hands with soap and water for at least 20 seconds
- If soap and water are not available, use hand sanitizer

- with an alcohol content of 60% or more
- Avoid touching your eyes, nose and mouth with unwashed hands
- Avoid close contact less than 6 feet – with people who are sick especially in a poorly ventilated room.
- Stay home when sick
- Cover your sneeze or cough with a tissue or elbow to reduce spread of droplets
- Clean and disinfect frequently touched objects or surfaces



"The value of persistent prayer is not that God will hear us, but that we will finally hear God," because there is no doubt that now is truly a time for the whole world to stop, pray and hear His voice.

Don't forget to check on your neighbors, family and friends to let them know you are thinking of them. Ask them if they need anything that you can help with while following the recommendations from the CDC to keep everyone safe.
