DESCRIPTION: The Shakespeare Cascade was one of the most expensive short hunting bows ever made, and is one of the best shooting short hunting bows ever designed (puts the Kodiak Magnum to shame IMO). Solid black phenolic handle, 2" wide limbs. Comfortable grip. No delamination; no cracks; limbs are straight. Overlays and tips are in great condition. Decals are in good condition. No drilled holes. No chips, dings or cracks. No stress lines or crazing. Some minor scratches and nicks here and there. A few coats for Tru-Oil were used to recondition the bow. The Cascade cost \$105 back in the day which in 2020 adjusted dollars is equivalent to \$701.00
