## It's Hard to Say Goodbye

We are sorry to report that Jasmine Thorn is leaving the Esslingen city administration for another



job opportunity. She has been a wonderful supporter of our high school exchange program and has made many friends in Sheboygan when she has traveled here. We wish her well in her new job, and

we thank her so much for the many hours she has spent in promoting our exchange program. Katrin Radtke will take over the communication with our chapter for now regarding any exchanges we may be able to make.

## **Changes in Exchange Program**

It is no longer possible for our chapter to maintain the 5-month exchange program for our high school students. Our U.S. government has made it impossible to adhere to their many restrictions and financial obligations, so the board has reluctantly decided to drop the long stay exchange program after 53 successful years. Fortunately, the summer exchange program for middle school students will continue. We are currently trying to establish a program with the Esslingen gymnasiums whereby students may attend school here for up to 3 months without needing a visa. Students from the Sheboygan area could also spend up to 3 months in Esslingen without needing a visa. Some of the local schools have already said they will accept Esslingen students for a shorter period of time. We hope this new program will be ready by fall of 2025.

#### **History of Exchange Program**

The high school exchange program began in 1970 with four students participating: Betty Flottman, Pam Ott, Peter Doermann, and Stan Gueldenzopf. The program grew steadily over the years, and in 1985 we had 14 applicants, of whom 7 were chosen to participate. For many years the students who applied were required to have at least 2 years of German, and part of their interviews were conducted in German. That requirement was dropped when there were fewer German classes taught in the high schools and it became more difficult to find applicants for the program. In recent years there have been many more applicants in Esslingen than in Sheboygan, so we initiated the possibility of one-way exchanges when host families could be found for the German students.

Over the years this newsletter has included many articles from former exchange students who have articulated how the program positively affected their lives after spending 5-6 months Several families had studying in Esslingen. multiple children participate, with the Bogenschultz family holding the record at 5 of their 6 children. Sara Bogenschultz Born participated in 1980-81, and she is still an active member of our chapter who attends almost all meetings. Many of our current board members have had children in the program. Martin Hertkorn from Esslingen participated in 1972 and stayed with the Voorhans family. He continues to stay in touch with Margaret, and most recently he returned to Kohler for her 90th birthday in 2022. It goes without saying that this exchange program has influenced the lives of a lot of People to People members and has been a major function of our chapter. It is sad to see it coming to an end as a long stay exchange.
