We have the unique opportunity to host the Presbytery meeting at our church on April 21 & 22. It is an exciting time to be able to host this meeting as the opportunity does not come along very often.

What is a presbytery meeting? It is a time for the coming together, face-to-face, to conduct the business of this particular presbytery, The Presbytery of the Northern Plains (PNP). The PNP includes 59 congregations and one fellowship in North Dakota, western Minnesota, and one county in Montana. We expect about 75 people to attend the meeting.

PONDERINGS FROM PASTOR CATHIE

To all God's beloved reading this newsletter: Grace to you and peace from God our Father and the Lord Je-

sus Christ.

We are deep within the season of Lent, and Easter is right around the corner on April 16th. In March, we started Lent with an Ash Wednesday service, asking God to wash us and cleanse our sins; and to guide us as we sought to deepen our relationship with God during this season. As we reflect on our Sunday gospel readings, we spent most of our time in the Gospel of John, with really long passages! How easy it is for us as humans to focus on how long the passage is, rather than the message intended for our ears and heart.

all he endured for us, the people of God. This season is the very core of what Christianity is all about. As we walk with Jesus Christ during this season, we hear things in our scripture readings that are difficult to understand, and can be even more difficult to verbalize to others. We have an opportunity each Lenten season to consciously look at ourselves as

Christians. We have the opportunity to re-read, and hear the Gospel of Jesus Christ, reminding us of his suffering and sacrifice. We have been chosen by God, and have received the forgiveness and grace of Christ Jesus. We did not have to earn it; God has called us to eternal life.

When we let the depth, and meaning of Jesus' crucifixion, death, and resurrection sink into our hearts and minds, we are reminded of the greatness of the gift we have received. We remember that we are not to hide our gift, we are to share this good news of the resurrection of Jesus Christ with others. We realize and understand that each word we speak and each action we take shouts out to the rest of the world what it means to be a Christian.

During March, we lost three of our Christian friends to death: Dorothy Jenkins, Delbert Jenner, and Harriet Diede. We mourned with their families, and rejoiced at the same time, because we know that they are with God, free from pain and struggle. We will miss their presence, as friends and as family. It is not easy to let our friends and family go; it would be so much better, we think, as humans, if they could stay with us. Ultimately, as Christians, we are grateful that they are now with God.

On our Lenten Journey, we also recognize that we must reach out to others in response to Jesus' call to care for those in need, especially those on the margins of society. Jesus demonstrated his intent of reaching out to all of God's children with each and every lesson he

taught while he was on earth. He spent time with those who were judged and rejected by the culture. For example, he talked with a Samaritan woman by Jacob's well, and even offered her Living Water. It is Jesus' behavior that we see and hear in our scripture readings. It is the behavior of Jesus that we are to follow in our own lives, inside our doors and outside the doors of our church.

God to wash us and cleanse us from our sins before we remember our Lord and Savior with communion. Our gospel reading from John 13:1-17 includes the account of Jesus washing the feet of the disciples. We are adding "hand washing" as part of the Maundy Thursday service this year to symbolize Jesus' foot washing. You will come forward, stop at the handwashing station, and proceed to the communion table for





FOCUS ON MISSION

Have you ever invited someone new as a guest to your home for dinner or a celebration? When you did, it is like-

ly that you introduced your guests to everyone in your household and any other guests in attendance as they arrived. If you didn't, some might say that you weren't being a very good host. At Community Presbyterian Church, we have opened the doors of our home to guests and the goal of this article is to help introduce our guests to those in the congregation who may not have had the chance to meet them yet and invite you to extend a welcoming hand, a kind word, and warm smile.

A few years ago, a group of worshipers from a ministry named the "Holiness Revival Ministry Worldwide" approached members of our church and Elders on our Session with a request to use our facility as a place of worship for their new ministry. Their ministry was in need of a place to grow, and not unlike a seed that needs a good pot of soil to emerge, they needed a place to begin as well. Our church chose to welcome them as quests to our home and so began our relationship with our new friends at HOREMOW. I'd like to give you a bit of information to introduce you to HOREMOW but most importantly ask you to think about our role as a good host and what that means for our common goal of worshiping Christ.

The Holiness Revival Ministry Worldwide, also known as, HOliness REvival MOvement WOrldwide (HOREMOW), is a non-denominational Ministry given to the promotion of biblical Righteousness and Holiness in Churches and Nations of the world through Crusades, Conferences, Revival Meetings, production and spread of Holiness literature and materials. The membership of the Movement is opened to all who love to live the Righteous and Holy Life and to spread same in their church, Christian community and nation.

The members of HOREMOW are our brothers and sisters in Christ and they are led by Pastor Solomon Reeves who has been our contact when communicating about their congregation's use of our facility. Over time, we have worked to help the HOREMOW ministry as they are working to grow their congregation. When HOREMOW began, they were meeting in our church for worship on Sundays beginning when our service and fellowship was ending. Last year, Pastor Reeves approached our church to see if their ministry could have use of the facility for some additional hours during the week. At that time, Session revisited the topic of their use of the fa-There was thoughtful discussion about granting the request and the basis of the original use as well. Points about cost, risks of use by others, access, and our/their mission were debated. sion made the decision that the use of our facility by HOREMOW at this time, was and is a part of our Church's Mission outreach. The Mission Committee discussed the question further and made the recommendation to continue hosting HOREMOW as a guest of our church, to which the Session agreed.

It was decided that along with inviting HOREMOW as a guest into our Church, we would do a better job of documenting the conditions of use of our facility. So, Session created a document, that HOREMOW has agreed to, which defines the expectations of Community Presbyterian Church around the use of the facility. A few key points are listed below:

- Pastor Solomon Reeves is our point of contact
- Times of use:
 - Sunday Worship noon to 3:00 p.m.
 - Bible Study Wednesday 6:00 to 8:00 p.m.
 - Prayer Service Saturday 5:00 to 7:30 p.m.
- If any Community Presbyterian (Continued on page 8)

Church event, whether regularly scheduled or special, conflicts with the time of HOREMOW's use, the Community Presbyterian event would have precedence over any of the times of use by HOREMOW. However, we would provide notice to Pastor Reeves as soon as possible if we found that we would need to use the facility during these times so that they can plan and reschedule their events accordingly.

- Access to the church is provided to them through the use of a programmed electronic key FOB only for the hours listed above. Pastor Reeves has the electronic key FOB and is in charge of confirming the doors are locked when their use of the building is complete. He is the only person from HOREMOW with security access.
- HOREMOW is to leave the church clean and in the same condition as before each use throughout the week.
- Children are to have adult supervision during the use of the facility.
- The Session would review the status of the relationship on a quarterly basis and determine continued use.

As recently as this month, Session has revisited the details of HOREMOW's use of our facility. It continues to be our joy to host HOREMOW as a guest in our church until such time that their ministry has either grown in numbers requiring, or as determined by CPCWF or HOREMOW, to find a different location for their ministry.

Along with the members of our Session, I invite you to continue to open your hearts and our doors to this mission. I picture a table that is set with all the blessings that we enjoy and how sharing those blessings with others pleases Christ, brings us together with other be-

lievers and strengthens our love of each other and our Lord, Jesus Christ. Rejoicing and celebrating in Christ together: our common purpose.


