### The LOVE Network Trees are Up

There are two special Christmas trees in Amana that have an important job to do. The LOVE Network trees in the Amana Family Practice Clinic in Amana and in the Amana Colonies Pharmacy help Iowa County families have a merrier Christmas.

This year because the need is greater than ever, two trees have been set up. One is in the Amana Colonies Pharmacy and one is in the Amana Family Practice Clinic in Amana.

Our LOVE Network volunteer, Carmen Grimm, reports that there are about 65 cards on the trees this year – cards asking for gifts for kids, teens and grownups.

This year the Iowa County LOVE Network volunteers went back to having adults Christmas wishes on the cards on the trees and they have reached out to area nursing homes to ask any of their residents (who might not otherwise have family in the area) might need or like a gift. Each gift wish is collected and written on a card with enough details (like size) to make it easier to shop.

This year the date to return the wrapped package to the tree is December 2. So please go right now and pick a card from the tree. Then shop for the item written on the card. Return the package, wrapped, with the card attached, to the tree before December 2. The Amana Clinic will remain open until 8:30 p.m. on December 2 so that any one who needs too may leave their LOVE packages.

### Thankful for the Amana Colonies Food Pantry

The Amana Colonies Food Pantry operated by volunteers of the Amana Church at the Middle Amana Church has received a bountiful harvest this fall.

The AC Food Pantry gives free food to anyone in need the second Wednesday of each month from 4 – 5 p.m. and the last Sunday of the month from 11 a.m. - noon. About 20 – 30 families and individuals, some 80 people, regularly receive food from the Amana Colonies Food Pantry so replenishing the pantry is an ongoing job.

Saturday, Oct. 19 the pantry received a huge donation from the annual "Scouting for Food" campaign led by the Amana Boy Scouts and Cub Scouts. This year the Scouts brought in 2,450 pounds of food. Residents in all seven villages made the donations that were picked up by our local scouts and their parents. All the food was brought to the food pantry in the cellar of the church where it was weighed, sorted and put away.

Two local businesses have stepped up to help too. The Ox Yoke Inn is donating special Thanksgiving "Ox boxes," complete turkey dinners for the

families and individuals who regularly come to the pantry. Prepared at the restaurant in Amana these will be brought to the food pantry for distribution.

Meanwhile the Amana Meat Shop and Smokehouse, Amana regularly donates meats to the Amana Colonies Food Pantry. The Amana Meat Shop contributions have made it possible to provide quality meats to those in need on a regular basis.

Pantry organizers Annie Trumpold, Penni Berger and Kristi Yoder are very grateful for these contributions and for all the many local residents donate food or support the food pantry with contributions from their gardens. Cash donations help buy bread, fresh fruit, milk and eggs. They note that support of the AC Food Pantry has been wonderful since day one.

More good news - the fund drive to Restore Revive Renew the Amana Church's sacred spaces has been successful. Supported in part by a \$70,000 grant from the National Fund for Sacred Places, a program of Partners for Sacred Places in collaboration with the National Trust for Historic Preservation, the fund drive is very nearly over and the Amana Church has raised enough to restore both the Amana Church in Amana and the Kinderschule in Middle Amana.

The Kinderschule will be repurposed as the new home of the Amana Colonies Food Pantry. Once the Kinderschule work is completed, the food pantry will no longer be in the cellar of the church but moving to the ground floor with more room for freezers/ refrigerators, prep tables and shelving. This fall Sandersfeld Construction has stabilized the Kinderschule structure and replaced the broken / worn siding. Interior fixes will be made with new electrical wiring and a new HVAC system. New windows, doors, exterior lighting and other fixes will be completed before spring. In the spring the sidewalk on the south side of the Middle Amana Church will be extended and widened.

Donations for this project were received from all over the country, from friends, neighbors, local residents and local businesses too. Every single donation has helped move this project forward.
