# Imperial Session

At the IALOH meeting at the Imperial session ideas on how to increase LOH membership was discussed. These are just some of the ideas mentioned.

- 1. Be a service to the community, for example provide socks or cards to veterans at the VA hospital or nursing home. Recognize veterans for their service. Join the Voluntary Service at the VA.
- 2. Piggyback on activities by other organizations, community events, the VA, Boy Scouts, VFW, American Legion, etc. Provide LOH information, activities
- 3. Wear your shirts, pins, and put your branch of service on your shirt; you are a walking billboard for LOH.
- 4. Wear you service ribbons, show your pride in LOH.
- 5. Recruit new Shrine members to LOH at the first opportunity; visit Blue Lodges and recruit the veterans to join the Shriners and the LOH.
- 6. Recognize all veterans at your temple, for example a plaque listing all veterans. Does not have to be a member of the LOH.
- 7. Have the names and branch announced for members carrying the flag at events.
- 8. Carry the flag(s) in all the parades that you can.
- 9. Have your meetings on days and at times that are convenient for families, provide activities for children to encourage younger veterans to join.
- 10. Make sure new members feel welcome and are included. Talk with your lady about being welcoming and friendly to other ladies.
- 11. You may want to sell holders for the Fez that identify the branch of service the veteran served with as a fund raiser.
- 12. If you now have the ladies bring a potluck dish to meetings, you may want to change it to a catered meal.
- 13. If the application to join your temple does not ask whether a person is a veteran, get that added to the application. Make sure that you are informed of veterans joining your temple and give them a personal invitation to join LOH.
- 14. Temple and LOH have some type of military program throughout the year.


