holiday, the meeting shall be rescheduled to the following Monday."

ELECTION: Thank you to everyone who has stepped up to the plate for the election. We now have four (4) people on the ballot by the nomination deadline of December 8th. The candidates names and a summary paragraph submitted by each of them are provided below:

I really have a blast putting together the dinners and events, organizing, decorating for them and coming up with those "special touches" to make sure they are fun and enjoyable for everyone! I will meet with my volunteers for the Election Meeting on Friday January 5th @ 3pm in the clubhouse where we will go over procedures for signing people in, handing out ballots, and counting ballots. Absentee Ballots: it is getting close to the election, if you need an absentee ballot you may print one from the link below, complete ALL required information and mail it back the association. If you are here, but are unable to attend the meeting, you can print an absentee ballot from the link below or contact me directly and return the ballot in the slot on the office door. Either way all ballots must be received by 5:00pm on Election Day, January 8th 2024 in order to be verified, added to the ballot box and counted in the election. Please note - if we receive your absentee ballot, you will be noted as "voted" on the sign-in sheet and you will not be able to receive a ballot if you come to the meeting in person.

FRONTIER FIBER OPTIC PROJECT: I spoke to the engineer for our project at Frontier after seeing an 811 company in the park locating and marking all utility lines in easements and roads where cables will cross. The engineer stated that Frontier is now looking to finish by end of February, but they will probably start this week or next getting conduit in so they can pull cable. They have the county permits approved that are required for them to access the deeded utility easements on both association and members properties for installation and maintenance. They still need one permit that needs county approval to bore the roads, but they hope to have that soon.

The initial installation of the conducted cable should proceed quickly and should involve little inconvenience to homeowners. This is just to cable the Park at this stage, no lines to any homes will be connected till later. At the next stage, if homeowners decide to set up an account with Frontier, a home installation crew will come in and run another cable from the conduited main cable to

your home.

As I reported at the November and December HOA meetings, we will have a personal account rep for Oaks Royal 3, to handle sales of internet and YouTube TV. Yes we have been told it will be discounted, but we have not been told numbers yet. Please do not call Frontier about discounts for Oaks Royal 3, you will get that information AFTER the cable has been laid. We will also have brochures in a kiosk in the clubhouse at that time. I will keep you informed about that timeline as soon as the engineers from Frontier inform me! My initial estimate of March-ish is lookin likely at this time. Patience is the word!

PET POOP: I understand the continued frustration some of you have with the issue of some people abusing the good nature of homeowners and allowing their dogs to poop on lawns and or sidewalks without cleaning it up! I really do! We are working with the leadership at Oaks Royal 1 & 2 who have been going through this same this same issue the past few months. It is funny, while we blame their people in bringing their dogs to our park to aggressive "poop and run", they have been blaming us for doing the same over there!

I even recently downloaded the camera cards, and scanned pics to see if I could find someone red-butted as-it-were, but did not see any likely candidates. Thousands of pics!

I would really like to stop talking about Poop, POop, and more POOP! Dog poop, cat poop, I guess I should be happy I haven't had reports of people running around pooping on lawns! Yet...

Obviously this problem is not going away, and is much bigger than just a few Board members; we need resident input and support. If anyone has any ideas of how best to combat this problem, to form a poop-committee or maybe to volunteer to form a poop-patrol (the Board will supply the flashlights for night patrol), feel free contact myself or the Board.

To review: Remember Pasco County has a **Sec. 90-2. - Pet waste ordinance. Pet means a domesticated animal. Pet waste means waste matter, excrement expelled from the**

bowels of a pet. Properly dispose means placement in a designated waste receptacle, or other suitable container, and discarded in a refuse container which is regularly emptied by the county or some other refuse collector; or disposal into a system designed to convey domestic sewage for proper treatment and disposal. Requirement for Disposal. All pet owners and keepers are required to immediately collect their pet's waste when deposited on any property, public or private, not owned or possessed by that person and to properly dispose of the pet waste.

