FUNDED BY PAACF (MOFFAT) ONLY - 3

1. ECOLE VALOIS - OUTDOOR FITNESS EQUIPMENT

Granted - \$ 15,000.00

***** Moffat - \$ 15,000.00**

To provide a wider range of playground equipment for students at Ecole Valois as well as for families in this downtown core area who do not have access to many green spaces.

Specific Use of PAACF Funding

To purchase Blue IMP equipment

Benefits to Community

To provide ongoing benefit to surrounding neighborhood by keeping children and families active.

2. MANN ART GALLERY- iMAGine ARTS

Granted - \$ 3,000.00

***** Moffat - \$ 3,000.00**

To support outreach programming in Prince Albert and region public long-term care homes (4) in Prince Albert (3) and Shellbrook (1)

Specific Use of PAACF Funding

Cover costs of tour fees, materials, and mileage for travelling to and from care homes

Benefits to Community

To provide hands-on, positive learning opportunities in arts and culture for elderly and disabled individuals living in long-term care facilities to advance mental well-being of individuals, provide life-long learning and educational opportunities, and provide healthy social development of arts and cultural activities.

3. P.A. HISTORICAL DESIGN SOCIETY

Granted - \$ 15,000.00

***** Moffat - \$ 15,000.00**

To engage the public in the redesign of the main floor galleries at the Historical Museum, expected to impact a minimum of 8,000 visitors annually. Will design and implement exhibits and educational programming.

Specific Use of PAACF Funding

To increase staffing levels dedicated exclusively to the revitalization, plus Honoraria and associated admin costs.

Benefits to Community

To expand displays on First Nations and Metis history, expand exhibits on military materials, and further develop the area on the history of Prince Albert as a community.

JOINTLY FUNDED BY MOFFAT AND UW - 4

1. **CATHOLIC FAMILY SERVICES OF PRINCE ALBERT - BANANA SPLITS**

Granted - \$ 4,000.00

***** Moffat - \$ 2,000.00 UW - \$ 2,000.00**

To provide a group program to help children heal from the trauma of separation and divorce. Format is a Day Camp or once/week for 6 weeks. Offered twice a year.

Specific Use of Funding

Salaries of program facilitators, costs of consumable items, admin costs and transportation costs

Benefits to Community

Build community capacity, reflect diversity, establish an effective and imaginative program.

2. **FAMILY FUTURES, INC - MILK COUPON PROGRAM**

Granted - \$ 8,300.00

***** Moffat - \$ 5,000.00 UW - \$ 3,300.00**

More than 300 women use the program annually. Each pregnant woman receives 7 litres of milk per week for up to 3 months post-natal.

Specific Use of Funding

To purchase milk coupons, thus meeting the shortfall in the program

Benefits to Community

Assist women and their families, who are often living in poverty, to provide good nutrition and assist with their grocery budget.

3. **PRINCE ALBERT LITERACY NETWORK INC. – TUTOR LEARNER CONNECTIONS**

Granted - \$ 10,700.00

***** Moffat - \$ 4,000.00 United Way - \$6,700.00**

To support free one-on-one tutoring for 26-57 adults.

Specific Use of Funding

- provide tutor training
- perform learner assessments
- determine matches

Benefits to Community

- 1) Health - encouraged to focus on healthy lifestyles
- 2) Education – build language skills, adult learning and parenting component
- 3) Capacity Building – parent participants go on to take facilitator training

4. YWCA – COLD WEATHER SHELTER (OUR HOUSE)

Granted - \$ 10,000.00

***** Moffat - \$ 5,000.00 UW - \$ 5,000.0**

This is a harm reduction model and is open from 8:00 am to 8:00 pm daily from Oct 15 - April 15th.
This service is for clients who cannot access our regular shelter beds. In 2014-15, 320 individuals accessed the Shelter for a total of 1774 bed nights.

Specific Use of Funding

- staffing

Benefits to Community

Addresses hunger and the impact of poverty plus builds the communities capacity to care

24 hour Domestic Violence and Sexual Assault Counseling and Education, Diffusion of volatile situations and ensure safety of victims.

2. TEEN/INFANT ACCESSIBILITY PROGRAM – ST. MARY DAYCARE INC.

To provide cab fare for student families to and from school in 2016-17.
