Tidings from Timothy

We wish to thank all

who are doing the best they can to help others in such a time. We have been each contributing as we can in the church. Look for a message this morning dealing with the ONENESS of the church and how each member contributes toward the wellbeing of the whole. That said, each member does not do the same thing. Even if we are doing the same thing it is not all at the same time. For example, Team 4 is down for visitation cards this week. You and your team leader can coordinate on how this is done, but there will be a different team next week.

So how can I know what I need to be doing in the kingdom of God? Well, each person's neighbor and opportunities will determine along with his talents what can be done for God. Let Ephesians chapter 4 and other verses in this morning's lesson guide you on how you can contribute to the "oneness" of God's church.

We are a Bible centered, mission minded, and family oriented church. Thank you for coming, and please return at every opportunity. The Hatton Half: Daniel 7:13-14— "I saw in the night visions, and, behold, *one* like the Son of man came with the clouds of heaven, and came to the Ancient of days, and they brought him near before him. 14 And there was given him dominion, and glory, and a kingdom, that all people, nations, and languages, should serve him: his dominion *is* an everlasting dominion, which shall not pass away, and his kingdom *that* which shall not be destroyed."

Daniel was in the middle of a vision when this passage was written. This vision is a description of what happened to our Master after He promised the apostles the baptism of the Holy Spirit (Acts. 1:5). It was after this promise that Jesus ascended back into heaven (Acts 1:8-11). After Jesus is envisioned as approaching the Father, verse fourteen tells us what He received. He received dominion. Dominion was given to our Master both in heaven and in earth (Mat. 28:18-20; John 17:1-4). He was also given a kingdom, which was promised to never be destroyed (Dan. 2:44). His dominion over all things is eternal. All people, nations and languages would come forth to Jerusalem where the church was to begin (Isa. 2:2-4). People from many different lands were gathered together on Pentecost (Acts 2:7-11). It is by the church today that God manifests His eternal wisdom (Eph. 3:10-11). Our Lord's dominion is not going anywhere and His church is here to stay.

Latest statement from the elders: As a word of reminder: we have stated several times before that even though as they say, "We are in this together." That does NOT mean that each family due to age group, pre-existing condition, etc. is in the same danger. I will not waste time proving this in a church bulletin but that should be well known by now and the numbers are not even close. Some people have to make decisions in their families different from what others do. Your decision to get out is your own. We are taking precautions at church but that is all we can do. YOU decide what is best in your own family at such a time as this. No new statement this week. What you see below is just a repeat of what you had before. With what was said above in mind:

- 1. As you enter the building, please pick up the disposable communion supplies available in the foyer. No communion trays will be passed during our services.
- 2. Collection plates will be available for your contribution at or near the exits as you leave.
- 3. Weather permitting, our outside doors will be propped open so no contact need be made when entering or exiting.
- 4. As you enter the auditorium, you will immediately notice that every other pew is taped off. This will help all of us insure the appropriate 6ft for "social distancing." Please do not remove this tape.
- 5. Between services we will have teams sanitizing surfaces where the possibility of cross contamination exists. Volunteers are needed for disinfecting surfaces (doors, pews,

etc). Cleaning will be needed after the 9:00 service, so please allow ample time between services for best quality of cleaning.

6. Please know that if you would feel better with your own personal protective equipment such as a mask, or gloves, you are welcome to wear and use them during your time here. This is a good idea in these times.

We expect much joy, laughter, and just maybe a quick hug may be found. All we ask is that everyone please be respectful of every person's "space" and not crowd or force contact on anyone that may have reservations about contact, especially in light of what our country is still in the midst of.

Those attending: if you have symptoms of the virus please leave to get that checked out. Everyone is welcome at church, but the wisdom of testing for pathogens when symptoms show and quarantine until the results are known is clearly taught in Leviticus 13-17. (Tim)
