

Parish Membership: Every family and single adult to be considered active members of St. Bartholomew's Parish must be properly registered in the parish, receiving and regularly using the parish weekly donation envelopes. Only in this way can the parish issue documents attesting to parish membership and Catholic practice, e.g. a letter to be a Godparent or Sponsor. New parishioners are requested to visit the parish office.

Sick & Shut-ins: The priests are available to administer the Sacraments to those who are unable to come to Church. The Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick is part of the healing ministry of the Church, and should be received early in an illness or before a serious operation.

Baptisms: Please call the parish office to make arrangements.

Marriages: In order to provide sufficient time for the Marriage Preparation Course, please call the parish office and ask to speak with the pastor at least six months in advance of the wedding.

Some weeks ago we announced that we would love to see St. Bart's become a Eucharistic Adoration center. I have received positive feedback about this and some are actually looking forward to it. We know that this practice will bring God's blessings upon our parish, parishioners and our families. Our plan is to extend our First Friday Eucharistic Adoration from one hour to about ten hours. In addition to the First Saturday one hour Divine Mercy, we would add

Eucharistic Adoration from morning till evening.

For a start, we want to have a three weekend Novena of Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament. We want to pray for growth in all aspects of our parish life, including faith/spiritual, social, and material/financial aspects. As we pray for our parish, we will be praying for our parish families, too. As we look forward to greater outreach to our inactive Catholics and the unchurched in our local community, and thereby growing our parish, we want to begin by praying to God for direction and his blessings on our efforts.

The Novena will be held on Fridays, November 8, 15, & 22 from 9:30 a.m. – 7:30 p.m. and Saturdays, November 9, 16, & 23 from 9:30 a.m. – 4:30 p.m. and again, from 6 p.m. – 8 p.m. During those three weekends we need volunteers to cover each of the hours while the Blessed Sacrament is exposed. If you are able to volunteer a few day time hours doing office work, to assist the Religious Education program each week, please contact Cheryl Duda (914 476-6676).


MAKING ALL THINGS NEW

- Sun, Dec 1 Self Evaluations Due to the Archdiocese




Religious Education It's never too late to register a public school student in a Religious strong foundation Education program to prepare them for First Communion, Confirmation,


