Praying with Our Eyes Open

Rejoice always, pray without ceasing, give thanks in all circumstances; for this is the will of God in Christ Jesus for you.

1 Thessalonians 5: 16-18

I don't know where I got the idea that I have to close my eyes when I pray. I guess it was when I was a child in Sunday School, and we were asked to bow our heads for the closing prayer. If my eyes were wandering, the teacher would gently touch my shoulder or head to remind me to shut my eyes in prayer.

One Sunday, while my parents were praying during communion (of which I could not yet partake), I remember turning behind me to see several people praying with their eyes open. Two of them had their eyes fixed on the cross hanging in the chancel, while others were staring aimlessly into space. One man noticed me staring at him and quickly closed his eyes, while one woman smiled and waved to me. I quickly turned back around!

Actually, closing our eyes is a good habit to practice when we pray, in order to minimize the distractions that would disrupt our conversation with God. Closing our eyes invites us to step into our own private world of prayer and leave behind our worries and to-do lists, and make God the central focus of our lives. Some people like to light a scented candle when they pray, or play quiet, soothing music to help focus their minds on the presence of God.

Yet, at seminary one day, our preaching professor taught us to pray with our eyes open. After reading a scripture lesson out loud, she gave us instructions to take our journal, go off campus to a place that we normally would not think of writing a sermon (whether crowded or quiet), and take notes on what you saw. Then she dismissed us for the day to pray with our eyes open. How would this practice shape our sermon to speak to the world around us? What is God doing in and through what we do, and even in spite of what we do?

As important as it is to pray with our eyes closed, it is just as important to pray with our eyes wide open, paying attention to the world, noticing God at work, and listening to those whom we might otherwise neglect in our daily lives. Isn't this what Paul is telling the Thessalonians in the above passage: "rejoice always," even when times are tough; "pray without ceasing," pay attention to people and places around us; "give thanks in all circumstances," for even in the tough times, we trust that God is at work—if only we will keep our eyes open?

So, yes, I invite you to spend time every day with your eyes closed, praying to understand God's will for your life. But, also, I invite you to pray attentively with your eyes open, watching for glimpses of God at work in the world, inviting you to reach out in mercy to those to whom God is sending you. Pray with your eyes open, and you will indeed rejoice in all that God is doing that you otherwise wouldn't see.

Session Notes

The Session did not meet in June, and I would like to thank Peggy Leonhard for serving as clerk while I was out of town in July. While we may not have had as many meetings as usual during the summer, work has continued.

Members of the Membership and Outreach Committee planned to welcome incoming ASMSA students and their parents with cookies and water on move-in day. They will also invite the students to attend our church.

We have completed the transfer of our Legacy Funds to the Texas Presbyterian Foundation where our Endowment Funds were already invested. We now have a total of \$2,177,013.23 invested through TPF. Earnings from some of these funds are used to supplement our budget, and others are used for special projects. Endowment funds are designated for capital facilities and for program, mission, and benevolences.

Adult Sunday School has continued through the summer, and older youth class will resume on August 11. A youth mission trip to Nashville this summer was meaningful and memorable. The Christian Education Committee will sponsor a seminar on October 18 and 19, "The Last Segregated Hour," a book on integration of Presbyterian Churches in Memphis during the 1960's.


