CC4CC Packet Station

Hello Everyone,

I sincerely hope this finds you all well and in the very best of spirit.

As you already know

KF6AKU DOUGLAS SLUSHER, AB4AL ROBERT GREGORY, KJ6JIS ALAN ALSING, W6BBQ FRED NIEMAN and myself, KE6SZG NELUMS ROGER have all been working very hard to get the CC4CC repeater system back up and going to full speed. First and most importantly I would like to express my deepest gratitude for all their help. Quite frankly without them we would not be up and running today. They all have sacrificed time and money, as well as time with their families and friends to complete this job for not themselves but for the sake of our club and its members. I for one appreciate them more than words can express. Thank you, Thank you and God bless you for your unselfish dedication to this project.

With that said Alan and I have added a new packet station running off a Kantronics KPC3+ version 9.1 An Alnico data radio and some antenna I found at amazon. There are three ways to connect. (1) Of course being WA6KQB for key board to key board. (2) WA6KQB-1 which is a personal mail box that can be used for messages, suggestions, etc... (3) CC4CC which is the node to get to another node. All of these can be done with a terminal

node controller computer and some kind of packet program, such as pack ratt, XPware, pk gold or ka gold depending on the tnc you are using and of course computer and Operating system. For example, I'm running the packet system off a Raspberry pi with a program called minicom for Linux. Most of the packet programs run on XP, Dos win 95, 98. So if you can find an old computer and old operating system and few dollars for a tnc which I'm sure you can find at swap meets, EBay, MFJ, Kantronics and even a home brew j-pole you can be up and running in no time.

My point is that it's another useful tool which can be used in an emergency or just to communicate with or simply see how many nodes you can hop to. There are some BBS systems out there which have info and can pass messages on to another country. There is a lot out there to explore and research. If memory serves me right I think there are programs which will allow you to track satellites and even talk to a space station I think??? Or maybe not.
