Rules & Guidelines

- Upon selecting an artist in history, your group may begin any necessary research.
- As a team, your group will agree upon and sketch a design that represents that artist.
- Group/Organization participation cost is \$400. This covers one/one time scheduled with muralist, Tamara Brown, and all supplies/materials needed for an 8'x10' mural.
- Each team may conduct their own fundraisers or request sponsorship to assist with raising \$400.
- **Participation cost is due by March 31, 2019 payable to the Clinton County Arts Council (CCAC).**
- In April 2019, Tamara Brown (Tea) will paint the north side of the underpass. Your group will be scheduled time to observe and learn techniques.
- Between May-July, teams will again be scheduled one/one time with Tea to learn how to scale their composition unto the 8'x10' section and install their mural.
- Legendary Artists Passage is a community-friendly project for all ages and CCAC requests that your team keep that in mind when considering art content for public display.
- CCAC reserves the rights to publicize and distribute images of final mural work.
- Upon completion of the “Legendary Artists Passage” mural project, a community reception will be held at the Depot Rotary Pavilion.

“Legendary Artists Passage”

Historical Artist Selection

Frida Kahlo (1907-1954) – Mexican surreal painter.

She is best known for her brilliantly colored and strange self-portraits.

Georgia O’Keeffe (1887-1986) – Midwestern artist, from Wisconsin.

She studied painting at the Art Institute of Chicago in the early 20th century. O’Keeffe’s work ranged from organic subjects, like close-ups and abstractions of flowers, to man-made structures, like the buildings of New York, where she lived and worked.

Andy Warhol (1928-1987) – American artist, director and producer.

Leading figure in the visual art movement known as pop art.

Leonardo da Vinci (1452-1519) –

One of the greatest men to have ever lived. He was an artist, scientist, architect, author, engineer, inventor, and humanist. Da Vinci explored and delved into things which were many centuries ahead of him.

Salvador Dali (1904-1989) – Surrealist Painter

Dalí was a skilled draftsman, best known for the striking and bizarre images in his surrealist work.

Oscar Claude Monet (1840-1926) – French Impressionist

Monet lived by the philosophy of Impressionism that emphasizes the expression of one’s perceptions before nature.

Winslow Homer (1836-1910) – American freelance illustrator.

Pablo Picasso (1881-1973) – Spanish Draughtsman, Sculptor and painter.

Skilled from childhood and into adolescence, in his twenties he experimented with different ideas and techniques.

Vincent Willem van Gogh (1853-1890) – Dutch Post-Impressionist artist.

He carried lots of influences on 20th century art due to their portrayal of colors and emotions.

Norman Rockwell (1894-1978) – American illustrator and painter.

Bob Ross (1942-1995) – American painter, art illustrator and television host

Television host of “The Joy of Painting”.