Most pet owners have always been compliant! It is always a fuss for a few, unidentified rule breakers! But since we have been really harping on the subject, we have seen almost all pet owners walking their dogs have been doing a good job of getting their furry friends to poop in the green space between the sidewalk and road AND cleaning it up. Thank you to all you responsible pet owners out there!

However, I still am getting reports of poop appearing on yards! Some residents are still reporting seeing "female driving golf cart with dog - they dot recognize either - and the dog poops and the golf cart drives off without the driver getting out to pick up the poop!"

I have also had reports of cats, with collars, showing up and pooping in peoples yards and flower beds, tracking on cars, etc. People who own cats are required to licensed them (and have them wear license) & get them rabies vaccine just like dogs, and they are subject to Pasco Pet Waste Policy just like any pet owner. Coming to Oaks Royal 3 with a cat or 3 in tow, then opening the door and tossing them out to wander all night to prowl, howl, track on peoples cars, golf carts and poop every where is not ok. If you have a cat, for heavens sake treat it well, don't let it fight with the wild cats, snuggle up to it at night, and invest in a litter box and some litter!

Pasco Events January 2024 festivals in Florida

<u>Crystal River Manatee Festival</u>, Crystal River, Jan. 13-14, 2024 <u>Orange City Blue Spring Manatee Festival</u>, Orange City, Jan. 27-28, 2024

These manatee festivals are each located near a site where hundreds of manatees gather each winter. Both locations offer a variety of activities, including opportunities to view manatees. Florida Rambler story on two **January manatee festivals**

Fellsmere Frog Leg Festival, Fellsmere, Jan. 18-21, 2024

This funky volunteer-run festival has been happening for 30+ years. Food choices start with one frog leg or gator nugget (a frog or gator "pop" on a stick for \$3) up to a gator-tail and frog leg dinner for \$16. Music, games, carnivals rides, down-home goods. Festival has free parking and admission and raises money for kids' recreational needs in Fellsmere community.

Jensen Beach Fine Arts and Crafts Show, Jensen Beach, Jan. 28-29, 2024

This free event kicks off the festival season in January with a show that features 125 artists selected by a jury out of hundreds of applicants. The setting is the charming historic streets of Jensen Beach.

<u>Images: A Festival of the Arts</u>, New Smyrna Beach, Jan. 26-28, 2024

Images presents more than 200 artists from across North America in a waterfront setting. It's a free festival that attracts 45,000. From Florida Rambler: Things to do in New Smyrna Beach.

Homestead Rodeo, Homestead, Jan. 26-29, 2024

Florida has a rich history of rodeos in its small towns. One of the longest lasting traditional rodeos (70+ years) and the southernmost rodeo in the United States is in Homestead.

Hoggetowne Medieval Faire, Gainesville, Jan. 27-28, 2024

For more than three decades, a medieval village has come alive in January in this North Florida town. The Faire showcases more than 160 talented artisans and craftspeople from all over the country, who arrive at Hoggetowne to display and sell a variety of goods. The festival includes food, rides, games, activities, craft demonstrations, jugglers, musicians, jousters and nine stages of entertainment.

Gasparilla Pirate Fest, Tampa, Jan. 27, 2024

Colorful, fully-rigged pirate ship *Jose Gasparilla* magically appears at the south end of Hillsborough Bay, where the invading Ye Mystic Krewe of Gasparilla are met by a flotilla of pleasure craft. The mock sea battle is followed by a Mardi Gra-like parade.

<u>Kumquat Festival</u>, **Dade City**, **Jan. 27**, **2024** (annually, last Saturday of January)

The historic downtown in Dade City fills with as many as 35,000 people for this free event celebrating the tangy little fruit grown locally. Along with dozens of booths and live entertainment, a highlight is tasting kumquat treats, from kumquat pie to kumquat cookies to kumquat salsa. Free shuttles run from two satellite parking areas —the Pasco County Fairgrounds on State Road 52 and next to Jarrett Ford on US Hwy 301 Truck Route.
