FROM THE PASTOR

November 25, 2018

Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe
John 18:33-37

Dear St Pius X and St Anthony Church Family,

Happy Feast of Christ the King! Today is the last day of our church calendar year, so this feast closes out our liturgical year. This feast day fittingly crowns (or caps) the year by calling Jesus by the title of the 'King of all Time', and the 'Lord of History'. The Revelation 17:14 and 19:16 call Him, "King of Kings and Lord of Lords." Jesus is the One, beginning to end, also called the Alpha and Omega (Rev 1:8).

I asked a Vacation Bible School class of students, "Who is King?" I expected someone would say, 'Jesus'. But, a child raised his hand and said, "Elvis!" I guess if his favorite sport was Nascar, he would have said, "King Richard Petty", or if he followed boxing, 'Muhammad Ali'. But kingship for Jesus is so much more than anything this world has imagined for its leader. Jesus knows that a worldly title such as 'king' doesn't capture all that He is for us. Our limited, earthbound concepts short circuit when we try to apply them to God. Jesus says in John 18:36 "My kingdom does not belong to this world." And that was not the first time that Jesus cautiously avoided public acclaim or a 'princely' title, because back in John 6:15, we heard that "Since Jesus knew the crowd was going to come and *carry him off to make him king, he withdrew again* to the mountain alone." We should have expected all of this, though, because beginning back at Jesus' birth, God revealed what kind of king Jesus would become. At Jesus' birth, all different kinds of kings come crawling out of the woodwork to display themselves, King Caesar, King Herod and the Three Kings from the East. Of course, Caesar and Herod show themselves to be corrupt leaders only in it for their own glory, but the Three Wise Kings are on the right path. They leave behind their own power 'base' to seek the God everyone answers to, as a 'universal higher power'. The wise kings know that however powerful they may be, they are also subjects to a heavenly power above all, another Trinity (this One divine-Jesus, the Father and the Holy Spirit). **And how did King Jesus appear?** Unlike any other, Jesus enters our world acclaimed in the company of lowly shepherds in an out of the way place. This Jesus-King is named 'Emmanuel-God With Us' (Isaiah 7:14) and 'Prince of Peace' (Isaiah 9:5), in the family line of the Boy-Shepherd-King, David! This shepherd leader grew up knowing how to move among his people to keep them together, watching out for each one while also keeping an eye on the peripheries for any who might stray or catch approaching threats. Divine leadership for Jesus, means a king who identifies with and knows personally his own people because he lives and walks among his subjects (as Good Shepherd-John 10:11-16).

We have to ask, "What does it mean for us to call Christ our King?" Think of how many times in a day we pray the 'Lord's Prayer'. In His model of prayer for us, we ask God over and over that 'Your Kingdom come' (Luke 11:2 & Matt 6:10). We are constantly praying for God's rule over us and that we be part of His Kingdom. Yet, do we truly acknowledge God as the one in charge over us? As much as we pray, do we surrender our own wants to God? Do we let go our desire to independently rule ourselves? Do we relinquish our attempts to control others, and give up running everyone else's life for them? To have Christ as my King, means that He rules and guides me; that I serve Him and His will, not my own.

For Christ to be king it means that we do not live selfishly for ourselves, but for someone greater than us. St Paul says in Galatians 2:19 "that I might *live for God*." To me, it is a little funny that we call this last Sunday, "Christ the King", instead of the first Sunday of the year. It seems this feast recognizes our human weakness, in that we humans often try every other possible means of our own, before finally coming to God in the end. After frustrating every other means to get our way, in the end, we finally let go and trust, to accepting God's will. Finally, in the end! Yet what peace would be ours if we had started the year, or the day with such humble acceptance of God as the rule and guide for us! But, maybe this is why we have Advent and Christmas next (what seems like the end of the worldly calendar, but is in fact the beginning of our new church year). Our church is telling us 'Save yourself all the trouble and mess.' Put God first. Start out every effort by putting Christ first, at the head. Maybe this year will be different!
